# How to Write a Bio Sketch in 15 Minutes

Do you want to <u>write biographical sketch</u>? Your <u>biosketch</u> is your personal story – it is about you. It contains important information, including your training, education, achievements and skills, so it is important that you collect enough information and reflect on it if you're writing your story. Now if you're writing someone else's story, you should not only collect data but also make sure that it is from trusted sources. Otherwise, the biosketch may ruin the entire credibility of the book.

## The Purpose of the Bio Sketch

You should know how to write it properly because it is a painting or illustration of your life, or someone else's. The main goal of the essay, therefore, is to provide other people with an overview of the subject's life. The same rules will apply if you are writing about yourself and in your point of view – to present the person in a positive tone.

#### Gather and Reflect on the Information

Collect information about yourself if the story is about you. Do not think that you already know everything about yourself even though you have to write down all of those things you want other people to know about you. In this case, you need to write an informative bio sketch.

- 1. List the jobs you have worked, but highlight only the most important ones.
- 2. Write your achievements and successes, including promotion if any.
- 3. Include publications and projects you have accomplished.
- 4. Write some personal details, such as who are the people you are living with and where you are living.
- 5. Read old cover letters to get different aspects about what you were in the past.

## Write Biographical Sketch

#### The Introduction

In order to write biographical sketch effectively, begin with a good anecdote about the subject to get the attention of your readers. A short story will also be able to make an instant portrait of the subject – choose an interesting one to share.

When writing, use the third person point of view even if you want to write a biographical sketch of yourself. The anecdote can be a few sentences short. At the end of the anecdote, clarify who that person on it is.

In writing, show how unique you are as a person as well as what your personality is. You should write in an interesting language and use specific details.

### The Body

When done with the hook, you should give concrete details on the passions and achievements of the person. However, always be honest in writing the <u>professional biographical sketch</u>, and do not just write for the sake of leaving of a good impression.

Give relevant information about the job positions you've handled and the key accomplishments you've earned. You can also write about those things you want to achieve.

If writing a biographical sketch for a historical figure, highlight key information about his life – place of birth, place of death, key passions, achievements and ways he or she has shaped the society. You can also include other relevant details about this person in the biographical sketch. Write in a chronological manner to avoid confusion of your readers.

### The Conclusion of the Biographical Sketch

Finish strong and with confidence. Wrap up the ideas you have presented in two sentences or so. You can simply end with information on what you do and where you live if writing your bio sketch. For a historical figure, you can just conclude on how the person has shaped the society.

## How to Write a Biographical Sketch: Revising, Proofreading and

## **Editing**

- After following the guide in writing above, get ready for the next step, which is to review and revise your story. Check if it has the right length, it meets your objectives and it flows smoothly.
- Read the paper twice, one of the most important steps on how to write a biographical sketch. Make mental notes on the funny or awkward sounding statements. Then, read it again and start marking it for things that you should remove or expand. Improve those places to make a strong sketch.
- Read your paper again and check for the flow to know if the work flows smoothly and if your readers will get a clear picture of the person the sketch is about.
- Get a feel and determine if the story meets your goals, such as revealing your dedication to your craft. Were you able to leave the kind of impression that you want your readers to know about you?
- Like what you can see in a good <u>biosketch</u> example, your paper should also have the right length. In this case, check every sentence and determine if it deserves the spot in the paper and it does not waste space.
- Edit the paper and check for conciseness, accuracy and clarity. Just like in a biosketch example, you should check for the better flow and eliminate awkward sentences.
- Delete off-topic and uninteresting sentences or statements.
- Correct grammar, spelling and punctuation errors.
