RAMADAN


It is **obligatory**

FASTING

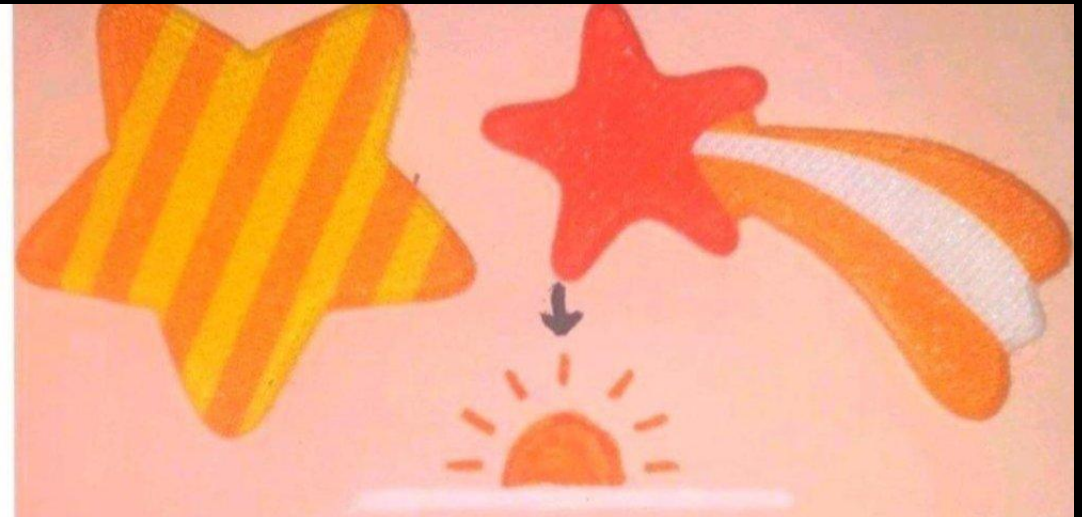
means

It begins on **8th** of Dhul Hajja.

