

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

Fourth, and second pirated, edition of an early biography of the famous leader of the Haitian revolution, François-Dominique Toussaint Louverture (1743-1803). The text is partially based on Dubroca's *La Vie de Toussaint Louverture* (Paris, Dubroca, 1802). Toussaint Louverture proved a popular topic, resulting in many editions to

appear in the same period. As far as we could determine there exist four editions of this book, of which the copy presented here is the fourth. The third edition is the first pirated, published in *an XI* with a larger portrait, now facing left. Our fourth edition is set in a smaller type than the third.

Condition: front hinge partially split. Minor spotting throughout. Marginal stain in the bottom corner of the last few pages. Otherwise in good condition.

Literature: this edition not in M. Bissainthe, *Dictionnaire de bibliographie hatienne* (Washington, 1951), which does list the other two editions from An X: 5266 and 5267.

Sabin seems to have listed the first edition twice, under Louverture (42351) and Cousin (17189), both 211 pp.





First edition of arguably the most important colonial architecture book. This luxurious collection of sprawling monumental plantation villa designs, of which very few copies were made, is considered the "missing link in the transmission of Palladian architecture between Britain and North America" (Nelson).


The commissioner of this book was the very wealthy British planter John Blagrove, who held a vast Jamaican sugar fortune, including five enormous plantations and 1500 enslaved workers. Whilst on Grand Tour in the early 1770's he was inspired to implement the Palladian principles of architecture on his Jamaican plantations. Planters generally used to live in fairly simple makeshift houses because most funds went into the plantation itself. In the 1770's this changed when they started investing in the construction of great houses in the European tradition. However, those proved unsuited for the Caribbean climate, resulting in a number of inconveniences caused by earthquakes, hurricanes, heavy rains and great heat. This urged Blagrove to seek an architect who could design models for villas suited for hot climates, in particular the West Indies. While in Paris he commissioned architect M. d'Albaret to design architectural patterns for Palladian style villas suitable for hot climates, which resulted in the book that is offered here.


Planche VI

The designs also note the threat of slave riots, proposing a defensive stronghold at the base level of the buildings. The significance Blagrove's commission cannot be underestimated, for it is the clearest representation of a revolution in plantation architecture and one of the first architectural books concerning the Americas.

First edition of the main legal work of Sicilian jurist Giuseppe Cumia, printed by himself at home at his legendary press in Catania. This is one of the few copies of the four books that were printed by him.

There was no printing press in Catania, there never had been until Cumia set one up in his house. In August 1562 he proceeded to print his his first book, a short collection of poetry titled *Rime*, with help of Petro Spira from Messina. But Spira almost immediately abandoned the job, forcing Cumia to continue the work himself. With

support of his son Alessandro, an Ethiopian and Moor servant and a maid they managed to print books. In the final words of the Rime Cumia vividly narrates their method: "[Cumia] set the type, Allessandro sets the page, the maid inks and the Moor and Ethiopian pull!". When he mastered the technique of printing he proceeded to make De successione feudalium, the book we offer here. It was published in 1563 and in the preface of this legal work Cumia claims to have printed 1000 copies, though only 10 are recorded by Francesca Aiello in her 2020 bibliography of the Cumia press. The work ambitious work covers inheritance and succession under feudal law. The 452-page folio is regarded as Cumia's most important legal work (see Di Grazia) and after publication his career as a judicial scholar took off. He taught law continuously from 1565 to 1587 and was appointed judge of the Grand Court of the Kingdom of Sicily in 1577, in 1583 and once again in 1589.

The final book to be printed at his press was *Practicasindicatus cum theorica* in 1568, of which only a single copy is known to survive. Cumia abandoned the printing business by the 1570's because by then he was a well-known author and in demand by publishers, making his press obsolete.

Condition: binding recently functionally repaired by Redbone Bindery. Original vellum of mediocre quality, soiled and slightly worn, pencil inscriptions on front cover, label on spine. 



Finely illustrated manuscript notebook of a trip to Bengal (India), with a particular interest in the boats encountered while sailing the rivers of Bengal: the notebook counts 14 large and 4 smaller drawings of various types of indigenous boats. One drawing is signed "Cornelius Sanjev"(?). We could not identify this person. The manuscript starts off as a ship's log of a journey from Portsmouth, England on Tuesday, March 11, 1834 and ends abruptly without note of arrival on Thursday, June 26

1834. Then follow 2 pages of notes on Russia, which in turn is followed by 14 brown ink drawings of Indian boats, some with denominations: a kutwa panswai; a Calcutta panswai; a budgerow; a jumlook salt boat; a Deccan pulwa; a small meeg boat of the Sanderbands; a nudder panswai for grain. Then pencil drawings: a mix of boats and views from the water drawn in pencil: a western sail ship; view of Sultangunge (Sultanganj on the Ganges); a view not far from Mongfui[?] Sunday August 24, 1834; two boats; bridge over Kelamman[?]. This is followed by various seemingly unrated sketches and doodles including the castle of Heidelberg (from memory?), one signed drawn by Cornelius Sanjev. Lastly follow Smaller and more rudimental sketches of various Indian boats with denominations and studies in pencil of antelope horns.

