

Difference Between Natural Human Hair & Synthetic Hair

Remy hair are all made up of hairs from the single donor and run the same direction which means all the hair tips are in one side and bottoms are in the other. There are five types of remy hair according to different place of production and remy hair from Brazil is of best qualities. They can match to your own hair color very well and are more smooth, sleek and free of tangle. Remy hair also includes a special type named virgin hair. Literally, people can tell that it's a kind of hair free from any chemical process like dyeing, so most of the virgin hairs are black.

What's more, there's another conception which is also misleading – yaki hair. Yaki hair is actually a hairstyle mainly for African-Americans. The texture is straight and loose with chemically straightened. There are four types of yaki: silky, kinky, coarse and straight. Considering the material it can also be remy, non-remy and synthetic. Most yaki hair is braided or sewn in the hair by a professional or knowledgeable hair stylist.

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