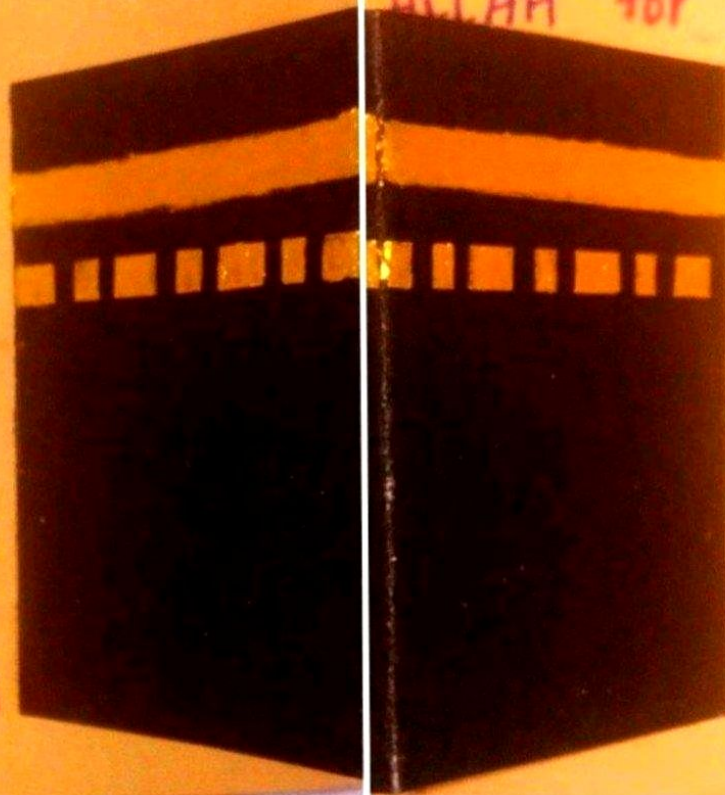

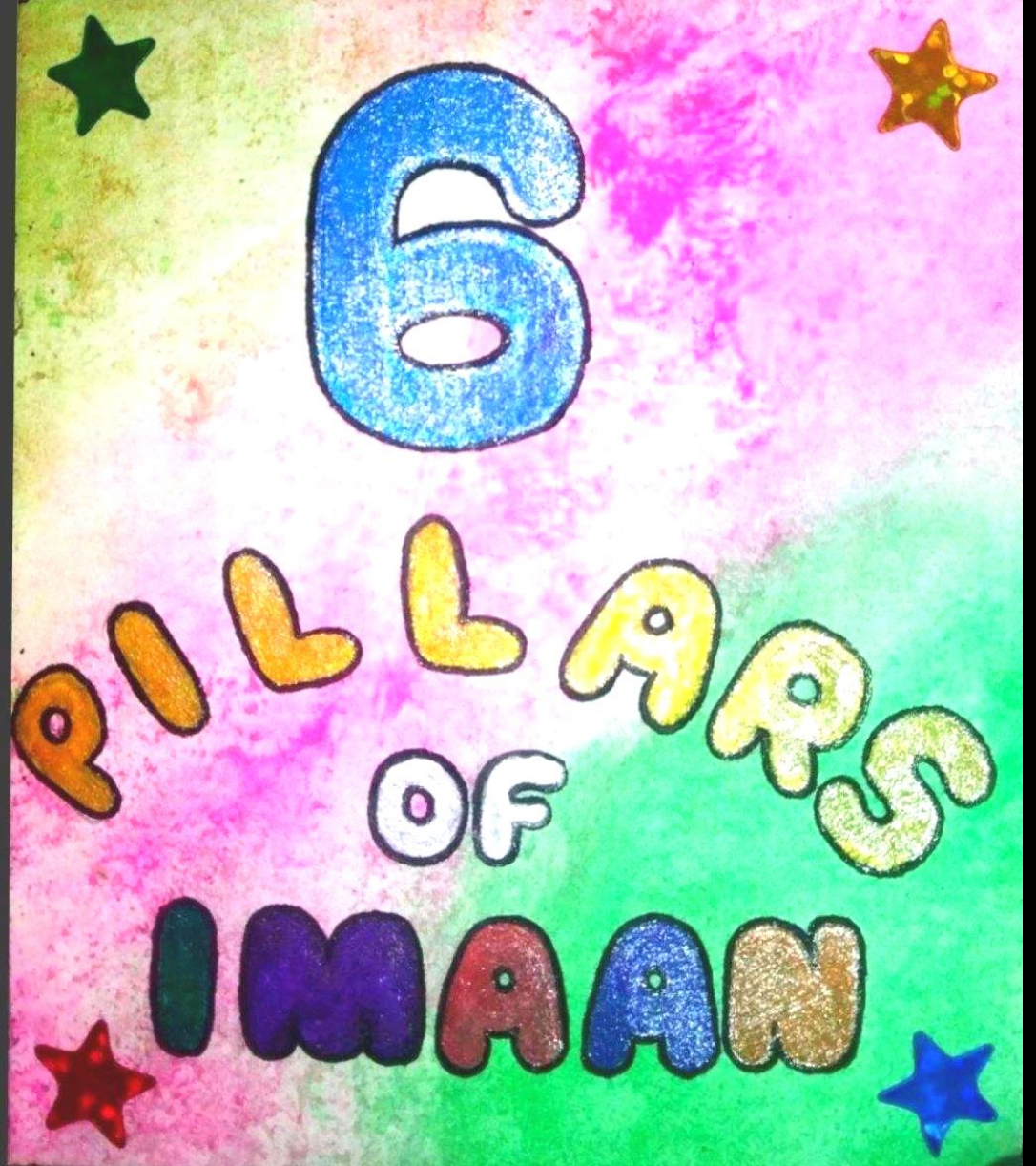
To perform Hajj muslims


BELIEF IN DIVINE BOOKS

Musa (A.s.) and many more.

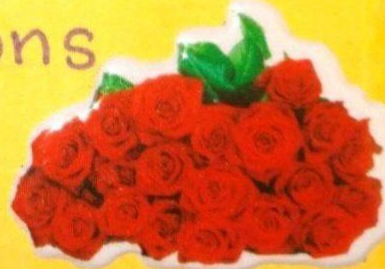
ALL the prophets and messengers were sent to specific nations to deliver the same message:

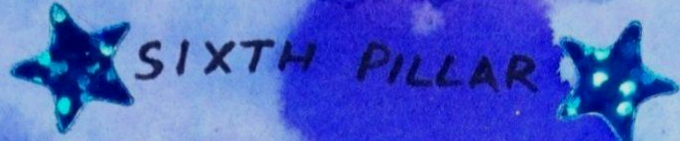

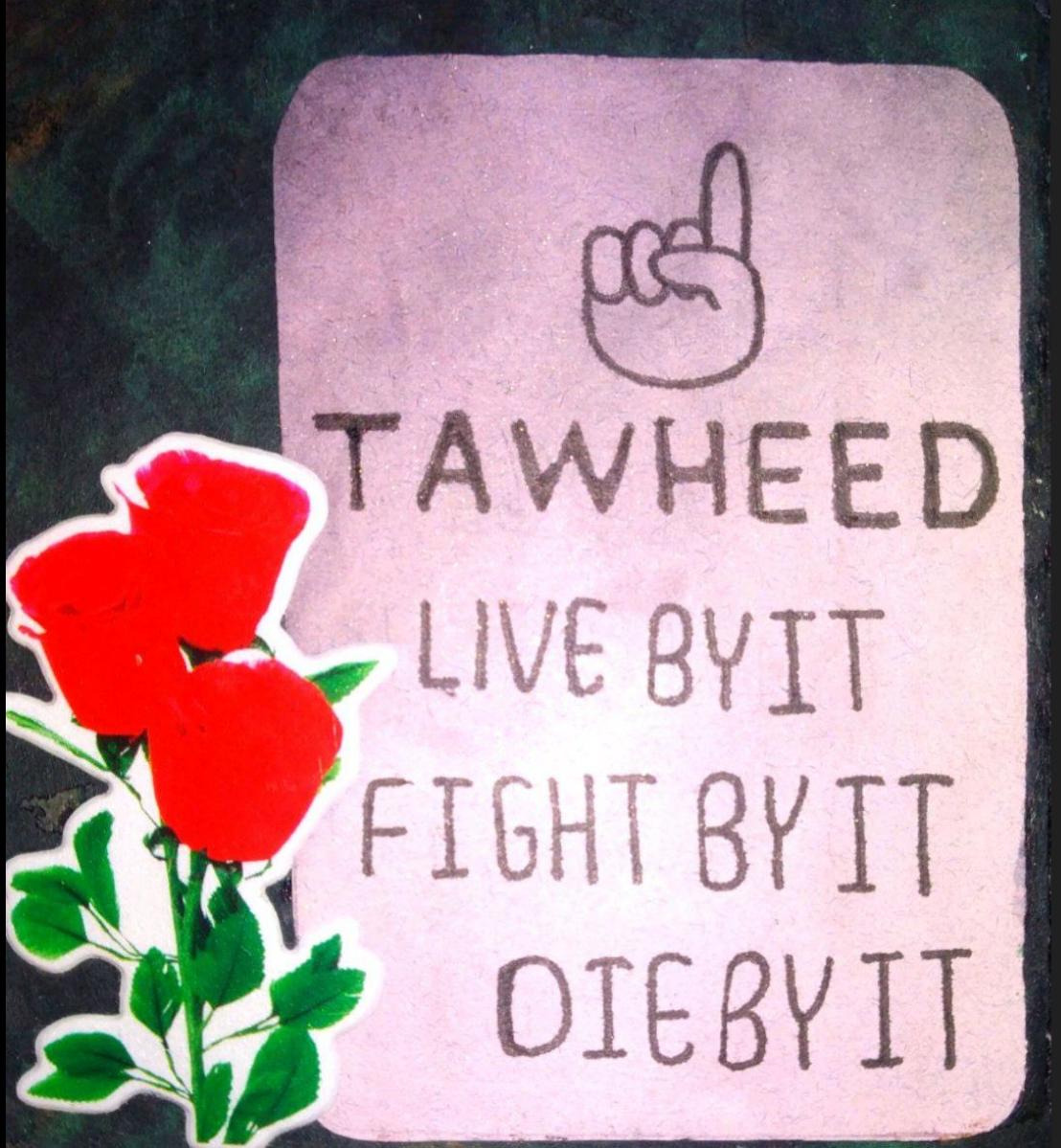

DEFINITION

The linguistic definition of TAWHEED:

Derived from the Arabic verb "WAHHADA", which means to unite, unify or consolidate.

Linguistically TAWHEED means:

'UNIFICATION.'