Rare complete second edition of Herrera's monumental chronicle of world history during the reign of King Philip II of Spain (1554-1598). Compared to the first edition (Madrid, 1601) the contents of this second edition differ greatly, so much so that they might be viewed as different books

altogether. The text is completely reworked and enlarged. The third volume was published later (1612) and is a first and only edition.

Besides being renowned as one of the most important sources on early American history, this important work also provides a wealth of information about Arabia, Turkey, India, China, Japan, the Philippines, The Netherlands, Great-Britain, Scandinavia, Malta and more. Herrera was Historian of the Indies to the King and had access to now lost manuscript primary sources, including those by De las Casas and Palacio. On the subject of the New World this work eclipsed all that was published before it in scope, accuracy, style and truth. No book received more compliment in Sabin's Americana bibliography. The very long entry, in which Sabin calls Herrera the "Prince of Historians" is mainly an impressive compilation of praise by other bibliographers.

Rare (not in STCN) first and only Dutch edition of a plea to Catholics to convert as Protestants. First published in French in La Rochelle, 1617 as Résolution des doutes, ou Sommaire décision des controverses entre l'Église réformée et l'Église romaine, in which author Monginot explains why he converted from the Catholic to the Protestant faith.

This Dutch translation was dedicated to the

magistrates of Utrecht and approved by the Dutch Synod. Translator Daniël Costerus, a preacher in Houten near Utrecht, added a 14-page preface and a 3-page prayer at the end. The only STCN record of him as author is a similar translation of a French protestant conversion plea: Schilt des geloofs, ofte Verdedinge vande geloofsbelydenisse der gereformeerde kercken in Vranckrijck, tegens de tegenvverpingen vanden heer Aernout (Utrecht, 1645). CERL records Costerus as born in 1620 but that seems unlikely due to the date of the present publication (1631). The present copy was inscribed by "Susanna vander Muelen" (1629-1648), she was a member of the Utrecht patrician Vander Meulen family and was married to nobleman Albert Schach von Wittenau (1619-1692).

Condition: binding slightly stained. Front endpapers partially detached. Contents stained, slight worming in foot margin not affecting text. Otherwise in good condition.



Long, detailed and illustrated handwritten diary of a French soldier in Algeria, kept from March 22, 1841 until August 15, 1844. The author states on the first page that he was born on July 24, 1820 in the small French village of Gène and his name is Ménon. He does not mention his first names. "Ménon" does not seem to be a pseudonym because it also appears on his certificate of good health that is attached to the front pastedown. He was part of the 58th Line Regiment, 2nd Battalion, 5th Company, hence the number 58 on the front cover. He joined this regiment on March 22, 1841, which is also the day his diary begins. What follows is a lengthy account of his activities as a soldier in Algeria, providing generous descriptions of the places he visited, such as Koléa, Milliana, Blida and much more. The diary ends on August 15, 1844, in "Ben Siam" (Birkadem). On the last 21 pages the author has included a French-Arab dictionary, an Arab name glossary, a table of places and distances and the lyrics to "chansons gurrière" (battle songs).

Handwritten chart of the current state of affairs at the Robineau sugar plantation and factory in the French colony Saint-Domingue (current Haiti). Established in the 17th century by Antoine Robineau, (Attorney-General of the Colony), this plantation was one of the oldest and most prominent of Saint-Domingue.

The chart provides a wealth of information, set up in a several categories. The main column on the left titled *Travaux journaliers* provides information about the work done at the planation on each day of the month, followed by production numbers of the factory, a.o. distilling. On the right another large column titled *Observations générales* gives detailed information about

major events, such as a major smallpox outbreak that killed several enslaved children. The columns at the bottom show mutations in livestock and enslaved people and the total number of stored goods in the buildings. Here, too, the effect of smallpox on the plantation is evident: "Fanchette and Babotte negrites, died on the 8th, of smallpox confluent with a strong whooping cough. Jean François negrillon, died on the 10th from the same causes".

A masterpiece of Dutch Golden Age printmaking

Complete copy of De Gheyn's beautiful folio pictorial arms manual, with the 117 plates in remarkably good impressions with deep contrast and deliberate even plate tone, giving them a drawing-like appearance. This copy is the rare first issue of the first edition in French, which can be discerned by the name of the seller Henrij Laurens at the foot of the title and the signature of De Gheyn in the first plate of all three parts.

This issue was to be sold in Amsterdam while two later issues were sold elsewhere and thus lack the seller's name. The manual was first published in Dutch, with the same number of plates, as Wapenhandelinghe van roers, musqvetten ende spiessen (Amsterdam, 1607).


De Gheyn's three series of plates on the use of the blunderbuss (42), the musket (43) and the picket (32), is justly regarded as the greatest arms book of the 17th century and one of the masterpieces of Dutch Golden Age printmaking. A priceless resource for the organization and training of troops, De Gheyn's book created an overnight sensation throughout Europe and was quickly translated into several languages. An incredible number of imitations editions have since appeared.

