Nia has a Facebook page called Writing koNtuthu where you find most of her work. "Even when I'm writing for Facebook I write in full. I don't compromise on the writing style by messing punctuation or writing in short hand", she said.

Nokwanda writes about social problems affecting people. The romantic relationships that prevail in her stories are against a background of issues that affect ordinary people. She reads newspapers and social pages a lot and often tries to reconstruct and give life to real stories that affect individuals.





The greatest challenge she has had so far in the literary sector is monetary gain. She has published a number of books but the effort has never equated financial gain. Nia has however made peace with the situation and finds comfort in the fact that her books can at least touch a soul out there.

During an interview with Ibrah Magazine this dynamite stated that she hasn't had a lot of creatives appreciating her work although she however owes her presence and recognition to Stories by Cleo. When she first launched Writing koNtuthu, she sent her the link and she selflessly shared with her readers. To date, Nia has a large support base from people from Bulawayo, South Africa and abroad.

Her greatest inspiration is Danielle Steel. She described her as a creative who tells stories with ease without sensationalizing characters which makes her characters relatable.

Her greatest accomplishments so far have been being able to launch Writing koNtuthu and maintaining consistency even in the face of brutal criticism as well as having one of her academic articles being made a source of scholarly reference at a certain University in Europe. Nia has also featured in a project that won an award in one of the country's prestigious award ceremonies honouring creative arts. Besides fiction, Nokwanda also writes academic articles.

Amany is surely not just a talented creative but he's also versatile in every sense. We might not know how he does it



but he's definitely phenomenal in every regard that's for sure the name Amany is short for A Man Named Yemurai. Yemurai Nyoni popularly known as Amany is a multi-genre singer-songwriter born and raised in Bulawayo.

His first album was Hip-hop and over the years he has released bodies of work in House, Afro-soul, Amapiano, Afro-beats, Afro-pop and reggae. Beyond music, he's an author, researcher and a youth development specialist.

Amany has always had an ear and love for music. In his early years he'd create remixes of songs with his brother. He was once in a dance group and won a dance competition at some point. Later on, he got involved in music as part of the church choir and eventually stepped up to lead music in a small church he joined whilst studying in the UK.

Amany started taking music seriously in 2017 when he had his first recording studio session. In 2019 he released his first single, a gospel song called NaJesu. His second track was entitled Ngiyabonga which launched him into the local music scene after Khulumani FM interviewed him for the first time as an artist, he had been there a few times as an SRHR activist.

The response he got was the fire he needed to fully ignite his music career and it's been fulfilling since then. The biggest challenge he has faced has been monetizing his craft as a musician. In an interview with IBRAH Magazine,



he stated that he is yet to make back the amount of money he has invested in the music industry to date. He believes that as long as he's not paid well as an artist then there's no guarantee that he'll be able to keep creating music.

At the current moment, he is pursuing partnership opportunities with events managers in the city to host more



paid events and get good returns on his investments. Musically, he is inspired by Jacob Banks and Costa Tich. Amany believes that he shares a relatively similar vocal profile with Mr. Banks as he writes about themes that resonate with his journey as an individual.

Costa Tich on the other hand inspires him with the hustle and energy he carries in his videos. Amany watches and emulates his dance moves in his own dance routines and hopes to work with him one day. The desire to create generational wealth for his unborn children and their children makes him wake up every day and chase

makes him wake up every day and chase his dreams.



He hopes to make his mother proud and vindicate her for the sacrifices she made to give them a fighting chance. At the moment, he is also driven by the need to get enough cows to pay ilobola for his partner. Lastly, he hopes to fulfill his God given purpose before he dies.

Amany recently released a single entitled Novuyo. The song was inspired by the struggles that young men go through to express love to the women that have friend zoned them.

"Sometimes the love of your life can be a close friend so it takes a lot of courage to step up and ask for a chance to be their man" he stated. The song has received positive reviews across the board and airplay from some of the country's leading radio stations.

To date, he has performed in major events that include The Blaq Diamond Show, Friday Late, Kasi2Kasi Tour, August Rush, #I-LoveMsiz'kay Concert and the Roil Bulawayo Arts Awards.

He has also done club performance tours



at BAC, Cosmopolitan, Stunts, Hashtag and Red Cafe. He is part of Gang O, the group that won the Outstanding Music Video of the year in the Roil BAAs last year and as a documentary filmmaker, he was the co-producer of a documentary film that won a NAMA Award in 2009.

Amany also writes books and one has been published already. He conducts research and evaluations for UN Agencies and NGOs as well as spends time with the people he loves so that he stays grounded.

A couple of years back, he made the decision to be his own boss and determine his own working hours. He did it in order to spend more time with his family and to live closer to the people he cares about. He left a well-paying job and other forms of security to come home and rebuild around those he loves.

