

Terms of Reference for Baseline Knowledge, Attitude and Practices (KAP) Survey on Electoral Violence Situations in Benue, Borno, Kaduna, Imo, Rivers, and Oyo States

1. Background

Civil Society Legislative Advocacy Centre (CISLAC) is implementing a project titled Towards Peaceful and Non-Violent 2023 Election in Nigeria under the support of the European Union – Support to Democratic Governance in Nigeria (EU-SDGN) as part of efforts to reinforce democracy in Nigeria.

The Towards Peaceful and Non-Violent 2023 Election in Nigeria project has the overall objective of harnessing the instruments that are crucial to ensuring a peaceful and non-violent 2023 election in Nigeria and is looking to engage a research organization/consultant to coordinate the conduct of a baseline Knowledge Attitude and Practices (KAP) survey of current election induced violence and drivers of electoral unrest in Benue, Borno, Kaduna, Imo, Rivers, and Oyo states.

2. Objectives of the Survey

- a. The KAP survey aims to identify needs, problems, and barriers in programme delivery, as well as solutions for improving quality and accessibility of interventions.
- b. To show the magnitude of the challenges, which in turn, may inform resource needed and provide programme staff with the fundamental information needed to make strategic decisions
- c. To serve as advocacy tool.

3. Methodology

- a. Desk review of similar studies.
- b. The assignment will adopt key informant interviews of security duty bearers including the police, Nigerian Security and Civil Defence Corps (NSCDC), traditional and religious leaders, youth and women leaders, political parties, election management bodies and anonymous sources.
- c. Data Analysis and interpretation

- Produce an inception report detailing context, design, sample, methodology to be used for data collection and analysis
- Develop survey protocol and share with CISLAC for approval
- Develop data collection tools and share with CISLAC for approval
- Apply the tools for data collection in the field
- Analyze data collected
- Present draft survey report for feedback
- Finalize the survey report
