1. OPENING SESSION

1.1. Preamble

The Meeting of the EAC Chiefs of Defence Forces/Staff was convened on 9 February 2023 in Nairobi, Kenya, pursuant to the 20th Extra-Ordinary Summit of the EAC Heads of State held in Bujumbura on 04 February 2023 to evaluate the Security Situation in Eastern DRC.

The Meeting was attended by representatives from all the EAC Partner States, EACRF, Ad-Hoc Verification Mechanism and EAC Secretariat. A list of participants is hereto attached as **Annex I**.

1.2. Purpose of the Meeting

To consider the Report of the EAC Defence Experts Working Group held in Nairobi, Kenya from 7 - 8 February 2023.

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1.3. Constitution of the Bureau

In accordance with the EAC rules of procedure, the Republic of Burundi was the Chair of the Meeting while the Republic of South Sudan was the Rapporteur. Accordingly, Gen Prime Niyongabo chaired the Meeting while Gen Santino Deng Wol was the Rapporteur.

1.4. Adoption of the Agenda and Programme

The Proposed Agenda and Programme were adopted with amendments and copies are hereto attached as **Annexes II** and **III** respectively.

1.5. Remarks by Representative of the Secretary General

On behalf of the EAC Secretary General Hon (Dr.) Peter M Mathuki, the Defence Liaison Officer (Burundi), Col William Rusodoka welcomed all to the meeting of EAC Chiefs of Defence Forces/Staff to consider the Report of the DEWG on Security in the Eastern DRC. He expressed his genuine gratitude to the Republic of Kenya and in particular the Kenya Defence Forces (KDF) for the warm reception and hospitality accorded to the delegations.

Finally, he reiterated the EAC Secretariat commitment towards supporting the people of DRC in their pursuit for sustainable peace and security.

1.6. Remarks by the Chairperson

The Chairperson and Chief of Defence Forces of Burundi National Defence Force (BNDF), Gen Prime Niyongabo, welcomed the delegates to the Meeting in Nairobi, Kenya. He expressed his sincere gratitude to the Republic of Kenya in general and the Kenya Defence Forces, in particular, for accepting to host the meeting despite the short notice given. He further acknowledged the warm reception accorded to delegates since their arrival. He thanked the East African Community Secretariat for the role played in organizing the meeting.

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He expressed hope that the deliberations of the meeting will contribute towards creating lasting peace and stability in Eastern DRC. Finally, he wished the delegates fruitful deliberations and declared the meeting open.

2. FORMAL MEETING

2.1 Consideration of the Directives of the 20th Extra-Ordinary Summit of the EAC Heads of State in Bujumbura, Burundi on 04 February 2023

The 20th Extra-Ordinary Summit of the EAC Heads of State observed that the Security Situation in Eastern DRC was a regional matter that needed to be resolved through the political process and enhanced dialogue. Accordingly, the Summit directed the following:

- a. Immediate Ceasefire by all parties.
- b. Withdrawal of all Armed Groups including Foreign Armed Groups.
- c. Withdrawal to be accompanied by dialogue.
- d. EAC CDFs/CDSs urgently meet to review M23 withdrawal timelines, Force Posture and Operations Boundaries.

2.1.1 Immediate Ceasefire by All Parties

2.1.1.1 Observation

The Meeting observed that adherence to the ceasefire by all the parties is critical for implementation of directives by the Heads of State (HoS) Summit in Bujumbura. Some incidents of ceasefire violations have been registered since the Bujumbura Summit.

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2.1.1.2 Recommendations

- 2.1.1.2.1 The warring parties must unconditionally cease hostilities with immediate effect.
- 2.1.1.2.2 EAC Verification Monitorina and Mechanism (EAC-MVM), distinct from EJVM MONUSCO, be constituted deployed by the EAC Secretariat by 28th February 2023 with members from EAC Partner States.
- 2.1.1.2.3 Dialogue needs to commence for the warring parties to seek political solutions to the conflict.
- 2.1.1.2.4 It is imperative that official communication be made by the EAC Secretary General for a ceasefire to be observed by all warring parties.
- 2.1.1.2.5 The Secretary General is to report all ceasefire violations to the Chair of the Summit.

2.1.2 Withdrawal Considerations and Timelines

2.1.2.1 Observation

The Meeting observed that the previous withdrawal timelines directed by the Luanda and Nairobi processes, as well as by the CDFs/CDS meetings in Bujumbura and Dar es Salaam, were not adhered to.

2.1.2.2 Recommendation

The Meeting of CDFs/CDS of 9 February 2023 in Nairobi decided that the new withdrawal timelines must be adhered to by all Warring Parties.

