Best Minecraft Server Hosting Service Of 2022

Since its initial release to the public in 2009, Minecraft has come a long ways. Minecraft, a sandbox game that quickly became a hit with gamers, now has more than 140,000,000 players around the world. You can play Minecraft by yourself, or you can join a Minecraft community made up of other Minecraft builders.

One of Minecraft's most appealing features is the ability to play large multiplayer games. However, if this is your preferred way to play, then you might consider getting a dedicated Minecraft server. Here's why: Using a dedicated server hosting provider to host Minecraft is almost like using a webhost. You pay a monthly subscription to use the vendor's servers. This will provide you with better security, performance, and the ability apply modpacks for custom multiplayer experiences. But with so many Minecraft hosting server options on the market, some better than others, you may want assistance in determining which is the best Minecraft server hosting option for you.

Which Minecraft hosting provider will optimize your Minecraft game? Mojang offers Minecraft Realms, a subscription service that allows you to host your Minecraft server. It is available for Java editions and Bedrock editions. If you want more back-end control over your server -- or modpacks and maps that aren't available in Realms -- you'll need a modded Minecraft server. A third-party server host may be a better option in this case. It will allow you to have sufficient bandwidth and control of the configuration and settings of your Minecraft world seed.

Below, we've reviewed some of the best Minecraft server hosting vendors, including Hostinger, Shockbyte and GGServers. We focused on service companies that offer 24/7 support as well as a variety of plans.

How we chose the best third-party Minecraft server hosts It's important to note that we didn't explicitly "test" the Minecraft hosting provider options on this list. Instead, we constructed a competitive overview using a variety of factors including third-party ratings, and features offered by each company. We've also weighted the rankings of these businesses by the Better Business Bureau and TrustPilot. With this data, we divided them into two levels:

Best Minecraft hosting providers (top tier): These Minecraft host vendors all have a rating of A or higher from the nonprofit Better Business Bureau (except in cases when the companies are based outside of North America and not included in the BBB ranking system) and a rating of 4.0 or higher out of 5 from TrustPilot, a Danish consumer review site. TrustPilot rankings include at least 1,000 user reviews. All vendors in our top picks offer 24/7 support and modpack support.

Another option for Minecraft hosting (second tier). All these Minecraft host vendors have TrustPilot Ratings of 4.0 or higher; however, these ratings are based upon less than 1,000 user reviews. One, Nodecraft has a D+ rating at the BBB. The other sites have either an As or higher rating, or no BBB page because of their location.

Important caveats. The Better Business Bureau is not affiliated to any government agency. They do not rate companies outside North America. To be BBB Accredited, companies pay a fee to the organization. TrustPilot has a paid tier, which gives companies more interaction with their users. It also removed 2.2 million fake reviews in 2020.

Note about pricing: We have done our best to ensure that the prices shown here are accurate at time of publication. However, prices in this category are subject to frequent fluctuations and are also consistently subject to special offers and limited deals. Many of the prices are indicative of monthly rates if you prepay 12 months of service or have limited-time introductory pricing. To verify pricing, please contact the vendor in question.

Best Minecraft server hosting services

Hostinger

Minecraft server hosting starting at \$7 a month

Hostinger is one our top web hosting providers. They offer five different Minecraft hosting plans. All plans include mod support and full root access. DDoS attacks protection is included. There are also automated backups and 99.9% uptime. Multicraft control panels, Minecraft dedicated servers, Modpacks & plugins, low latency, and a Tier-3 data center that is globally connected to Minecraft server locations make Minecraft hosting a great choice. The pricing differences are due to the different RAM or vCPU hardware options. Starting at \$2GB RAM and two CPU Hardware for \$7 per month, you can go up to 16GB RAM for \$78 per month.

Hostinger is located in Lithuania so it doesn't have a BBB page. This organization focuses only on US-based businesses. It does however have a TrustPilot rating, 4.3 out 5, and more than 7,000 reviews.

Minecraft server hosting starting at \$9 a month

MCProHosting offers nine Minecraft server host plans, ranging from \$9 a month for 1GB RAM and 25 player slots to \$100 a month for 32GB RAM and unlimited player slots. Playing Games Is Always Fun Every plan includes unlimited storage space, worldwide server locations and DDoS protection.

MCProHosting offers a huge benefit: You can try one of its "Villagers" plans for free for seven days or the step-up plan "Witch" for \$1 for your first month.

MCProHosting has an A+ rating from the BBB and a TrustPilot rating rating of 4.8/5.0 with more than 5,000 customer reviews.

