SYNOPSIS

On 12-09-07 at approximately 1310 hrs, the Colorado Springs Police Department Communications Center was notified of an active gunman situation at the New Life Church, 11025 Voyager Parkway. Investigation revealed that the suspect, Matthew Murray arrived at the church in his 1992 Red Toyota, parking in the southeast parking lot. Murray began firing an assault weapon striking numerous individuals in the parking lot. The victims are:

RACHEL WORKS 01-26-91(DECEASED) STEPHANIE WORKS 01-28-89 (DECEASED) DAVID WORKS 09-03-56 (INJURED) JUDY PURCELL 04-19-67 (INJURED)

Murray then entered the New Life Church Worship Center via the east doors and fired numerous shots within the main hallway. LARRY BOURBONNIAS 04-26-48, was injured by the gunfire.

While inside the hallway, Murray was engaged by armed New Life Church security officer, Jeanne Assam. Assam fired numerous shots, striking Murray several times. Murray died at the scene of a self-inflicted gunshot wound to the head.

Gysin, 1247), was enroute back to my sector (4A10) after call at the King Soopers at Fillmore and Centennial when I heard dispatch ask for any extra duty officer still in the area of the New Life Church. Dispatch also aired that there was an active gunman on the premises.

Sqt. L. Herbert had advised the 0600 line-up of the shooting in Arvada at an organization affiliated with New Life Church, so I assumed the call was not a prank and began to respond to New Life code 3.

As Larrived, Officers B. Birch, C. Ingebretson, and G. Darress were also pulling up on-scene. We determined that no officers had vet entered the tent area and, because we were unsure of the whereabouts of the gunman, we swept the tent and located approximately 20-30 people hidden in the upper level.

We escorted them downstairs, at first into a main-level office where we could watch all areas of approach from inside the building and the front lobby. Several minutes later, I heard on the radio that one possible shooter was dead in the worship center next to the tent.

Officers Birch, Ingebretson, and Darress left the tent building and I stayed with the church members located in that building. I stood outside one set of lobby doors and instructed one of the New Life armed guards to stand at the other. We directed church members evacuating the parking lot area into the tent and directed them to the sanctuary area inside.

An usher advised me that he had seen a white male driving a tan SUV firing into the front doors of the worship center next to the tent. Another member stated he had seen a male throwing smoke bombs from a red Toyota. I directed both towards Ofc. Chacon, who had arrived to take witness statements.

I then took a post outside the tent watching the north exterior doors, directing witnesses and church members. inside and discouraging potential witnesses from leaving. I stayed at this post until approximately 1700 hours. when Sqt. Lebeau requested that I assist witnesses who had already been interviewed back to their cars.

I escorted approximately 15 groups of people back to their cars, searching the ground under and around the cars for suspicious devices prior to allowing any of them to approach their vehicles.

At approximately 1930 hours, I was instructed by Sgt. Lebeau to go home, but was requested by Lt. J. Anderson to return at 0530 hours the following day.

I returned to work at 0530 hours on 12/10/07 and responded to the New Life Church. Upon arrival, I met with Sat. T. Stankey, who organized a grid search of the south parking lot outside the tent and building perimeters. I participated in this search, then was directed to return to regular duty at approximately 0800 hours.

No further at this time.

as to what he meant by that statement. Collette then informed them about the shooting earlier in the day in Arvada at the Youth with a mission center, and that he (Collette) saw a male matching the general physical description of the shooter in that case sitting in Collette's seating area. Collette said that he called in security who searched the male; it was determined that the male was not the same as the shooter in the Arvada incident. Mr. Reynolds said that it was not unusual to have additional security personnel at New Life on shift after an incident such as the Arvada one.