OF TAWHEED

The shariah definition of TAWHEED:

It means to worship ALLAH exclusively without associating partners with His names, attributes, function or command. or in Arabic "Ifradulillahi bil ibadah"

worshipping ALLAH exclusively.

AFFIRMATION

And 'illallah' affirms all the forms of worship to be for ALLAH alone with no partner.

TAWHHEED ARE:

FIRST PILLAR

NEGATION.

Thus 'la ilaha' negates all the forms of worship from other than ALLAH.

AL-Kufr bit-Taghout!

To disbelieve in TAGHOUT.
(an-Nafie - to reject). لا اله الا الله

This is the part of saying.

'There is no god'. This negates completely any other object or person worshipped other than ALLAH.

Taghout means: 'Anything/people worship, obey, submit to or follow other than ALLAH.'

Al Imanu billah

To believe in ALLAH
(ithbat - Affirmation). لا اله الا الله

This is the part of saying.

'Except ALLAH'. This is the affirmation that the worship is for

ALLAH ALONE

and there is no one to be associated with Him in His worship as there are no partners for Him in His Kingdom and His Lordship.

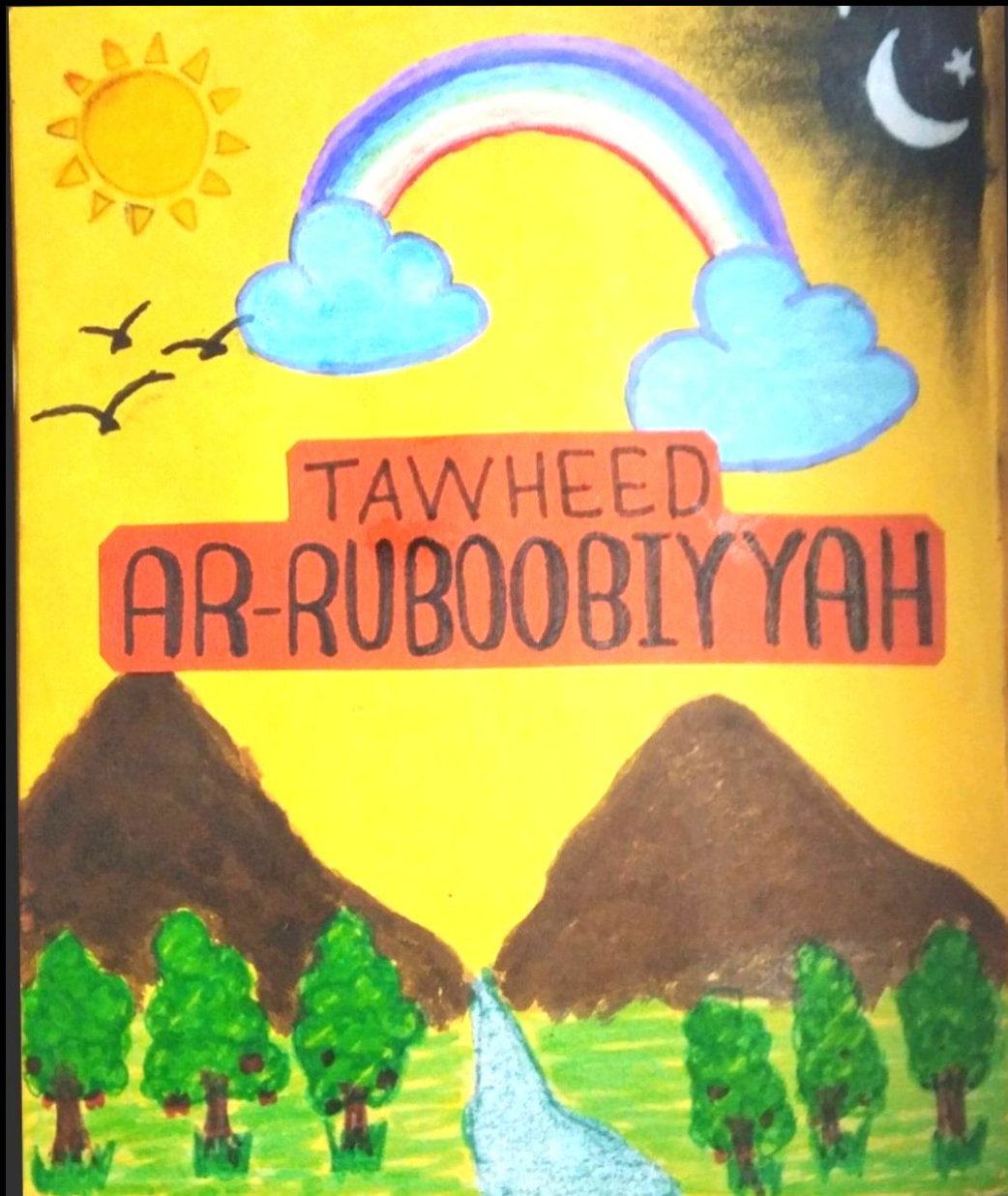

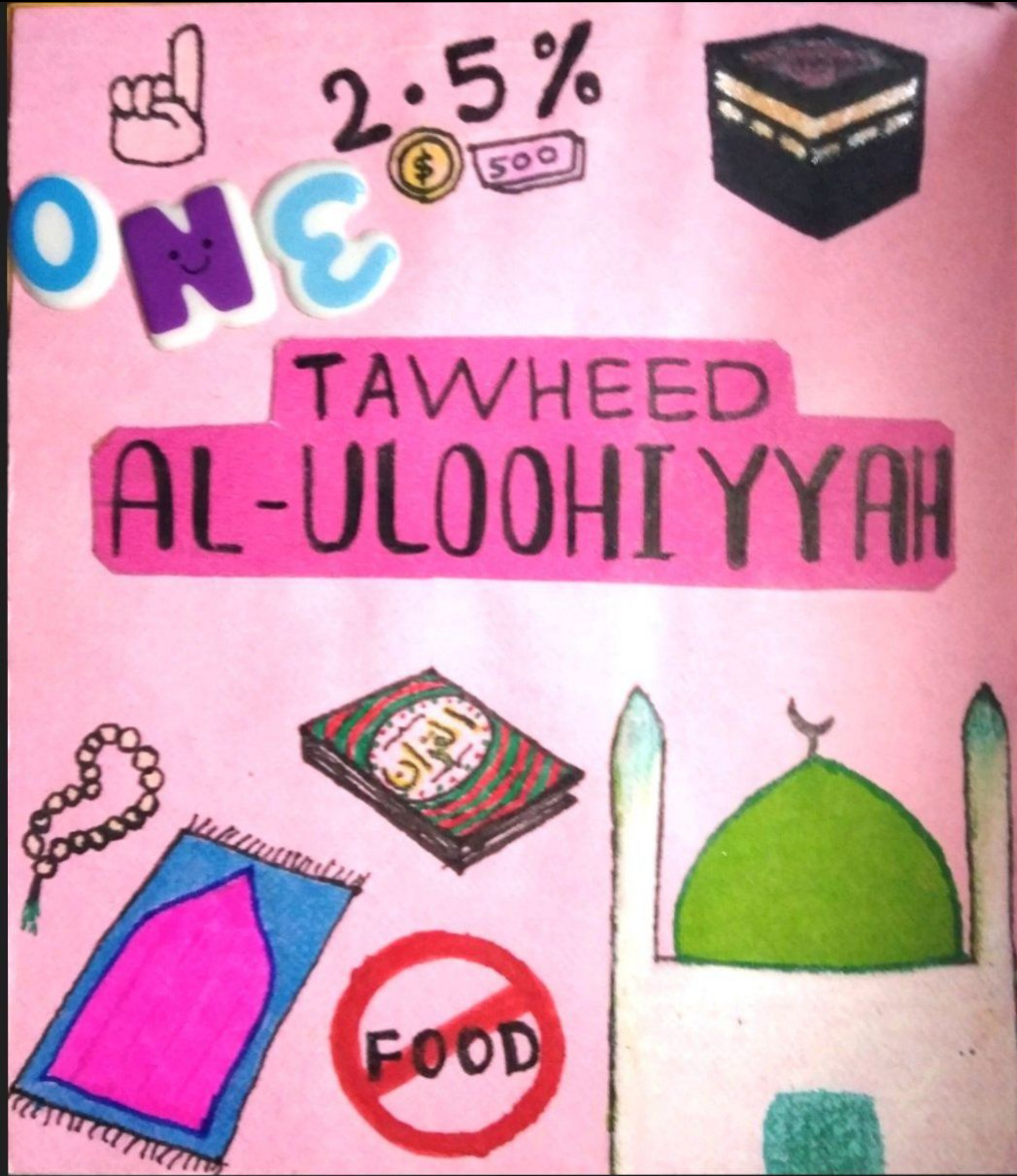


The tawheed of LORDSHIP

- ◆ Allah has the control over everything.