His partner and family come first always, everything else is organized with that in mind. He encouraged the youth to make sure that as they look up to others, they don't look down on themselves. "The strengths you see in others, are also locked up in you and await release" he added. We wish this dynamite all the best in his musical journey and there's definitely a whole lot more in store for him in this industry!

Tatenda has also walked on the runway a couple of times for brands like Zarguesia, then for Makanaka Fashion Show, for the Korean Embassy of Zimbabwe as well as for Chinese partners in Zimbabwe through JCMC.



IBRAH Magazine managed to catch up with him and he told us that his biggest challenge has been the financial side of things as certain turning points in his life required significant financial investment. "I am not the most impressive model when you look at me, all my success is because I serve a pretty impressive God who order's my steps", he stated during the interview.

His poetic journey started way back when he was very young and the gift somehow got lost along the way. He re-ignited it in 2019 at the Larfage Poetry Slam. He was knocked out in the first round and gave up. After the slam, he met Cde Phil from Khulumani FM in the National Art Gallery foyer. Phil took him to the radio station and it was the rebirth of his poetry.

He has faced a considerable number of challenges which include the fact that people expected him to sound like some of the renowned poets we have in the industry when he wanted to be himself and build his own empire. The fact that he wanted to write his poems in vernacular only has been a hassle because he's had to compromise and try to at least have a couple of verses in other languages so as to accommodate other people and to him, he feels like he's somehow almost lost his originality.

To date, he has three singles and his recently launched album to his name. Umusa KaThixo has ten poems contained in it. The album has poems that include Wongabantu which talks about the things we encounter in our daily lives, Umusa KaThixo which talks about how God loves us no matter how bad we tend to be as well as Idlozi which takes us through how the ancestors work amongst other poems.

Roil Bulawayo Arts Awards 2022 Outstanding Radio Personality Cde Phil was the Master of Ceremonies. The turnout for the launch was quite good and people from Bulawayo showed up. Sotsha Moyo, Abantwana beNsindiso, Madlela Skhobokhobo, Ijongose, Dab Three Events and Victory Siyanqoba were amongst the audience. Veteran musician Jeys Marabini was also in attendance. The is a master of his craft, a dynamic and iconic demigod who has made his mark through his extraordinary talent. Let's face it, every single song and production of his has a unique tinge to it.

He is a pioneer of a style of music he describes as Something Afro, a blend of Hip-hop, R n B and Pop with various traditional African elements to come up with a unique sound. Something Afro is characterized

by unique beats, deep lyrics, electric flows and catchy hooks.

His musical journey started just after High School in 2010 when he recorded his first song. After that he left for University and during the holidays he'd make sure that he continued recording. Four years later, after he was done with school and had gotten his degree he decided to venture



into music full time. Since then he has been pushing and acing this music thing. To date, he has released numerous singles and three albums.

In an interview with IBRAH Magazine, Msiz'kay stated that the biggest challenge he has faced so far in the industry has been breaking into the market. He stated how it isn't easy to get people to listen to your music and it's quite a process that's takes a while. "It takes a minute for people to accept music that's local, especially if it's from Bulawayo, being consumed in Bulawayo by people from Bulawayo" he said.

He believes he hasn't broken entirely into the market yet and it's still a work in progress especially if he can still walk around the streets of Bulawayo without worrying about people recognizing him. The Roil Bulawayo Arts Award 2022 People's Choice Winner's main goal is to inspire people through his music. To date, he has three albums to his name: Bazovuma which came out in November 2017, Bayatshiselwa which came out in April 2019 and the most recent Sizalobuhle which came out on...

He has also collaborated with artists trom outside the country and these include the Angolan Dj/Producer DJ Satellite, Brazilian Platinum recording producer Vintage Culture together with Brazilian hit making producers Fancy inc and Drunky Daniels amongst other artists.

UmtakaMaMkandla does not only have animpressive track record but he also has a well decorated one. He won his first award in 2018 in the Skyz Metro FM Music Awards when his song Inkomo Zamalobolo was voted Best Metro Urban Song. He has also been nominated as well won awards in both the Zimbabwe Music Awards and the Zim Hip Hop Awards.

He won the Roil Bulawayo Arts Award for the Outstanding Male Artist for two consecutive years, in 2020 and 2021 respectively. In December last year, his song Kulula which featured Bhekiwe won the Award for the Outstanding Song of the Year and he also won the People's Choice Award which came with a residential stand, just how cool is that! "For me Kulula was already the song of the year even before it was out there. I made the song sometime in 2021 so it was there just sitting. I remember we put out the advert to say that the album Sizalobuhle was coming out then Bhekiwe called for a collabo and then later came to the studio.



I gave her a few samples and she chose the very first sample. She wrote her verse in the studio and we recorded it". Just like that, the masterpiece was complete!

