## 1. Origins

Origins Mod

Minecraft, the sandbox that it is lets you play your fantasies. While RP is possible in the game's core but the Origins mod completely changes how every Minecraft playthrough works. Like other RPGs, Origins allows you to select one specific race to play as, which actively changes your gameplay experience in a profound way. With 11 options to choose from, you have plenty of options to make each new world feel fresh and exciting.

Here are some great examples:

The Arachnid allows you to climb over any surface. This makes traversing effortless. You can apply cobwebs to enemies as you fight them as an Arachnid. The downside is that you'll have 3 less hearts and can only eat meat products.

The Merling is a different alternative that completely changes the game. You can breathe underwater or swim, mine, and see crystal clear in liquid. But here's the catch. You can't breathe on the land. You will need to bring water if you want to travel underground or on

land.

## 2. Decorative Blocks

### Mod Menu for Decorative Blocks

This mod is smaller in scale however it can improve your building experience in a variety of ways. Once installed, Decorative Blocks will add a second page called Creative (or new items in Survival) which is focused on the blocks or entities that provide some decorative aesthetics. From chandeliers to seats and lattices to shelves, these items can help to make your home feel more like a home and adds an extra dimension of imagination.

### Modification of Dehydration

If you're looking to have a tougher survival experience in Minecraft the Dehydration mod adds a thirst meter to your HUD. You'll require a regular drink from water sources (besides the oceans) to stay in good condition. This mod boosts the immersion of your game and also adds more functions to niche items such as water bottles.