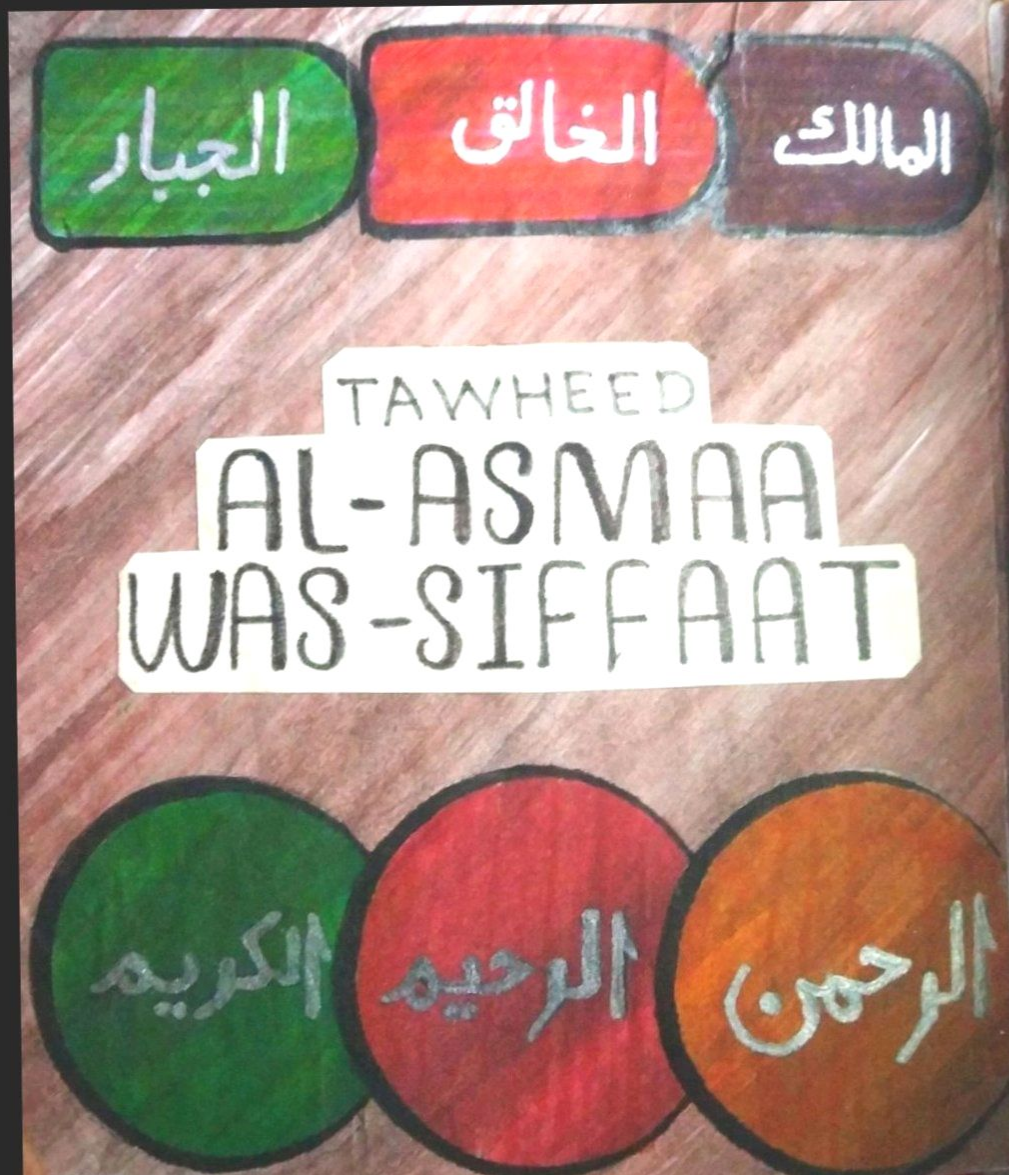


The tawheed of WORSHIP

To devote all acts of worship for ALLAH alone both inward and outward in words and deeds. Like sujud, Rukoo, zabah etc.



