OLD TESTAMENT READING: Isaiah 52:13 - 53:12

See, my servant shall prosper;

he shall be exalted and lifted up, and shall be very high.

¹⁴Just as there were many who were astonished at him so marred was his appearance, beyond human semblance, and his form beyond that of mortals

¹⁵so he shall startle many nations; kings shall shut their mouths because of him; for that which had not been told them they shall see, and that which they had not heard they shall contemplate. ^{53:1}Who has believed what we have heard? And to whom has the arm of the LORD been revealed? ²For he grew up before him like a young plant and like a root out of dry ground; he had no form or majesty that we should look at him,

nothing in his appearance that we should desire him.

³He was despised and rejected by others;

a man of suffering and acquainted with infirmity;

and as one from whom others hide their faces

he was despised, and we held him of no account.

⁴Surely he has borne our infirmities and carried our diseases; vet we accounted him stricken, struck down by God, and afflicted.

⁵But he was wounded for our transgressions, crushed for our iniquities;

upon him was the punishment that made us whole, and by his bruises we are healed.

⁶All we like sheep have gone astray; we have all turned to our own way,

and the LORD has laid on him the iniquity of us all.

⁷He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he did not open his mouth;

like a lamb that is led to the slaughter,

and like a sheep that before its shearers is silent, so he did not open his mouth.

⁸By a perversion of justice he was taken away.

Who could have imagined his future?

For he was cut off from the land of the living. stricken for the transgression of my people.

⁹They made his grave with the wicked and his tomb with the rich, although he had done no violence,

and there was no deceit in his mouth.

¹⁰Yet it was the will of the LORD to crush him with pain.

When you make his life an offering for sin,

he shall see his offspring, and shall prolong his days; through him the will of the LORD shall prosper.

¹¹Out of his anguish he shall see light;

he shall find satisfaction through his knowledge.

The righteous one, my servant, shall make many righteous, and he shall bear their iniquities.

¹²Therefore I will allot him a portion with the great, and he shall divide the spoil with the strong;

because he poured out himself to death,

and was numbered with the transgressors;

yet he bore the sin of many,

and made intercession for the transgressors.

PSALM: Psalm 22

My God, my God, why have you forsaken me

and are so far from my cry, and from the words of my distress?

²O my God, I cry in the daytime, but you do not answer;

by night as well, but I find no rest.

³Yet you are the Holy One, enthroned upon the praises of Israel.

⁴Our forefathers put their trust in you;

they trusted, and you delivered them.

⁵They cried out to you and were delivered;

they trusted in you and were not put to shame.

⁶But as for me, I am a worm and no man,

scorned by all and despised by the people.

⁷All who see me laugh me to scorn;

they curl their lips and wag their heads, saying,

let him rescue him, if he delights in him."

⁹Yet you are he who took me out of the womb,

and kept me safe upon my mother's breast.

¹⁰I have been entrusted to you ever since I was born;

you were my God when I was still in my mother's womb.

¹¹Be not far from me, for trouble is near, and there is none to help.

¹²Many young bulls encircle me;

strong bulls of Bashan surround me.

¹³They open wide their jaws at me, like a ravening and a roaring lion.

¹⁴I am poured out like water; all my bones are out of joint; my heart within my breast is melting wax.

¹⁵My mouth is dried out like a potsherd;

my tongue sticks to the roof of my mouth;

and you have laid me in the dust of the grave.

¹⁶Packs of dogs close me in, and gangs of evildoers circle around me;

they pierce my hands and my feet, I can count all my bones.

¹⁷They stare and gloat over me;

they divide my garments among them; they cast lots for my clothing.

¹⁸Be not far away, O LORD;

you are my strength; hasten to help me.

¹⁹Save me from the sword, my life from the power of the dog.

²⁰Save me from the lion's mouth,

my wretched body from the horns of wild bulls.

²¹I will declare your name to my brethren;

in the midst of the congregation I will praise you.

²²Praise the LORD, you that fear him;

stand in awe of him, O offspring of Israel; all you of Jacob's line, give glory.

²³For he does not despise nor abhor the poor in their poverty; neither does he hide his face from them;

but when they cry to him he hears them.

