

The prestigious international ranking has been published since 2019 and aims to measure the contribution of higher education institutions to the 2030 Agenda in each of the 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). In this edition, a total of 20 Chilean universities participated, measuring their progress in meeting the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) for universities.