- ♥ To be sincere to ALLAH by hoping for his rewards.
- ♥ To fear ALLAH's punishment.
- ♥ To love ALLAH the most.
- ♥ To rely upon ALLAH and hope from him alone.



The tawheed of names and attributes.

This means to believe in the names and attributes of ALLAH and believing that there is none like Him.

There is nothing like Him, and He is ALL-Hearer, ALL-Seer. (AL-shoora 42:11).


Al-Sami - that Allah hears us even when we speak in hearts.

The tawheed of JUDGEMENT.

This mean to believe that judgement and legislation (Making of Laws and rules) belongs to Allah, the most high, alone. 

And to accept the judgement of Allah and his messenger (s.a.w.) alone and not others which oppose it.

Like going to the courts of Man-made Laws.

And to believe that ALLAH has no partner in the judgement and legislation.

He **alone** makes all the rules and laws and what is Halaal (permissible) and what is **Haraam** (not permissible) for us.

PROPHETS AND MESS

ALLAH sends prophets and messengers to guide them to Worship ALLAH alone and avoid taghut.

A messenger (rasul) is a person to whom ALLAH revealed the Laws and he is commanded to convey it. They are sent to disbelieving people.

Like Prophet Musa (as.), he was given Torah and Prophet Muhammed pbuh, he was given the book Quran.

A prophet (nabi) is a person to whom a new book is not revealed and they continue to spread the word of ALLAH to people. They are sent to disbelieving people.

Like the prophets sent to bani israel after Musa (a.s.).

ENGINERS OF ISLAM.