Complete copies of this first edition are very scarce.



Condition: Paper in general slightly browned (more evident on some leaves). Multiple mainly marginal repairs throughout, mostly at the text leaves, rarely affecting the plates. Otherwise in good condition, the plates especially very good.

Complete 8-volume set of the definitive handbook for the judicial make-up of the Spanish Imperial Empire, including all overseas possessions such as Mexico, the Philippines etc. This classic of Spanish legal studies was widely used in the overseas colonies until the independences. The present set comprises of 5 volumes from the Pedro Marin edition dated 1788-1791, one from Benito Cano 1787 and another from Ibarra 1786. Author Elizondo served for many years as a prosecutor in Spain's

Real Chancilleria de Granada in the late eighteenth century.



First and only edition of a collection of reports to the British government by the anti-slavery commissioners in Sierra Leone, Cuba, Brazil and Surinam on the state of the slave trade there, followed by reports of the correspondence between anti-slavery commissioners and representatives of Spain, Brazil, Portugal, The Netherlands, France, Denmark and Sweden about the

state of slavery in their countries.

The present reports are a clear example of how the British government took the lead against slavery. They demanded from their neighbouring countries a Report on treatment of Free Blacks, which are presented here, describing the role of British anti-slavery enforcement with several specific cases of illicit slave trafficking and British intervention. The answers of the representatives of the countries often include additional reports, figures and statistics, such as a "List of French slave vessels, boarded by the British squadron". Parliamentary papers prior to 1835, when they were made more generally available, are very scarce. This report was "to be preserved in office of His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State; Home Department".



stopover in South Africa. This is the "second" (= third) edition, enlarged and completely reworked by publisher J.C. Erhard. In this travelogue Schwarz describes his sea voyage, its dangers and the natural history (incl. a rhinoceros) he encountered. In Batavia (Jakarta) he acquired an inn that he ran some years with the help of enslaved people. There he witnessed the Chinese uprising and massacre in 1740, about which he importantly reports. Faced with a spontaneous Chinese popular uprising, vengeful residents of Batavia (incl. Schwarz) unleashed a bloody massacre among their Chinese fellow citizens. This volume also includes the third edition of a practical handbook for use by seafarers, based on the most important contemporary maritime law editions, such as the Hanseatic, Hamburgian, Prussian, Swedish, Danish and Wisbysche maritime law. Added is a valuable resource for shippers: folding tables with the most recent customs information for the transportation of goods.



Second edition of a treatise against slavery and in favor of free labor. This second edition was published in the same year as the first (and third), all by J.-J. Paschoud in Paris & Geneva in 1814, the third also in London. A fourth edition was also published in London by Schulze & Dean in 1815.

The Swiss economist Sismondi became an increasingly important figure in slave-trade debates, particularly after the publication of the present work, a painstaking analysis that set out to prove that the revival of the French slave trade (which he adamantly opposed) would cost

the nation too much. He predicted that it would be two years at least before any returns could be expected. Put simply, the whole enterprise was too risky, particularly at a time when money was tight for France. He was equally sceptical about the merits of retaking Saint-Domingue. To his mind, France could not re-enter colonial production without setting up restrictive monopolies that would prove ruinous to its trade with the world. These were the same arguments put forward by Wilberforce in his letter to Talleyrand.





Complete first edition of the first book on East Africa and its (Muslim) communities, followed by a vast collection of Dominican missionaries' travel accounts in Eastern Europe and the East Indies. This remarkable book was already called "extremely rare" in a 1783 London auction catalogue and in the 1923 Gilhofer & Ranschburg catalogue. Today very few libraries own a copy.

first The volume is autobiographical narrative of an 11-year missionary journey from Portugal to East Africa and back by João Dos Santos. The work provides a description of the nature, customs, and history of what is now mainly Mozambique, the Comores and Madagascar. It is regarded as "the best description of the Portuguese occupation of Africa at the end of the sixteenth century, when Portugal was at the zenith of her power there. His account of the manners and customs of the Bantu tribes at that date is most valuable (...) This work is now a Portuguese classic." (see Theal).



Furthermore, it is "The first European description of the customs of various African ethnic groups, including Swahili communities and other Muslim groups" (see Lobato). The entire first part of this volume deals with the Muslim communities in East Africa. He also makes valuable observations about the natural history of the region. Due to difficult access to the region for Europeans, *Ethiopia Oriental* remained the primary source for information on East Africa until the mid-19th century (see Lobato), making its significance invaluable.

The second volume, *Varia Historia*, has a broader scope. The 83 chapters delivering tales of Dominican missionaries from all kinds of faraway places east of Europe, providing a wealth of information on places and events in India (a.o. the conquest by the Mughals of Chaul and a report on the Muslim Kunjali people in Malabar), the Malay Archipelago, Russia and much more. This volume has consistently been understudied compared to the *Ethiopia Oriental*.
