WHAT ARE SHOWCASES?

- Events that allow athletes the opportunity to demonstrate their talents to college and university coaches for scholarship opportunities
- *Must apply* to participate (e.g., Past results, league and league standings are taken into consideration)
- Teams are tiered (teams are placed against “like” competition)
- *Format: 3 games + occasional 4th game*

WHO ATTENDS SHOWCASES?

- NCAA Division I, II and III coaches (U.S. Colleges and Universities)
- NAIA Coaches
- CIS coaches (Canadian Universities and Colleges)

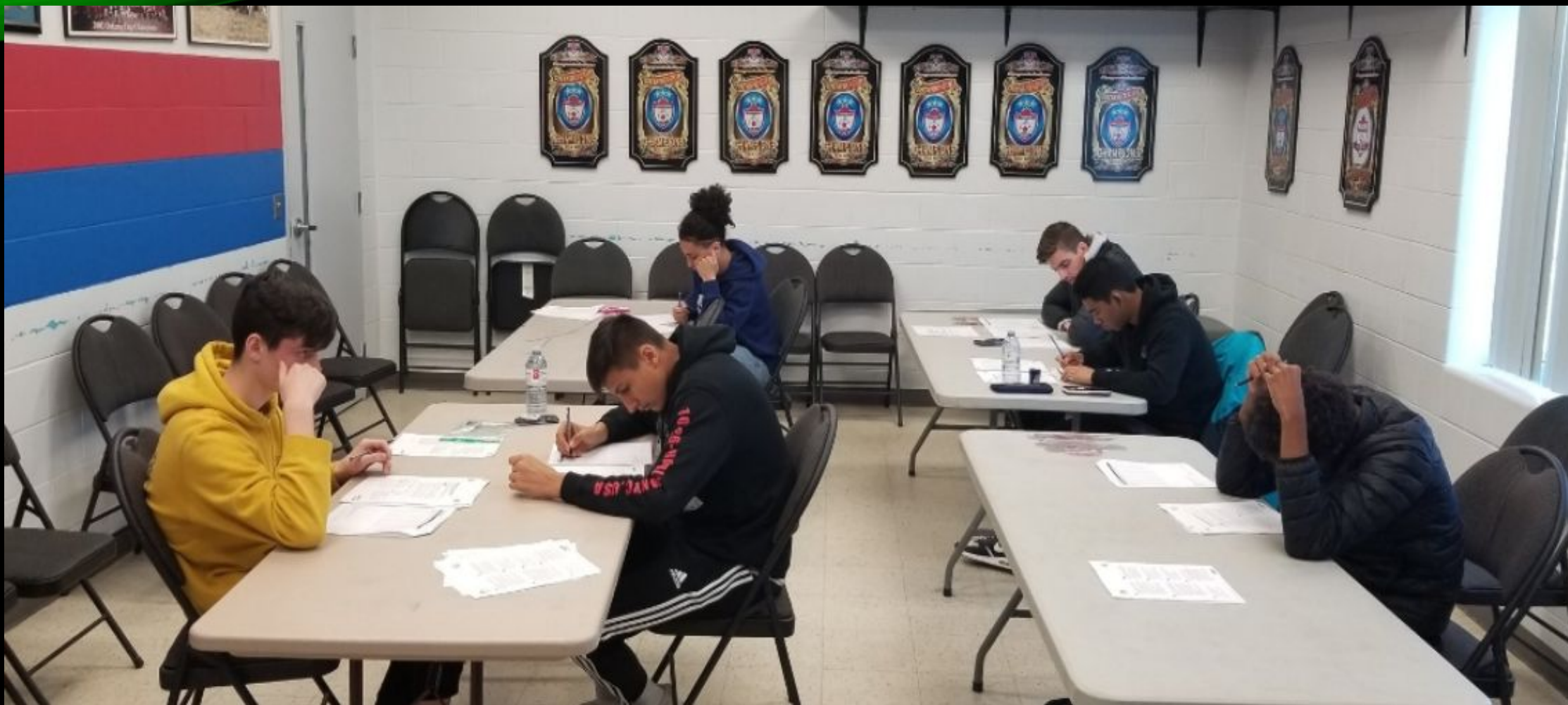
Why do we attend Showcases?

- Provide athletes the opportunity to extend their playing careers whilst pursuing a post-secondary education
- Provide players with additional competitions

What We Do?

- Run 2 SAT Prep Tests/Year for Woodbridge SC Players
- Communicate directly with College and University coaches about potential student-athletes
- Send video footage of players to colleges and universities
- Advise players on GPA and core course status
- Arrange travel to Showcases, Friendly matches, University tours; Advise athletes/parents on which ID Camps to attend
- Award \$1500 to three players attending post-secondary education.

