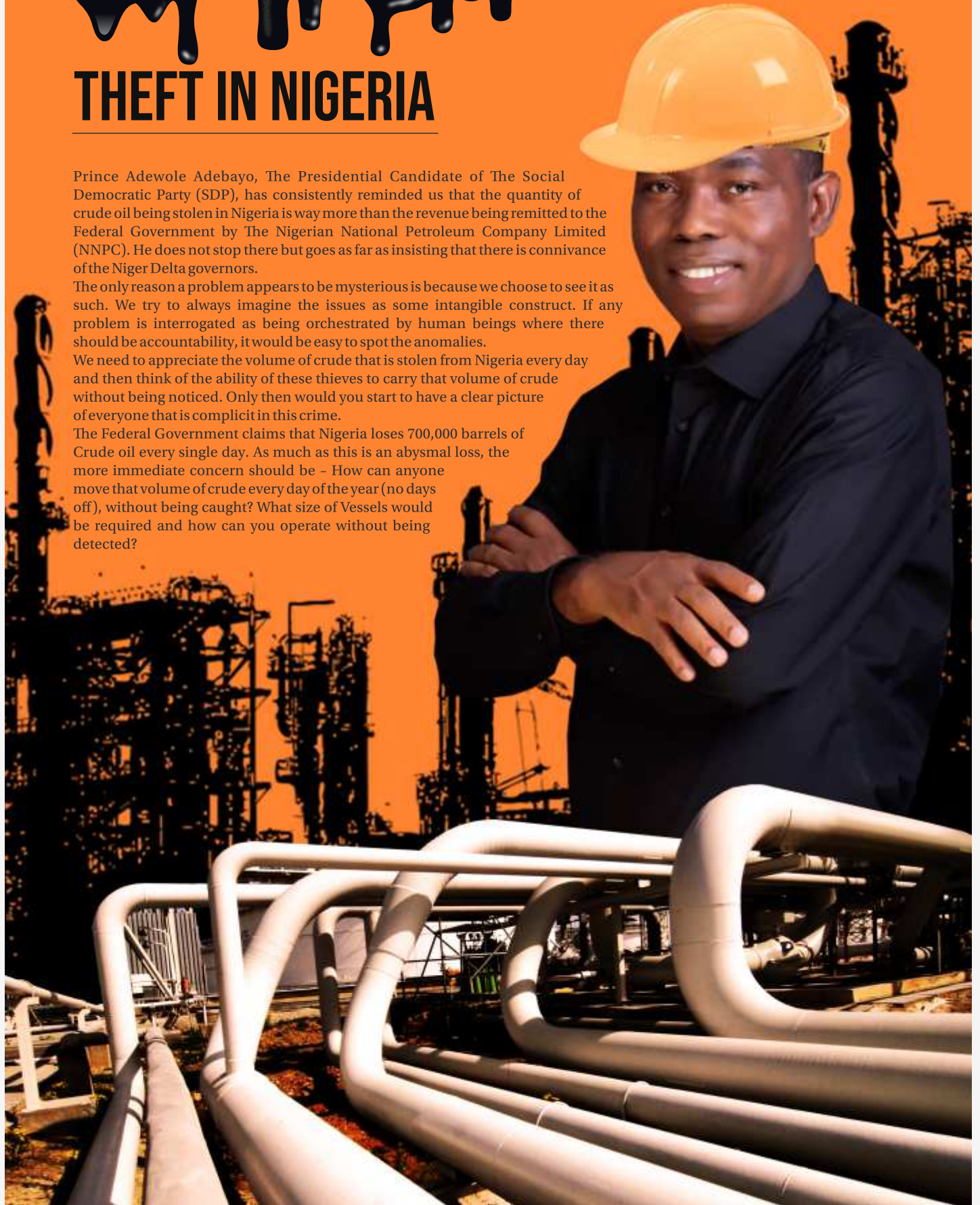
## **THEFT IN NIGERIA**

Prince Adewole Adebayo, The Presidential Candidate of The Social Democratic Party (SDP), has consistently reminded us that the quantity of crude oil being stolen in Nigeria is way more than the revenue being remitted to the Federal Government by The Nigerian National Petroleum Company Limited (NNPC). He does not stop there but goes as far as insisting that there is connivance of the Niger Delta governors.

