GERUNDS AND INFINITIVES

When a sentence contains two verbs next to each other, the main verb (the one after the subject) is conjugated according to the subject and the tense (past, present, etc.). The second (or third) verb is not conjugated. It is always a gerund or an infinitive. Whether you use a gerund or an infinitive depends on the previous verb (or verb expression) in the sentence.

Verbs that combine with gerunds enjoy mind avoid imagine reccommend miss regret can't help risk adore Examples:
