TERMS OF REFERENCE

CONSULTANT

To formulate and develop the layout and design of two documents provided by CPDC.

BACKGROUND

The Caribbean Policy Development Centre (CPDC) is a legally registered non-profit headquartered in Barbados and established in 1991. CPDC serves as a regional umbrella NGO for organisations comprising of small farmers, women, youth, Indigenous People, rural populations and faith-based organisations located across CARICOM. CPDC also has strong networking partnerships with organisations of persons with disabilities, artisans, micro-entrepreneurs, human rights, and workers. Altogether it serves some twenty-nine (29) regional, sub-regional and national (local) NGOs working at the grassroots level in economic, social, and cultural areas in the Caribbean.

The organisation was mandated to work with NGOs and civil society to ensure that Caribbean people understand the policy-making process; to share information about policies and decision-making processes; to work to influence and bring change to the developmental process, and to support and to lobby for policies which improve the lives of Caribbean people. In fulfilling its mandate, the CPDC seeks to build the confidence and the ability of Caribbean peoples to influence public policy.

The CPDC in partnership with USAID is implementing a three-year project titled Local Capacity for Local Solutions (LCLS). The USAID/ESC Local Capacity for Local Solutions project is focused on building the managerial, organisational, and administrative capacity of selected NGOs, including lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, or intersex (LGBTI) organisations; utilizing innovative methods and approaches to support them in expanding services and improving sustainability in the ESC (Eastern and Southern Caribbean) region. As part of this, CPDC will be developing various capacity building materials to support the improved managerial, organisational and administrative capacity of NGOs.



I. PURPOSE AND OBJECTIVE

CPDC is desirous of undertaking a consultancy to formulate and design two interactive documents on 1) A Financial Management Tool Kit and 2) A Case Study Report. These documents will be used to increase the capacity of NGOs in the Eastern Caribbean

General Objective

To conceptualize, develop, lay out, format, and design (2) documents provided by CPDC

Specific Objectives

- To undertake the design and layout of one full colour 60-page financial management toolkit including graphs and templates.
- To undertake the design and layout of one full-colour 25-page case study report including charts and diagrams