The only reason a problem appears to be mysterious is because we choose to see it as such. We try to always imagine the issues as some intangible construct. If any problem is interrogated as being orchestrated by human beings where there should be accountability, it would be easy to spot the anomalies.

We need to appreciate the volume of crude that is stolen from Nigeria every day and then think of the ability of these thieves to carry that volume of crude without being noticed. Only then would you start to have a clear picture of everyone that is complicit in this crime.

The Federal Government claims that Nigeria loses 700,000 barrels of Crude oil every single day. As much as this is an abysmal loss, the more immediate concern should be - How can anyone move that volume of crude every day of the year (no days off), without being caught? What size of Vessels would be required and how can you operate without being detected?



## “It's Stolen as a Government Policy!” – Prince AA

Prince Adebayo reveals in one of his interviews how a government that agrees to be populated by people that would close their eyes and allow international and local criminals to work for them and stake all is oil can be said to be seen to be in connivance with the steaking of Crude oil. He explained how the lifting of oil was too sophisticated a venture and would require very large vessels that can only be gotten from overseas. He also mentioned how neighbouring countries have joined to bandwagon in cashing out from these opportunities whenever they detain any of these such vessels on their waterways

# THE GREAT SUBSIDY SCAM

While oil theft is going on physically by lifting the crude in large vessels while the authorities turn a blind eye only because they are compromised, there is also a more sophisticated scheme in awarded subsidies!

Government is paying a bunch of people subsidy for bringing in millions of liters of refined crude even though they have not brought in the alleged volume or even worse, nothing at all. This is the greatest scam that goes on in Nigeria every day. People make claims and carried stamped papers to The Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN) who

in turn would make payments for these bogus claims. Nigeria has paid out N4.194 trillion on subsidy between the years of 2017 – 2022. Worthy of mention is the fact that Nigeria's flow station is the only facility in the world that is not metered so we can't tell how much oil is pumped daily – we estimate at best. The inability of Government to audit the claims of oil marketers by simply conducting a forensic investigation of subsidies paid out should be unacceptable, especially as the movement of every vessel can be investigated today.

This is too visible a crime to go unnoticed. We have the NAVY securing our waters as well as the NNPC who recently revealed their state-of-the-art surveillance system that monitors all their pipelines. Let's not forget that these vessels are not built faster than the surveillance boats. Prince Adewale emphasized that the perpetrators of this crime are visibly moving on our waters and stealing our resources – this is the reason the NNPC has not remitted any amount to the Federation account in months!

What is more curious is that not many people are speaking of this leakage. To think that this is going on right about now, even as you are reading this text. Every patriotic aspirant running for office today in Nigeria should be exposing this truth as well as sensitizing citizens on the impact this money would do if saved in reviving the economy. Prince Adewale had added that even though nothing magical was done to the economy, just by stopping the bleeding we stand to gain immensely.

What we can do immediately to put an end to oil theft is not rocket science – all it takes is Political will as you would offend a lot of eminent individuals. Yes, these crimes are committed by people we know so well. All we need do is charge the agencies responsible for securing our assets as well as those in charge of drilling this crude to be more accountable and there are dire consequences prescribed to those involved in these illegal activities.

If every single vessel lifting oil which is intercepted by the NAVY (because its impossible not to be) is properly interrogated, all those enabling this crime can be exposed and brought to book. Its not enough for the NAVY to claim that each vessel found lifting oil has the requisite paperwork – we need to have an account of every ship on our waters!