Mr. Reynolds said that shortly thereafter, he and his wife left the church through the south doors near the "TAG Chapel" and that while they were walking near the exit, they saw what appeared to be gray or white smoke near a snow bank. He thought at first that it was a car engine, but then realized that there was no car nearby. He then saw several children near the snow bank, and assumed that the kids were playing with a smoke bomb. He then saw another man (no other info, but he assumed that it was another church member) kicking snow on whatever was producing the smoke, in an effort to put it out. Assuming that the situation was handled, he and his wife walked to their car in the southwest parking lot. He said that at the time they left New Life, there were still about 150-200 people left in the church.

He said that he and his wife walked to their car parked in the southwest parking lot, which they described as being near the intersection of Highway 83 and Interquest. They walked out of the south doors to get to their vehicle. He said that they got into the car, and were driving out of the parking lot when they heard a series of what they described as "popping sounds." They did not immediately recognize the sounds as gunshots, and in fact, believed at first that they were having car problems. Mr. Reynolds said that he was driving, and that he was looking towards the playground area when his attention was drawn to a small white in color car which was "all by itself" with both doors open. The doors of the vehicle were open, and it appeared as if a vehicle occupant was lying on the ground in the snow, possibly in pain, hiding from something, or "wrestling". The witness was uncertain exactly what was going on with the vehicle and the occupant at the time due to the glare from the snow and the sun.

At about that same time, Mrs. Reynolds saw a male in a trench coat, possibly black in color, standing near the entrance to the "tent" which they described as the youth building. She said that the male was "tall" but could not give any other description. I would note that this victim was extremely upset and visibly shaken. She said that she saw the male had a rifle of some sort and saw him shooting into the tent doors. Both she and Mr. Reynolds saw the male fire the weapon into the air. At that point, they lost sight of him as they were driving out of the parking lot to the north. Mrs. Reynolds dialed 911 from her cell phone at 1311 hours, but was unable to get through at the time. They later saw a news report asking for witnesses to call CSPD.

Mr. Reynolds said that they were 70-80 yards from the shooter at the closest point. He said that the shooter was about 40 yards from the car with the open doors, and that the shooter was about 25 feet from the entrance of the tent at the time that they saw him.

I concluded the interview at that time, after providing my contact information and encouraging them to call me if they remembered anything else.

On 12-09-2007 at approximately 1310 HRS: Officer Chacon and I had just completed and cleared our extra-duty traffic control assignment at New Life Church(11005 Voyager Pkwy) and were proceeding southbound on HWY 83, returning our marked patrol cruisers to the Falcon substation, when dispatch aired a shooting in progress at New Life Church. We immediately returned, Code 3, to New Life Church. We noticed several individuals running across Voyager Pkwy, which we temporarily stopped, who indicated that they were running away from a shooter in the main building. We parked our cruisers outside of the northwest entrance to the main sanctuary. As we approached the main doors, we were directed by numerous individuals to the east end of the main building. Officer Chacon and I ran along the north exterior of the main building to the east end of the building. We observed a van in the east parking lot that appeared to have the windows shot out. We also observed that there were several El Paso County Sherriff's Deputies around the van. We also observed that there were several spent casings in the roadway and along the sidewalk. We also observed a spent AR-15 magazine on the sidewalk outside of the east doors. We also observed that there were several bullet holes through the glass doors of the east entrance. At that time, Officer Chacon, an unidentified El Paso County Sherriff's Sqt and I decided to make entrance to the east doors of the main building to pursue the active shooter. We proceeded westbound in the east hallway until we came upon several unidentified individuals in the first hallway, to our right, that we encountered, approximately 25 yards to the west of the east doors. We noticed that there was an apparently deceased white male suspect lying on the hallway floor. He appeared to be armed with a semi-automatic assault rifle, which was strapped to the front of his body, and a black semi-automatic handoun which was lying on the floor to the right of the body. He also had a large backpack with unknown items, BDU pants with unknown items and appeared to be wearing a ballistic vest.

Officers Doug Smook, Eric Price and I were directed by Sgt L. Herbert to form a search team and clear the upper floor of the main building of any possible additional suspects. We proceeded to clear the upper floor of the main building and retrieved several individuals who were hiding in various rooms.

