BEW

This term we have really hit the ground running. With the token transferable, sinks coming on line, and our first gaming partner readying the launch of their flagship title there is a lot going on! Personally I have spent a lot of this quarter focused on my core areas of contribution: operations and product/technical.

On the operational side we have sorted out all the required documentation for all the new EPs. Additionally, we've added some consultants, such as community member OxHung. Finally we organized a fruitful trip to 3XP for several EPs (myself included) where we met some great teams who could potentially help grow the PRIME ecosystem even more!

On the product and operations side my most visible workflow has been Uplink, helping to refine the scope of both components – marketplace and bonds – and ensure we'll be able to provide crucial infrastructure to the community. Behind the scenes we're also working on a full website refresh and the roll out of the Ardent Prime tournament. Finally, there's been a lot of work I've undertaken to port existing code repositories to a new Echelon Prime Foundation github org and work to improve the developer operations for the whole Foundation.