This year his sole aim is to reach more people so he'll be doing a lot of collabos with different artists. He hopes to grow his brand and connect with people. Msiz'kay believes



that it's up to the artists to make sure that people from Bulawayo listen to and appreciate their music through finding out where exactly people consume music then using those platforms to reach them.

His parting words to young aspiring artists were, "Just be yourself. Figure out what makes you unique then work on that".

We do wish this dynamite all the very best in his career. The future is bright and we can't wait for him to get to the summit!

t's no secret that the Legendary Thorne Laroq is iconic and dynamic.

From being one of the pioneers of the Hip-hop movement in Zimbabwe to being one of the best radio personalities and TV presenters of our time, his journey is nothing short of inspirational.

Thorne is a retired Hip Hop Artist, News anchor, TV/Radio Personality, Producer, Events manager, father, the Zim Hip Hop Awards Operations Manager, Script Writer, Secretary for the Zimbabwe Musicians Union (Southern Region) and an actor.

Born, raised and educated in the City of Kings, he's a dream come true to himself. Growing up, he was very passionate about art and everything that challenged his creative abilities. His journey started when he was quite young, way back in the late 90s when he started rapping.

At 15, he was competing on stages and battling other rappers, winning a couple of competitions in the process. After that he took on sound engineering and music production because at the time he felt that a lot of artists failed to communicate their creative thoughts to and with the producers and it was really disturbing to end up with a musical product that you didn't like as an artist.

He noted that artists struggled to be on shows hence the Bigger than Hip-hop event and they also struggled to be on air hence the Rapper-holics Lounge and The Rap Lab on Skyz Metro and Khulumani FM respectively. Then came the Ghetto 2 Ghetto initiative where his main aim was to familiarize artists with their fans and have a relationship



In an interview with the Magazine, he stated that when he was little, he literally drew every drawing, every picture and every painting that fascinated him.

Thorne wrote and sang every song he liked before the official lyrics came out on magazines. His passions evolved when he saw his older brother and his crew dance and rap.

To him, it was like watching Mc Hammer live. He narrated how his older brother taught him everything he knows from basketball, tennis to principles of accounting. Learning how to dance was a bit of a challenge for him since he wasn't gifted in that regard but with rap he caught on very fast. His world changed after winning a couple of competitions first with PC (Phlax) then later with the Rapperholics (Ray, Veejay and Gladys).

They wanted more so they got into the studio and started recording. They made some pretty impressive music but they didn't know much about marketing and school was pretty intense at the time, exams came and they found themselves in different parts of the country.

Thorne then met up with the Xmo Squad (DJ Unite, Bobstar, [ayzer, Wise, Zibro, Vúsa, Polite, Dengo Sbago and Sheu) and they stated organizing events then a movement called Black Panther. After that they did a compilation album and it was the first time he met P2daoh. Most of the guys later moved to SA. Since he was still studying he decided to go solo so



that he could have more control on the pace.

As a radio personality, Thorne Laroq wanted artists to have a platform that they could call their own. When the opportunity presented itself, he learnt radio presentation on the job and he's still studying media and communication to fortify his interests in broadcasting. When he first got on air he was a co-host in a talk show and someone decided that he could do more and he did. Being on radio gives him a sense of purpose like no other. He believes that he has the ability to change a life simply by being himself, as original as he possibly can so that people out there understand that you don't need to be supernatural in order for you to be iconic.



Thorne believes that there's still so much to learn and he's enjoying every moment. He loves radio and never dreamt that he'd one day be a radio personality but then life has it's beautiful surprises.

In 2020 he won the Outstanding Radio Presenter Award at the Zim Hip Hop Awards and to him winning a national award when he feels like he still has a long way to go is a nudge in the right direction.

He is currently a News anchor at Zbc, a Drive Time Radio Presenter at Khulumani FM and he hosts a show called The Movement that's on every Sunday at 1630hrs on ZBC TV.

His only challenge so far has been trying to balance school, work and family time but his schedule fixes itself most of the time. Thorne is very much inspired by his brother as he's been the only constant, he's always wanted to do everything that he did and he has managed to map out his own dreams through what he learnt from his brother. His ten year old son is the reason why he can't quit or give up on anything. "I have failed in other things in life but I have never given up. I dust myself up and try again because of that boy", he said during the interview.

Thorne Laroq encouraged young people who look up to him to appreciate negative and positive vibes and literally choose a side and be about it. "No one can stop you from being what you want and banging on closed doors will not only lead you to an open one but it'll also teach you the art of getting the closed ones to open. Giving up or quiting is not an option, if you make it one, it'll be your life ",he added.

Thorne is evolving each and every day and we definitely can't wait to see what life has in store for him next but one thing's for sure, only the best things are coming his way!

Duduzile Ndlovu popularly known as LaDee is one such beauty who just has it all. She is best known as a musician,




a radio personality, TV presenter and a business woman. Talk about being a high flier!