## Engage the environs

After government has adequately blocked all levels of thieving on the grand scale it is presently operating on, Prince Adewole described how he would engage the people of the Niger Delta by making use of their local content. He argued that the engineering in that terrain ought to be challenged by encouraging those with the prerequisite skillset to build and run Modular Refineries. He insisted that their level of innovation if harnessed would allow for other such expertise in Oil services which would in the end earn revenue for the country – much better than it is getting from just basic harvesting of crude oil. Living in the riverine area availed indigens of the Niger Delta an opportunity to export such special skills as diving, sailing and other such unique services, to the international community. Setting

up institutions around those areas was one of the many solutions he suggested in order to harness the already enabled talents. Prince Adewole insisted that if all government institutions worked effectively, especially those relating to the Niger Delta, it would be evident in its environs.

It is indeed commendable and worthy of applause that Prince Adewale speaks consistently as well as passionately on this issue of revenue loss. Even though this might appear to be common knowledge in some circles, a lot of other aspirants might gloss over it because they do not want to make promises they maybe can't keep or might want to profit from. This could be really tempting, if you think about it. We Hope 2023 that many Nigerians can identify those that have their interests at heart, and vote Adequately!

As a guest speaker at the National Black Chamber of Commerce international round table discussion in Washington held on Friday, July 1, 2022. “I reached out to foreign CEOs while I was in the US. I promised to remove all bottlenecks they encounter in Nigeria. There are 2,000 companies that are signed up to generate 30 million jobs in Nigeria. They are willing to come in already.”

“I know the cluster of companies sector by sector, looking for where to expand overseas. As far back as 2003, I was representing an American Company in Umungasi Aba, Abia State.”

“What I have done over the years is to go to those companies in different parts of the world and convince them on the comparative advantage of moving their productions to Nigeria.”

“Jobs are based on activities, so production is a value chain. The cocoa that you are producing in Ibadan, is part of the value chain of the company producing chocolate in Switzerland or any part of the world.”

Adeology identifies specific product value chains and how scaling up from the level of agricultural produce to a market ready product impacts the economy positively.

