

The first item to reach the market, a self cleaning wall and countertop cannot only kill bacteria but also eliminate odours and staining associated with smoke from cooking oils and cigarettes, reports the journal 'Technology Review'. The key to the self cleaning world of the future is the interaction between titanium dioxide and ultraviolet rays from the sun. The special properties of Titanium di oxide were first discovered by Tokyo University chemist Akira Fujishima in 1969.