²⁴My praise is of him in the great assembly;

I will perform my vows in the presence of those who worship him.

²⁵The poor shall eat and be satisfied, and those who seek the LORD shall praise him: "May your heart live forever!"

²⁶All the ends of the earth shall remember and turn to the LORD, and all the families of the nations shall bow before him.

²⁷For kingship belongs to the LORD;

he rules over the nations.

²⁸To him alone all who sleep in the earth bow down in worship;

all who go down to the dust fall before him.

²⁹My soul shall live for him; my descendants shall serve him;

they shall be known as the LORD's forever.

³⁰They shall come and make known to a people yet unborn **the saving deeds that he has done.**

NEW TESTAMENT READING: Hebrews 10:16-25

"This is the covenant that I will make with them after those days, says the Lord: I will put my laws in their hearts,

and I will write them on their minds,"

he also adds, "I will remember their sins and their lawless deeds no more." Where there is forgiveness of these, there is no longer any offering for sin. Therefore, my friends, since we have confidence to enter the sanctuary by the blood of Jesus, by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain (that is, through his flesh), and since we have a great priest over the house of God, let us approach with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. Let us hold fast to the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who has promised is faithful. And let us consider how to provoke

one another to love and good deeds, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching.

GOSPEL READING: John 18:28 - 19:22

Then they took Jesus from Caiaphas to Pilate's headquarters. It was early in the morning.

They themselves did not enter the headquarters, so as to avoid ritual defilement and to be able to eat the Passover. So Pilate went out to them and said, "What accusation do you bring against this man?" They answered, "If this man were not a criminal, we would not have handed him over to you." Pilate said to them, "Take him yourselves and judge him according to your law." The Jews replied, "We are not permitted to put anyone to death." (This was to fulfill what Jesus had said when he indicate d the kind of death he was to die.)

Then Pilate entered the headquarters again, summoned Jesus, and asked him, "Are you the King of the Jews?" Jesus answered, "Do you ask this on your own, or did others tell you about me?" Pilate replied, "I am not a Jew, am I? Your own nation and the chief priests have handed you over to me. What have you done?" Jesus answered, "My kingdom is not from this world. If my kingdom were from this world, my followers would be fighting to keep me from being handed over to the Jews. But as it is, my kingdom is not from here." Pilate asked him, "So you are a king?" Jesus answered, "You say that I am a king. For this I was born, and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice." Pilate asked him, "What is truth?"

After he had said this, he went out to the Jews again and told them, "I find no case against him. But you have a custom that I release someone for you at the Passover. Do you want me to release for you the King of the Jews?" They shouted in reply, "Not this man, but Barabbas!" Now Barabbas was a bandit. Then Pilate took Jesus and had him flogged. And the soldiers wove a crown of thorns and put it on his head, and they dressed him in a purple robe. They kept coming up to him, saying, "Hail, King of the Jews!" and striking him on the face.

Pilate went out again and said to them, "Look, I am bringing him out to you to let you know that I

find no case against him." So Jesus came out, wearing the crown of thorns and the purple robe. Pilate said to them, "Here is the man!" When the chief priests and the police saw him, they shouted, "Crucify him! Crucify him!" Pilate said to them, "Take him yourselves and crucify him; I find no case against him."

The Jews answered him, "We have a law, and according to that law he ought to die because he has claimed to be the Son of God." Now when Pilate heard this, he was more afraid than ever. He entered his headquarters again and asked Jesus, "Where are you from?" But Jesus gave him no answer. Pilate therefore said to him, "Do you refuse to speak to me? Do you not know that I have power to release you, and power to crucify you?" Jesus answered him, "You would have no power over me unless it had been given you from above; therefore the one who handed me over to you is guilty of a greater sin."

