Over 97% of all flower rich grasslands have been lost in the UK since the 1930's.

Wildflower meadows and pastures are vitally important habitats for a wide range of flora, fauna and fungi. In an increasingly fragmented landscape, it is vital that these are restored and maintained.

**This project aims to help local field owners to re-establish and conserve their grasslands and to maintain the rich variety of plants and animals they support.**

These patches of managed grasslands will form a network of wildflower-rich routes or 'stepping stones', providing important habitat for bees, butterflies and other insect pollinators, enabling wildlife to move across the landscape. On Llŷn, these grassland areas are especially important for foraging Chough, invertebrates such as the rare Large Mason bee and a group of grassland fungi known as Waxcaps.

- Suggestions of management options to
  1. maintain species richness or
  2. enhance or recreate meadow flora
- Suggest grant applications to help with management or restoration, if available.
- Organise site visits to enjoy wildflower meadows and nature friendly projects on the Llŷn.
- Connect you with others who can share knowledge of managing land for nature.
- Provide information about local and national projects and how to get involved.
