## The Health Department Provides COVID-19 Updates for Sarpy and Cass County

**PAPILLION:** The Sarpy/Cass Health Department has been monitoring the COVID-19 pandemic in our communities since January 2020. Key activities include conducting contact investigations, monitoring outbreaks, offering community education, and providing elected officials with public health recommendations. To date, there has been a total of 4,402 Sarpy and Cass County residents test positive for COVID-19 out of the 54,559 tested. There have been 34 COVID-19 related deaths, including two the Department was notified of this week.

The Sarpy/Cass COVID-19 Risk Dial is at "yellow," indicating a moderate risk of the virus spreading. Residents are advised to follow these recommendations to slow the transmission of COVID-19:

- Shop alone and only shop one time per week.
- Stay away from others who are sick.
- Wash your hands often.