SAT Prep Test



SAT

- Standardized test required to play NCAA athletics
- Test score is used on a sliding scale with an athlete's high school GPA to determine eligibility
- Advised to be taken for the first time **no later than** the Spring/Summer of Grade 11 year
- Can be taken *more than once*

NCAA DIVISION I AND II REQUIREMENTS

- Complete 16 core courses (14 DII)
- Complete 10 core courses, including 7 in English, math or natural/physical science, before entering Grade 12 Year. Once you begin your seventh semester, you may not repeat or replace any of those 10 courses to improve your core-course GPA.
- Earn at least a 2.3 GPA (2.2 for DII) in your core courses.
- **Courses must be completed at the Academic stream**



Division I Worksheet

This worksheet is provided to assist you in monitoring your progress in meeting NCAA initial-eligibility standards. The NCAA Eligibility Center will determine your academic status after you graduate. Remember to check your high school's list of NCAA-approved courses for the classes you have taken.

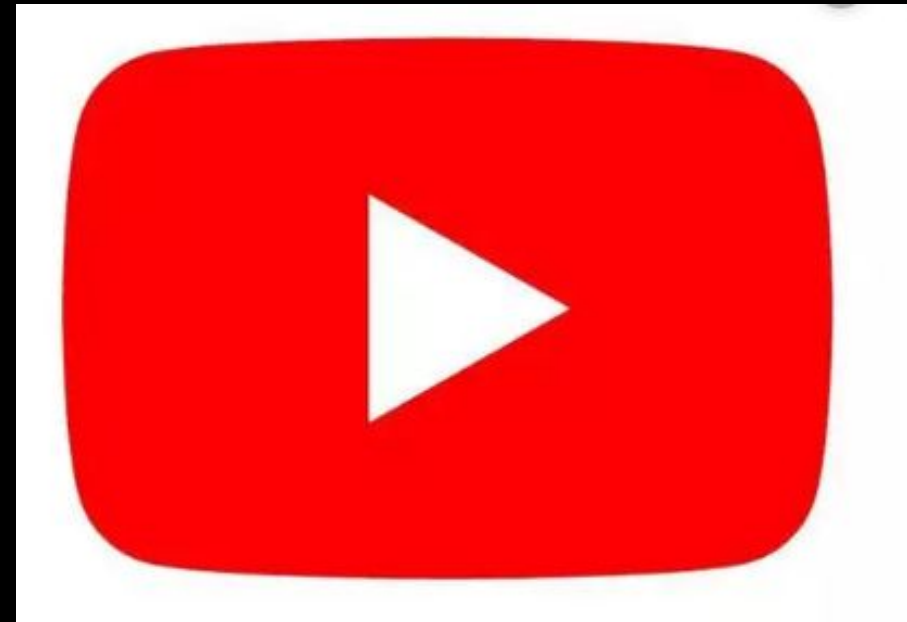

- Register with the NCAA Eligibility Centre
- *Begin compiling a highlight video*
- Begin emailing the schools you're interested in attending, send them your video, and invite them to your Showcase matches
- *Begin preparing for the SAT*
- Attend ID Camps

HIGH SCHOOL TIMELINE

9TH GRADE



- *Start planning now!* Take the right courses and earn the best grades possible.

- Find your high school's list of NCAA-approved core courses at eligibilitycenter.org/courselist.
- Sign up for a free Profile Page at eligibilitycenter.org for information on NCAA requirements.

10TH GRADE



- If you fall behind academically, ask your counselor for help finding approved courses you can take.

- Register for a Profile Page or Certification Account with the NCAA Eligibility Center at eligibilitycenter.org.
- Monitor your Eligibility Center account for next steps.
- At the end of the year, ask your counselor at each high school or program you attended to upload your official transcript to your NCAA Eligibility Center account.

11TH GRADE



- Check with your counselor to make sure you are on track to complete the required number of NCAA-approved courses and graduate on time with your class.

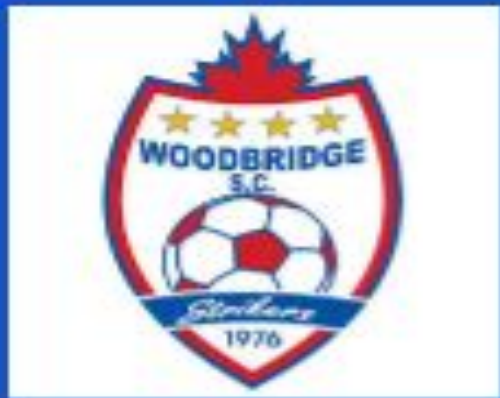
- Take the ACT or SAT and submit your scores to the NCAA Eligibility Center using code 9999.
- Ensure your sports participation information is correct in your Eligibility Center account.
- At the end of the year, ask your counselor at each high school or program you attended to upload your official transcript to your NCAA Eligibility Center account.

12TH GRADE



- Complete your final NCAA-approved core courses as you prepare for graduation.
- Take the ACT or SAT again, if necessary, and submit your scores to the NCAA Eligibility Center using code 9999.

- Request your final amateurism certification beginning April 1 (fall enrollees) or Oct. 1 (winter/spring enrollees) in your NCAA Eligibility Center account at eligibilitycenter.org.
- After you graduate, ask your counselor to upload your final official transcript with proof of graduation to your NCAA Eligibility Center account.
- *Reminder:* Only students on an NCAA Division I or II school's institutional request list will receive a certification.