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2.1.2.3 Observation

As a pre-requisite for successful implementation of the new timelines, the Meeting observed the following key considerations:

- Ceasefire to hold in order to facilitate organized a. and coordinated withdrawal of M23
- Establishment of a Monitoring and Verification b. Mechanism
- Concurrent withdrawal of all armed groups and C. EACRF Deployment in the vacated areas.
- Deployment of EACRF to areas earmarked for e. M23 phased withdrawal.
- Protection of civilians in areas vacated by M23. f.

2.1.2.4 Recommendations

- 2.1.2.4.1 The Meeting took into account the key considerations which led to new withdrawal timelines.
- 2.1.2.4.2 From the key considerations, the Meeting decided that the withdrawal of M23 be phased over a period of 30 days, with the D-day set for 28 February 2023. Consequently, the new withdrawal timelines, which must be adhered to by M23, were developed as hereunder:

Phase 1: 28 Feb – 10 Mar 23

M23 withdraws from Kibumba, Rumangabo, Karenga, Kirolirwe and Kitchanga.

Phase 2: 13 – 20 Mar 23

M23 withdraws from Kishishe, Bambo, Kazaroho, Tongo and Mabenga.

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Phase 3: 23 – 30 Mar 23

M23 withdraws from Rutshuru, Kiwanja and Bunagana.

2.1.3 EACRF Re-Posturing Proposed by Force Commander Observation

In light of the prevailing security situation in North Kivu and the expansiveness of the Area of Operations, the Meeting observed the need for re-posturing of the EACRF.

Recommendation

The Meeting decided the Force Re-alignment as follows:

- a. Burundi to deploy in Sake, Kirolirwe and Kitchanga.
- b. **Kenya** to deploy in Kibumba, Rumangabo, Tongo, Bwiza and Kishishe.
- c. **South Sudan** to deploy in Rumangabo and co-locate with Kenyan Contingent.
- d. **Uganda** to deploy in Bunagana, Kiwanja/Rutshuru and Mabenga area.

2.1.4 Operational Boundaries

Observation

The Meeting observed the need for distinct Operational Boundaries between contingents for the re-aligned Force.

Recommendation

The Meeting considered the proposed Operational Boundaries as developed by the EACRF Force Commander subject to re-confirmation after consultations with the Contingent Commanders. The presented Operational Boundaries are hereto attached as **ANNEX IV**.

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2.1.5 Withdrawal of Foreign Armed Groups

Observation

2.1.5.1 The meeting observed that many Foreign Armed Groups continue to instigate insecurity in Eastern DRC and across the National Borders in particular FDLR as well as ADF, RED TABARA, FNL and NAS among others.

Recommendations

- 2.1.5.2 EACRF was tasked by CDFs/CDSs to deal with FDLR in areas it operates from. The EACRF will gather necessary information on FDLR effective 30th March 2023 up to 20 April 2023, after which a report will be produced to trigger operations. If intelligence is not enough for operations, the CDFs/CDSs will give an additional time for gathering more information for immediate operations against FDLR.
- 2.1.5.3 Operations would continue to be conducted in areas where operations against all other armed groups including the foreign ones (ADF, RED TABARA, FNL and NAS) as well as the local armed groups that affect the security of DRC and her neighbors.
- 2.1.5.4 The desired end state of all this is to allow the conduct of Programme for Disarmament, Demobilization, Community Recovery and Stabilization (P-DDRCS), which will enable the resettlement of Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs), and the return of refugees to their respective countries of origin.

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AOB. RENEWAL OF THE STATUS OF FORCE AGREEMENT (SOFA) 3. Observation

The CDFs/CDS Meeting reviewed the security situation in relation to the implementation of the EACRF mandate and observed that the mandate has not been fully implemented due to the lack of full deployment, nonadherence to the Ceasefire and withdrawal timelines. The CDFs/CDS further noted that the SOFA was signed on 8th September 2022 for an initial period of 6 months renewable.

Recommendation

The Meeting recommends that the EAC Secretary General engage with the Government of the DRC towards the renewal of the SOFA.

4. **CLOSING REMARKS**

The Chairperson thanked the participants for the extensive and fruitful deliberations that contributed to the fulfillment of the directives of the EAC Heads of State. He was optimistic that the deployment of the remaining EACRF Contingents will be expedited to enable the regional Force deliver on its Mandate. Finally, he thanked the Republic of Kenya for the successful hosting of the Meeting and wished participants safe travel to their home countries

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
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EACRF CONTINGENT OPERATIONAL BOUNDARIES





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
