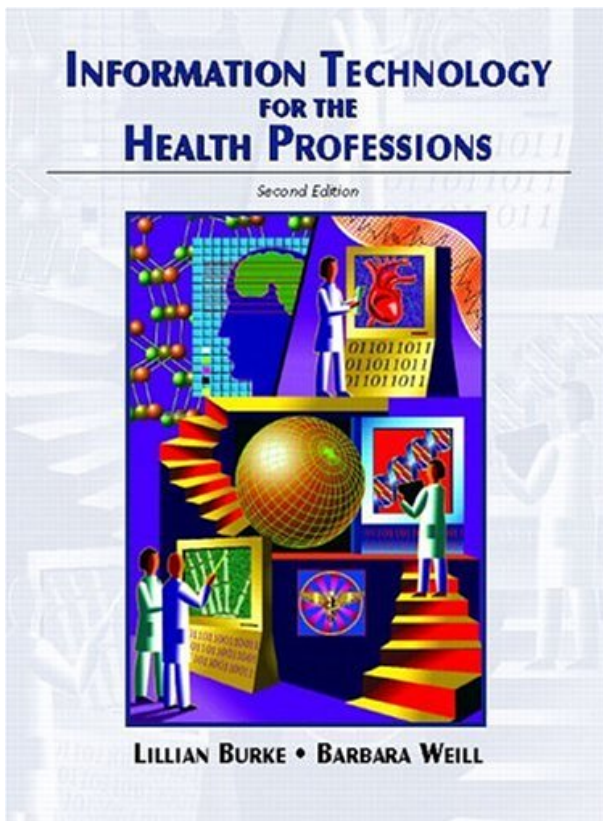

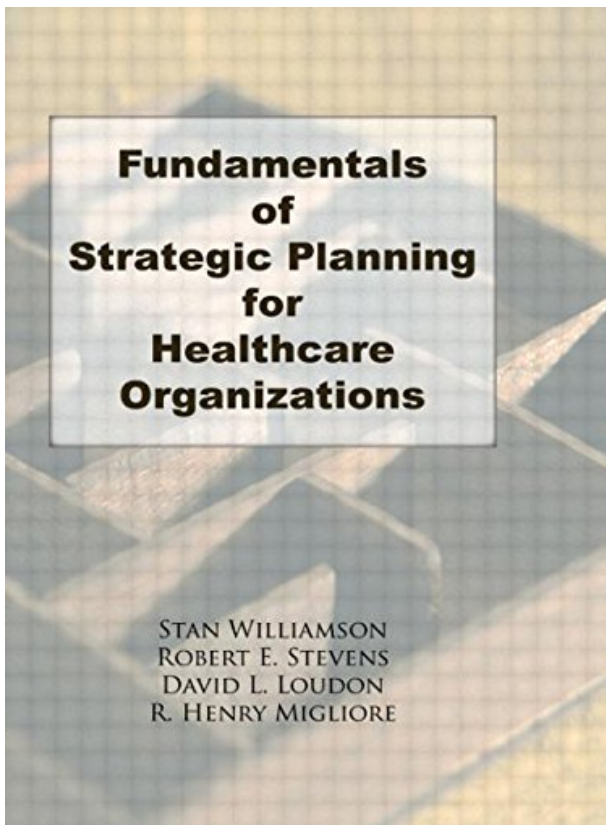
Information Technology For The Health Professions

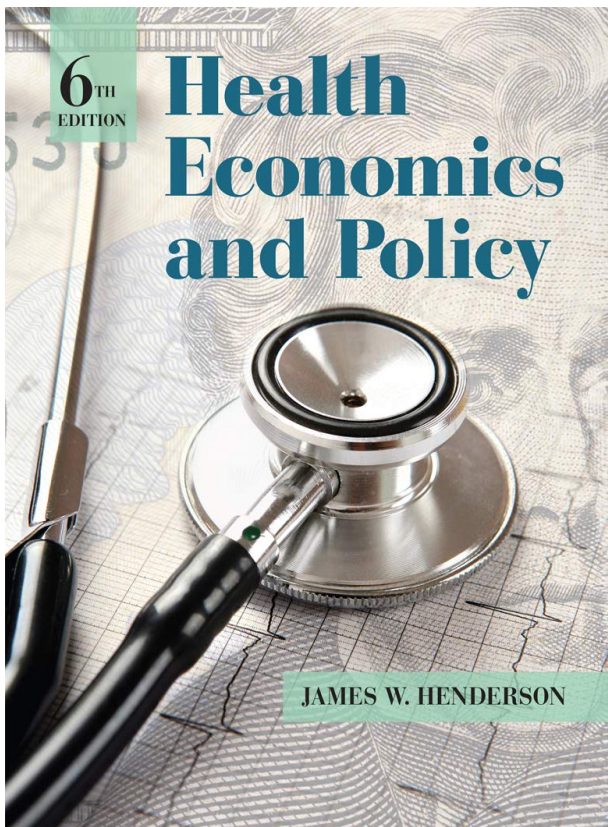

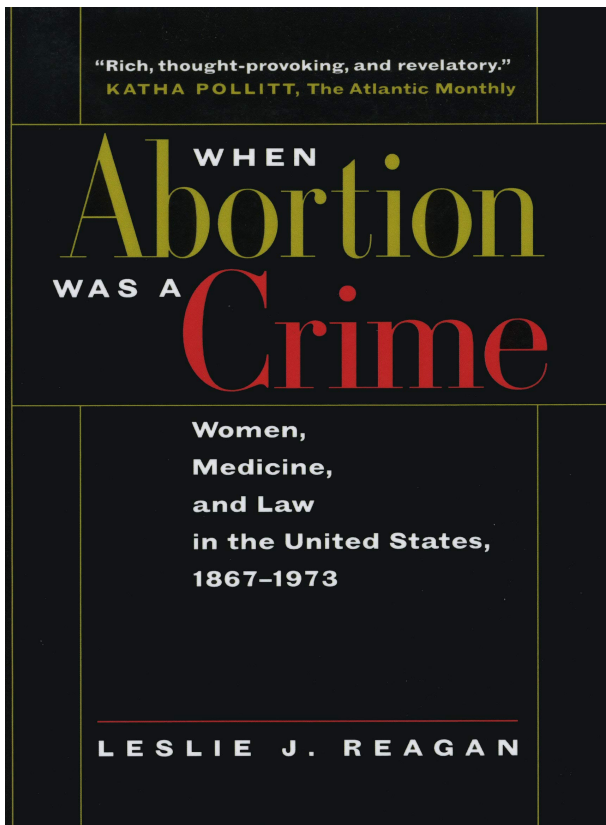
Health Economics and Policy

Leslie Reagan traces the practice and policing of abortion, which although illegal was nonetheless widely available, but always with threats for both doctor and patient.