Shockbyte

Shockbyte is a game server provider, offering 12 different Minecraft server hosting plan options, along with the ability to design a custom plan. Prices range from \$2.50/month for 1GB RAM and 20 slot (the number of available spaces on a Minecraft server) to \$40/month for 16GB RAM. All plans include 100% Uptime, DDoS Protection, Instant Setup, and a Free Subdomain Name.

Shockbyte is located in Australia so it doesn't have a BBB page. However, it does have a TrustPilot rating of 4.6 out of 5 with more than 5,000 reviews.

GGServers

Minecraft server hosting starting at \$3 a month

GGServers offers ten different Minecraft server hosting plans, each of which come with the option for standard or premium (which doubles the price).

Standard plans include DDR4 2133MHz RAM, 3.2-4GHz CPU, 400MBps SSD, and DDR4 2133MHz RAM. It also costs an extra \$2 a month to add on a MySQL database, or unlimited slots. You won't have access to all nine server sites. Premium plans include DDR4 2400MHz RAM and a 4.4-5GHz CPU. They also include a MySQL database, unlimited slots, and access to all nine servers worldwide. Both plans include a subdomain, DDoS protection, and instant activation. Standard plans start at \$3 per month for 1,024MB RAM with 12 player slots (or \$6/month premium) and go up to \$96 per month for 32.768MB RAM standard (or \$192/month premium).

GGServers is based in Canada and does not have a BBB page. It does have a TrustPilot rating, 4.5 out of 5, and more than 2,000 reviews.

ScalaCube

Minecraft server hosting starting at \$2.50 a month

ScalaCube hosts game-specific servers. There are nine plans available, starting at \$2.50 per month for 768MB RAM and 3.4GHz CPU. 10GB SSD storage, 10 players slots, unlimited servers, and \$96 per month for 32GB RAM and 8x3.4GHz CPU. 320GB SSD storage, 600 players slots, and unlimited servers. You'll also find Minecraft Pocket Edition server hosting options, ranging from \$0 a month for a basic server to \$96 a month for 600 players. All Minecraft and Minecraft Pocket Edition plans come with multiple servers, backup, DDoS protection, and free webhosting, domain, and MySQL.

ScalaCube, which is based in Estonia, does not have a BBB profile. However, ScalaCube does have a TrustPilot rating in the range of 4.4 to 5 and more than 2,000 reviews.

Other unofficial Minecraft hosting options to consider The following Minecraft server hosts have slightly lower or fewer TrustPilot and/or BBB ratings than the ones above.

Hostwinds Another of our top web hosting site picks, Hostwinds also offers Minecraft server hosting starting at \$5 a month. It has an A+ rating from the BBB and is BBB Accredited, and its TrustPilot rating is 4.3 out of 5, though it has fewer than 1,000 reviews.

BisectHosting BisectHosting has 20 plans. Each plan offers the option to choose from a budget or a premium package. Budget packages start at \$3 per Month for 1,024MB RAM and unlimited NVMe SD. Up to 12 slots are available. Premium packages cost \$95.68 per Month for 32.768MB RAM and 160 slot. Premium plans cost \$8 per month to \$159.68 per month. They offer the same RAM as budget plans, but more locations, free modpack updates, sponge install, dedicated IP address, unlimited slots, and free daily backups. BisectHosting received an F rating from BBB. It has a TrustPilot rating, 4.5 out 5, with over 3,000 reviews.

Apex Hosting Apex Hosting provides Minecraft Java and Bedrock Edition servers starting as low as \$7.49 per month. It also includes a seven-day money-back guarantee. Apex Minecraft Hosting holds an A+ rating from BBB, and a TrustPilot Rating Rating of 4.8. However, it has less than 500 reviews.

Nodecraft Nodecraft also offers Minecraft Java or Bedrock Edition server hosting starting at \$6.49 per month. Nodecraft holds a BBB rating, but a 4. TrustPilot rating: 3 out of 5, with over 1,000 reviews.

Sparked Host Sparked Host offers game and cloud hosting, with 13 different Minecraft server hosting plan options, starting at \$1.50 a month. Sparked Host is a US-based company. However, it doesn't appear to have a BBB profile. It does have an average TrustPilot rating, 4.7 out of 5, and more than 1,000 reviews.

PebbleHost PebbleHost hosts Minecraft, as well as other games and dedicated servers. You can choose from a range of plans: budget, premium, and extreme depending on your requirements. Plans start at \$1 perGB per Month. PebbleHost is based in the UK and does not have a BBB page, but it has a TrustPilot rating of 4.8 out of 5 with more than 2,000 reviews.

RAMShard RAMShard offers nine Minecraft server hosting plans, starting at \$3 a month. It has an A+ BBB rating and is BBB accredited, and has a TrustPilot rating of 4.2 out of 5, though with fewer than 500 reviews.
