

How to Upgrade to Windows 10 Without Losing Important Data

A Windows upgrade will help you get the best experience out of your computer. The problem many people have is that Windows updates can be very slow or even completely freeze up your operating system. When this happens you will have to reboot or simply lose all unsaved work. You should avoid Windows updates if at all possible. That is what this article will discuss.

If you use Windows and use the Microsoft Outlook program regularly, it is important to perform a Windows upgrade every few years to make sure you always have the most up-to-date version of Windows. Microsoft has kept the basic version of Windows open for everyone, including people who run Windows updates manually. Windows updates are very important because they fix bugs and errors. They also improve performance and make your system more secure. If your computer is infected with spyware, a virus, or a Trojan horse, a Windows update will usually fix the issue. You will need to download a software utility called Windows Updater to help you perform a Windows upgrade. There are several versions of this software utility which can be downloaded from the Internet. One of these utilities is available free of charge. Once your Windows Updater has found all the files it needs to perform the upgrade, it will inform you of everything it needs to do. It will then proceed to upgrade your operating system. Some people may be confused about what will happen when they try to perform the upgrade themselves. If your computer is not connected to the internet, you will not be able to perform a windows 10 upgrade from your own computer. The only way to upgrade from your own computer is by connecting it to the internet.

When your Windows Updater finds the required files, it will automatically begin the upgrade. However, some Windows programs will require you to allow certain processes to complete before the upgrade will proceed. Make sure that you know what these particular programs are before you attempt to run the update. Also, make sure that your computer is powered off during the entire process. Otherwise, you could damage your computer if you were to use the WU for any other reason.

After your Windows Updater finishes the upgrade, it will then offer you two options. If you would like to continue with the upgrade, you will have to click "Yes" to continue. Otherwise, you can click "Cancel" to end the update. Either way, your operating system will be receiving the latest update which includes all the new features that came along with your computer's original installation.
