

- This year 2nd grade will be implementing AVID strategies into our daily curriculum.
- Organizational Tool—students will be bringing home their organizational tool (binder) nightly. Math homework will be found in the front pocket. Students will be placing all content related materials, reading log, organizational tool.
- Agenda- All students will have a monthly calendar and a weekly calendar. They will be writing down their homework daily as well as working towards writing their daily learning targets. Encourage students to write down their weekly extra curricular activities as well in the community/family section.
- Note-taking- In all journals we will be encouraging students to practice good note-taking strategies throughout the year.

Advancement Via Individual Determination

Within the binder there will be 7 tabs.

- 1. News (anything related to Christie or 2nd grade) 2nd grade news will be copied in Purple
- 2. Agenda
- 3. Reading log
- 4. Science (green copies)
- 5. Reading (pink copies)
- 6. IE
- 7. Math (yellow)

Any finished work in the back pocket of the binder can be removed. Unfinished work and classroom activities must remain behind the dividers. Homework will be placed in the front pocket and returned to school each day.

Homework Schedule



- Math homework will be sent home daily. This will be a review of what is taught in class.
- Students will be asked to read 20 minutes nightly and complete the reading log and comprehension question. (This will begin the 2nd week of school)

Reading Goals

- Ask questions, clarify, and locate facts and details in stories.
- · Use context to determine the relevant meaning of unfamiliar or multiple meaning words.
- · Re-tell the stories with beginning, middle, and end.
- · Describe the main idea.
- Describe characters in works of fiction, including their actions, traits, motivations and feelings.
- Distinguish between fiction and nonfiction.

Writing Goals

- Write a complete sentence.
- Speak in complete sentences with correct subject verb agreement.
- Write a story with a self selected topic. Include a beginning, middle, and end to the story.
- Revise drafts by adding or deleting a word, phrase, or sentence. Must re-read story!
- Edit drafts for grammar and punctuation. Capitalize the beginning of sentence, proper nouns, and the salutations/closing of a letter. Use correct end marks-(.!?)

Math Goals

- Know your numbers to 1,200.
- Select addition or subtraction to solve problems using two digit numbers.
- Know how much each coin is worth and how much a collection of coins is worth all together.
- Use fact family strategy to help learn addition and subtraction facts (8+9=17, 9+8=17, 17-8=9, 17-9=8)
- Describe 2-D and 3-D shapes. (Number of vertices, faces, edges, and sides)
- · Measure with standard and nonstandard units.
- Read and write time on an analog and digital clock in minute increments.
- Be able to read and interpret bar graphs and picture graphs.

Science and Social Studies Goals

<u>Science</u>

- Classify objects by shape,
 weight, temperature, texture,
 flexibility, solid, or liquid.
- Investigate how temperature changes objects. (Example: Pancakes and Butter)
- Observe and describe rocks by size, texture, and color.
- Record and graph temperature and amount of rain.
- Identify the basic needs of plants and animals.

Social Studies & LA

- · Learn about holidays.
- Timelines
- Community heroes
- Describe how people depend on natural resources.
- Identify characteristics of urban, suburban, and rural communities.
- Identify the functions and services of the government.

P.A.W.S & Student Success initiative

School Wide Management

Level 2: Handled by the teacher (Classroom referral will be documented and sent home. Parent signature required)

Level 3: Handled by Counselors or Administrators (Office referral and parent contact will be required)

Level 4: ZERO Tolerance. Handled by the administrators (Parent contact required)

PACE is similar to Special Education in that it is an enrichment service designed to meet the needs of a different kind of learner.

PACE is not an Honors program.

Students requiring gifted services may...

perform two grade levels above current grade learn exceptionally fast

need only one to two repetitions for mastery thrive on complexity

arrive at solutions in an unusual manner

- Complete a referral packet (deadline is December
 7th)
