Born in October 1903 in Linares, Mole district, she was the eldest of seven sisters and two brothers. She trained as a teacher and obtained her master's degree at the Normal School of Talca. In her hometown, she worked as a teacher at Escuela Superior nº2 and founded an adult education institution. Thanks to the scholarship granted to her by the then Minister of Education, Dario Salas, she studied at the Teachers College, Columbia University, United States, where she obtained a Bachelor of Arts and a Master of Arts with Mention in Supervision. **Visit Here**: The Vogue News

In 1930 she participated in the first CIM meeting in Cuba. Five years later, she co-founded the Chilean Women's Liberation Movement (MEMCH) and served on its first board. The feminist organization fought for legal and political equality and equal access to the labor market for men and women, and also demanded universal women's suffrage, sought protection for working motherhood, and supported the first generations of women with higher education.