From then on Pilate tried to release him, but the Jews cried out, "If you release this man, you are no friend of the emperor. Everyone who claims to be a king sets himself against the emperor." When Pilate heard these words, he brought Jesus outside and sat on the judge's bench at a place called The Stone Pavement, or in Hebrew Gabbatha. Now it was the day of Preparation for the Passover; and it was about noon. He said to the Jews, "Here is your King!" They cried out, "Away with him! Away with him! Crucify him!" Pilate asked them, "Shall I crucify your King?" The chief priests answered, "We have no king but the emperor." Then he handed him over to them to be crucified. So they took Jesus; and carrying the cross by himself, he went out to what is called The Place of the Skull, which in Hebrew is called Golgotha. There they crucified him, and with him two others, one on either side, with Jesus between them. Pilate also had an inscription written and put on the cross. It read, "Jesus of Nazareth, the King of the Jews." Many of the Jews read this inscription, because the place where Jesus was crucified was near the city; and it was written in Hebrew, in Latin, and in Greek. Then the chief priests of the Jews said to Pilate, "Do not write, 'The King of the Jews,' but, 'This man said, I am King of the Jews." Pilate answered, "What I have written I have written."

SERVICE OF TENEBRAE

THE FIRST WORD Luke 23:33, 34

When they came to the place called "The Skull", they nailed Jesus to the cross there, and the two criminals, one on his right and one on his left. Jesus said "Forgive them, Father! They do not know what they are doing."

Jesus, in thy dying woes, even while thy life-blood flows, craving pardon for thy foes: Hear us, holy Jesus

THE SECOND WORD Luke 23:39 43

One of the criminals hanging there threw insults at him: "Aren't you the Messiah? Save yourself and us!" The other one, however, rebuked him, saying: "Don't you fear God? Here we are all under the same sentence. Ours, however, is only right, for we are getting what we deserve for what we did; but he has done no wrong." And he said to Jesus, "Remember me, Jesus, when you come as King!" Jesus said to him, "I tell you this: Today you will be in Paradise with me."

Jesus, pitying the sighs of the thief, who near thee dies, promising him paradise: hear us, holy Jesus.

THE THIRD WORD John 19:25 27

Standing close to Jesus' cross were his mother, his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene. Jesus saw his mother and the disciple he loved standing there; so he said to his mother, "Woman, here is your son." Then he said to the disciple, "Here is your mother." And from that time the disciple took her to live in his home.

Jesus, loving to the end her whose heart thy sorrows rend, and thy dearest human friend: hear us, holy Jesus. loving for the love of thee: hear us, holy Jesus.

THE FOURTH WORD Mark 15:33 34

And when the sixth hour had come, there was darkness over the whole land until the ninth hour. And at the ninth hour Jesus cried with a loud voice, "Eloi, eloi, lama sabachthani?" which means, "My God, my God, why hast thou forsaken me?"

Jesus, whelmed in fears unknown, with our evil left alone, while no light from heav'n is shown: hear us, holy Jesus.

THE FIFTH WORD John 19:28

After this Jesus, knowing that all was now finished, said (to fulfill the scripture), "I thirst."

Jesus, in thy thirst and pain, while thy wounds thy lifeblood drain, thirsting more our love to gain: hear us, holy Jesus.

THE SIXTH WORD John 19:29 30

A bowl was there, full of cheap wine mixed with vinegar, so a sponge was soaked in it, put on stalk of hyssop and lifted up to his lips. When Jesus had received the wine, he said, "It is finished." ³¹ Now it was the day of Preparation, and the next day was to be a special Sabbath. Because the Jewish leaders did not want the bodies left on the crosses during the Sabbath, they asked Pilate to have the legs broken and the bodies taken down. ³² The soldiers therefore came and broke the legs of the first man who had been crucified with Jesus, and then those of the other. ³³ But when they came to Jesus and found that he was already dead, they did not break his legs. ³⁴ Instead, one of the soldiers pierced Jesus' side with a spear, bringing a sudden flow of blood and water.

Jesus, all our ransom paid, all thy Father's will obeyed; by thy suff'rings perfect made: hear us, holy Jesus.

THE SEVENTH WORD Luke 23:46

Then Jesus, crying with a loud voice, said, "Father, into thy hands I commit my spirit!" And having said this he breathed his last.

19 Jesus, all thy labor vast, all thy woe and conflict past; yielding up thy soul at last: hear us, holy Jesus.