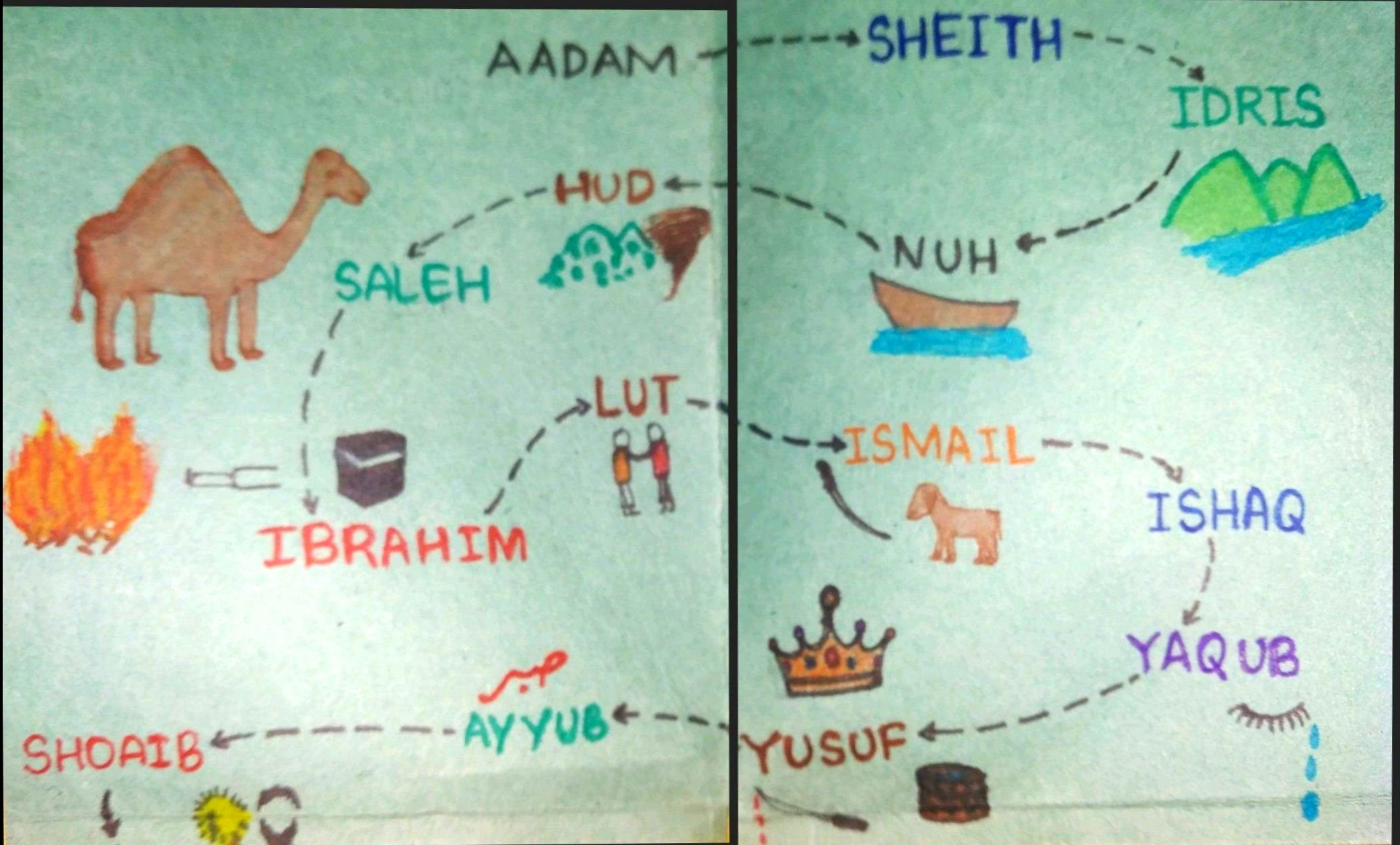

Aadam (A.S.) was the first man ALLah created using clay. He is the first Prophet and Hawwah (A.S.) his wife was created for Him.

Nuh (A.S.) came after Aadam a.s. and he was sincere, pious and patient. He was strong in his will. He even built a gaint ark by ALLah's command.

Ibrahim (A.S.) and his family were tested constantly with trials to prove their love and faith to ALLah. We need to follow his example.

Musa (A.S.) was sent to pharaoh who was a bad king and he claimed to be god. Musa (a.s.) was given Torah

Isa (A.S.) was the son of Maryam (A.S) who was sent to the children of Israel with new revelation, Injeel.

Muhammed (S.A.W.) is our last prophet and was sent to the whole mankind with the book Quran to guide us all to The straight path.

WHO IS A SAHABI ?

Defination: The scholars consider a Sahabi as someone who fulfills the following conditions:

1. That they met (came into physical proximity of) the Prophet (S.A.W.) in this world.
2. That they were muslim when they met the Prophet (S.A.W.).
3. That the meeting was after the Prophet (S.A.W.) received Prophethood.
4. That they died upon Islam.

Maryam (A.S.) is the
mother of Prophet Isa (A.S.) and
daughter of Imran and only
woman named in Quran and
she is amongst woman who
achieved perfection. 

Asiya (R.A.) was the wife of
pharaoh to whom Prophet Musa
(A.S.) was sent. She raised Prophet
Musa (A.S.) and was a true
believer. Her faith was so strong
that she accepted to die.

Abu Bakr (R.A.) was the Prophet's (S.A.W.) chosen companion for the Hijrah. He was also the first khalifah. His daughter Aisha (R.A.) was the wife of the Prophet.

Umar Ibn Al Khattab (R.A.) was the second khalifah. During his reign Iraq, Syria, Palestine and Egypt all became part of Muslim Empire.

Uthman Ibn Affan (R.A.) was the third Khalifah. He was considered the most modest of the Sahabah and even the angels would feel shy around him.

Ali Ibn Abi Talib (R.A.) was the fourth Khalifah. He grew up in the Prophet's (S.A.W.) home and accepted Islam when he was ten years old.



Aisha Bint Abu Bakr (R.A.)

was a beloved wife of Prophet (S.A.W.). She narrated more Hadith than any other woman and was a great scholar of Islam.

Khadijah Bint Khuwaylid

(R.A.) was the Prophet's (S.A.W.) first wife. and she was the first believer too.



Sumayya Bint Khayyat

(R.A.) was the first martyr to die for Islam. She was killed by Abu Jahl.

Fatima Bint Muhammed

(R.A.) cared for her father like a mother. She is the Leader of the women of Paradise.



Zainab (A.S.)

She was Prophet's (S.A.W.)
eldest daughter and passed
away during his life time.

Ruqayya (A.S.)



She was married to Uthman
Ibn Affan and passed away
around the same time as
the Battle of Badr.

Umm Kulthoom (R.A.)

She married Uthman Ibn
Affan after her sister
passed away.