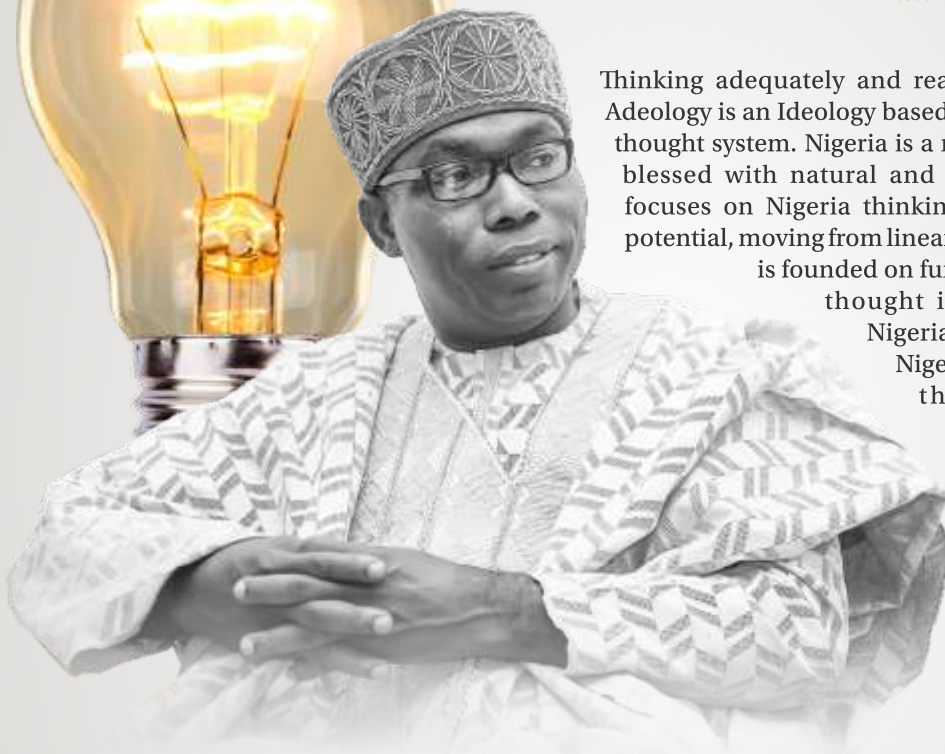

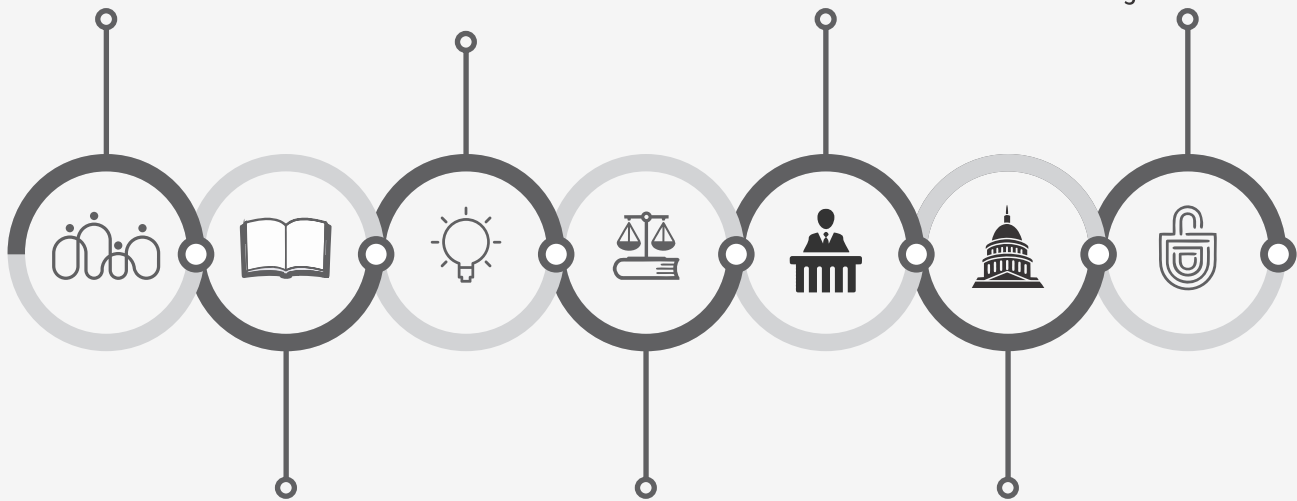

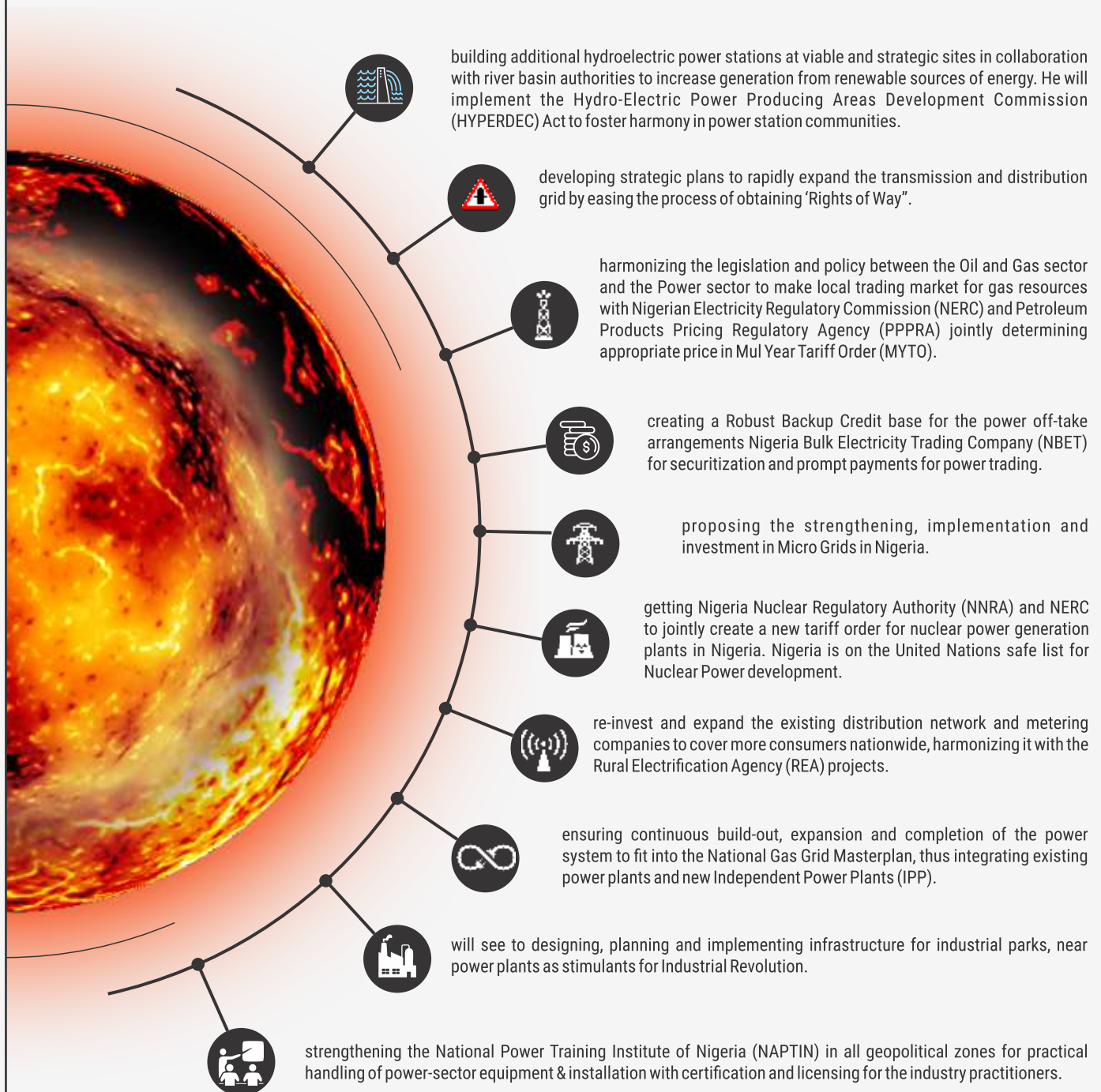

## RED CRUDE

### Economic diversification:

The transitioning of the economy away from dependence on one commodity or a single source of income towards several others, from a range of sectors or markets. It is typically identified as a proactive strategy for socioeconomic development, job creation, food security, and poverty reduction. A successful economic diversification will require building sectors that will truly bring about sustainable growth; independent sectors

that can expand as economic activity shifts away from a single income source.

For so long, making this kind of switch from a mono-product economy, has been a policy priority for developing countries. Yet the issue persists in how this is applied in the interest of their structural economic contexts. In the past, the discovery and utilization of natural resources such as crude oil brought great wealth for these countries, especially for some in Sub-Saharan Africa, with Nigeria being the

most obvious. The oil and gas sector contributes more than 60% to the GDP, making it the main source of income for the country; of course various sources exist, but this remains most prevalent. Nigeria's development challenge is not the 'oil curse' as experts describe, but achieving economic development beyond the reliance in oil revenues. Although various governments have had to refocus on Agriculture as a viable non-oil sector alternative, for food sufficiency, and to increase export earnings. However, not enough has been done with respects to the kind of innovations and ideas required to drive this sector to its full potential.

There was a time, in the early 1960s to be precise, when Oil PALM farming was a key sector in the Nigerian economy. In fact, the sector generated about 43% of the world's total production, making Nigeria the largest oil palm producer globally. Sadly today it is the 5<sup>th</sup> largest producer with less than 2% of total global market production, trailing astronomically behind Indonesia and Malaysia as global leaders with a combined total global output of approximately 80%; the former alone responsible for more than half i.e. 53.3%. Nigeria still remains the largest consumer of palm oil in Africa, but this barely sees any significance in terms of earnings.

### THE UTILIZATION OF THE OIL PALM SECTOR

Prince AA made this assertion to illustrate the dynamism of the oil palm market, and how its viability can be highly profitable; even when global oil price(s) had reached \$100 per barrel, bringing surplus in proceeds, palm oil sales surpassed that feat. Now imagine local production and sale of 10,000 barrels of oil palm at \$600, even at the current foreign exchange rate, that will be \$6m in total sales. This paints a picture of the magnitude of abundance if this sector is industrialized, in the same vein as with how Indonesia and Malaysia tapped from, dominating the market by contributing immensely to the global production output, and determining market prices. This further backs the CBN's aforementioned claim of continued market dominance resulting in massive financial implications.

