



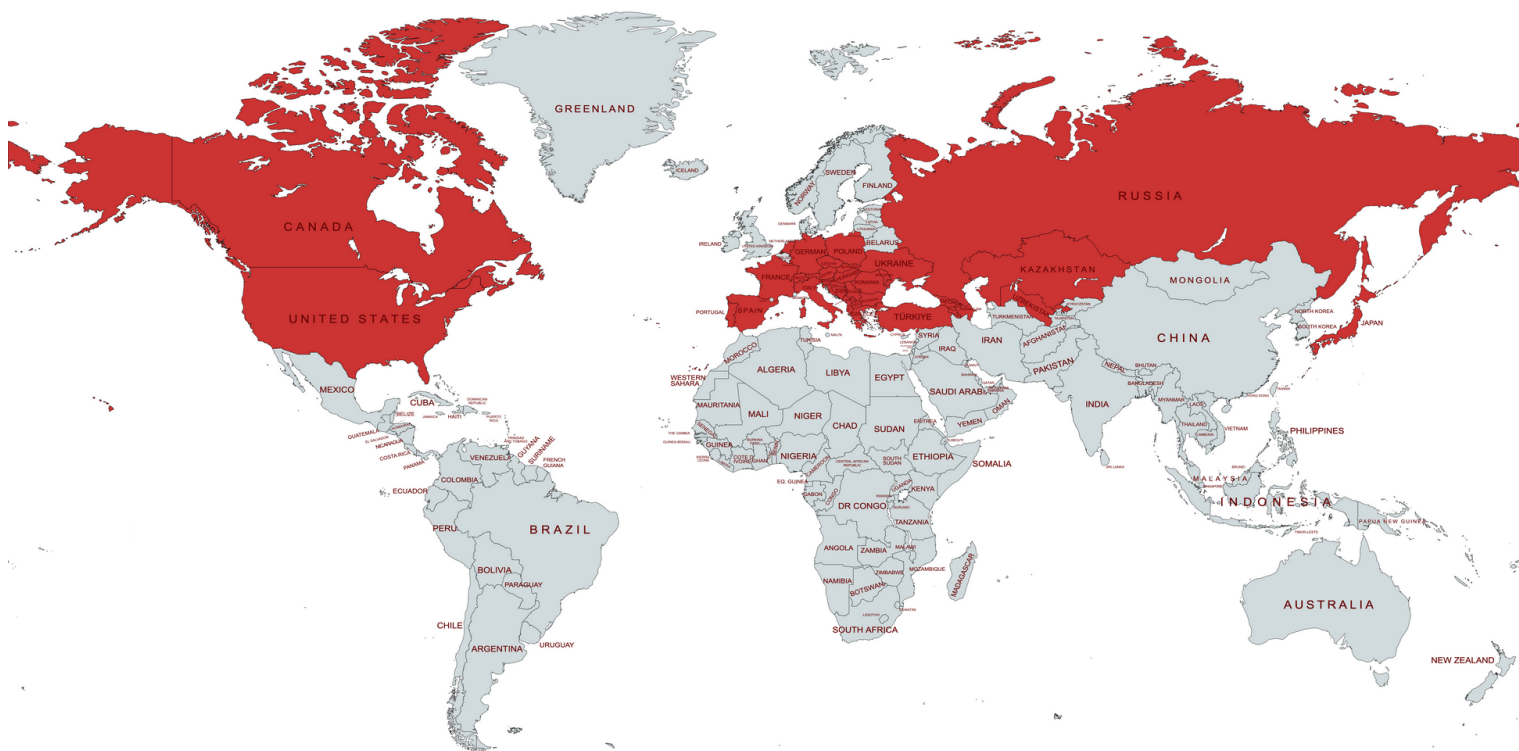
BMSB Brown Marmorated Stink Bug

FUMIGATION REQUIREMENTS

BMSB (Brown Marmorated Stink Bug) is an invasive pest that can cause significant damage to local ecosystems and agricultural industries. To prevent the spread of this pest, containers carrying goods that are shipped from target risk countries between specific dates need to undergo fumigation as a crucial biosecurity measure. This helps ensure that any potential BMSB-infested goods are not introduced into the regions, protecting the local environment and economies.

The Australian Department of Agriculture and the New Zealand Ministry for Primary Industries have implemented these seasonal measures to mitigate the risk of BMSB infestations. These measures are particularly stringent during the period between September 1, 2023, and April 30, 2024, when BMSB activity is higher due to its behaviour of seeking refuge in warmer areas as winter approaches.

Fumigation is an effective method to eliminate pests like the BMSB from shipping containers and their contents, reducing the chances of their establishment and spread in new regions. This biosecurity procedure involves using chemicals or gases that are lethal to the pests while ensuring that the goods inside the containers remain unharmed and safe for distribution.

AT RISK ITEMS

The following list of goods that are categorized as 'target high risk' goods and their appropriate tariff chapter – these goods will require mandatory treatment.

COMPLETE THE FUMIGATION DECLARATION

Make sure that the fumigation declaration has been completed, clearly outlining all the HS codes listed on the commercial invoice.

WRAP & PACKAGE

Properly wrap and pack the goods to facilitate effective fumigation, ensuring they are easily accessible for treatment.





Fumigation Declaration

Brown Marmorated Stink Bug – Season 2023/24 (USA to Australia)

The Australian Department of Agriculture, Water and the Environment (DAWE) has introduced seasonal import measures to manage the risk of Brown Marmorated Stink Bug (BMSB) during the high-risk season from September 1,2023 until ATA Australia May 31,2024.

All target high risk goods manufactured in or shipped from the target risk countries as sea cargo during the risk season must be treated (fumigated) by an approved treatment provider.

This template relates to applicable vehicles, machinery, and parts (VMP) that are exported from a country listed under Schedule 3 and meet the exclusion criteria of the Import Health Standard for Vehicles, Machinery and Parts. The BMSB season applies when vehicles, machinery or parts are exported after 1 September and arrive in New Zealand on or before 30 April of any year.

Notes:

- 1) An agent, distributor, supplier, or representative company may complete this form if the criteria have been confirmed with the manufacturer as being correct at all times.
- 2) This template can be modified, providing the relevant exclusion criteria for the applicable type of vehicle, machinery or part is declared and the documentation requirements of section 2.1 (2) b) of the Standard are met.
- 3) A photocopied version of this declaration is acceptable, providing the required criteria remain accurate for each consignment.
- 4) Please see the Standard for clarifications to the content or definitions used on this form.