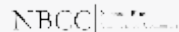

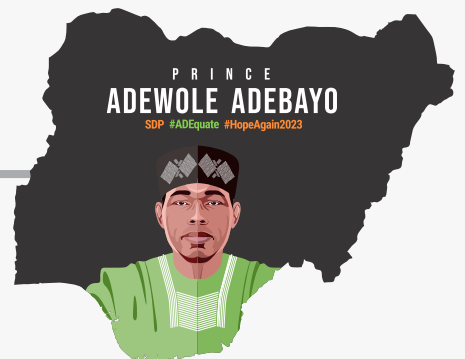

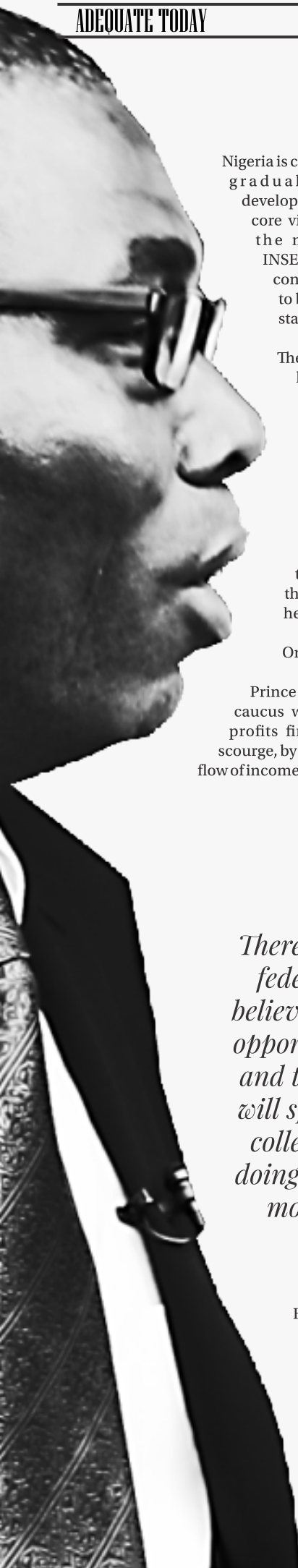

He opines that though there are pockets of insecurity around the world, the Nigerian government is insincere and unwilling to take drastic measures against this problem, but is fully confident in the might and capability of the armed forces.

*"Any problem that AK47 can solve is not a problem, the government is not just serious enough to attend to the problem, there is nothing serious; the Nigerian Army is very strong. I have done my assessment, I think they Nigerian army is using two per cent of its attention on Boko Haram, because they have seen that it is not the priority of the government"*

The Presidential candidate promised to deal with all the issue of insecurity, demand for restructuring and other forms of agitation if voted into office.

However, Prince AA identifies the Law as forming the foundation for tackling insecurity in Nigeria. He made this known at a

gathering of high level government officials and law makers from the United States of America

The Presidential candidate of the Social Democratic Party (SDP) said he will have the full weight of the law on incessant attacks in the country.

He also believes that it is the responsibility of the government to guarantee the safety of all life and property in a functioning state.

He goes further to state that what is required is effective governance and rule of law to ensure that everyone in Nigeria feels equally safe and protected without any cause to fear discrimination or persecution based on religious and

other identity. He emphasized that a government that fails to protect all citizens has no basis on which to assuage the subjective or objective fears of any group who feels unsafe and persecuted.

*"It is only by effective governance and fair administration of justice that a government assures all citizens of safety and security."*

The answers to the many questions around insecurity in Nigeria are not farfetched. We observe that what is needed to tackle this issue is the sincerity and willingness to confront head on

every aspect that exacerbates this problem. Strong and decisive leadership is required to bring to a complete end the menace that is

currently rampaging the country and its inhabitants.