I then proceeded to join a TEU search team, since I had a working knowledge of the interior layout of the church from numerous previous extra-duty assignments worked at New Life Church. The TEU search team was directed by Sgt. R. Sheppard. We proceeded to clear the basement and first floor areas of the main building. Upon completion of the search, I was released from further duties and responded to the Tent Annex of New Life. Church (east parking lot) where I remained until being released from the scene by Sgt. P. LeBeau at approximately 1930 HRS.

I then responded to the Falcon substation and completed this supplement.



SCENE DESCRIPTION

The New Life Church Complex is located at the northeast corner of InterQuest Parkway and Voyager Parkway. The complex is bordered on the north by New Life Drive, on the east by a private driveway (between New Life and PPCC campus), on the south by InterQuest Parkway and the west by Voyager Parkway. There are numerous entrances into the Complex from all four sides.

- "Tent" located to the northeast of the Worship Center



EXTERIOR SHOOTING SCENE

The first shooting scene is an outdoor shooting scene located in the parking lot south and southwest of the Tent Building. Detective would note that this parking lot is located on the northeast side of the New Life Church complex. This shooting scene extends from this parking lot southeast of the Tent to the northeast entry door of the Worship Center. (Note: this photo is oriented with the top as north)



The distance between the northeast entrance of the worship center and the southwest entrance of the tent is approximately 50'. There is a driveway running northwest to southeast between the two buildings. Detective did observe in this driveway area numerous expended rifle shell casings that appear similar to .223 caliber. Numerous similar shell casings were located in the parking lot approximately 50' southeast of the "tent". These casings were scattered in an area southeast from approximately the center line of the Tent to the northeast curb of the Worship Center.

Detective's were advised that possible improvised explosive devices had been located on the suspect and in the area surrounding the New Life Church complex. It was also believed that these devices could possibly be in the suspect vehicle. Due to this possibility, no extensive searches were conducted of the victim vehicle or suspect vehicle at this time. Detective's did however; assign CSPD lab investigators Brian Annen and Dan Dilts to photograph that scene. Additionally Technician Annen did photograph footprints in the snow at the driver's door of the suspect vehicle. After photographing that scene and prior to sunset Technician Dilts was directed to go up in the CSPD helicopter and photograph the New Life Church complex from the air.





Placard #F is a portion of the driver's side windshield blade.

When I initially arrived on scene, I saw that the victim's vehicle was parked on the northeast side of the main worship hall. This vehicle was predominantly facing in a northwesterly direction. I saw that the vehicle was running with the ignition on and the headlights were also on this vehicle. Examining the front portion of the vehicle, I saw that there was damage to the front of the vehicle as a result of gunfire. There appears to be several impacts to the front windshield. I would note the suspect was firing at this vehicle and there appears to be at least two impacts to the front windshield of the vehicle. One of the impacts actually damaged the driver's side windshield blade causing it to break and fall in front of the vehicle.

Examining the right front passenger door, I found that it was open. The window was up. I noticed there were two distinct impact holes in the window of this vehicle. There are sliding doors on both sides of this victim's vehicle. This is a station wagon type van. Both the driver's side rear door and passenger door were standing open upon my arrival. I did not notice any impact marks in the driver's door that was open. The window was also in tact as well. The deceased female was found lying in the back portion of this vehicle. She was covered with some sort of a white blanket. The only thing that I could see was her legs and feet that were extended from out underneath the blanket. Her head was facing in a northerly direction with her head up against the passenger side of the vehicle.

At 9:07 p.m., members of the El Paso County Coroner's Office arrived on scene to remove the victim's body.

Detective was advised to respond to the New Life Church to assist with the investigation. I was further advised at least three individuals had been shot and the suspect was possibly down.

RESPONSE TO THE POLICE OPERATIONS CENTER:

12/09/07 1335 hours appx.

While en route to the Police Operations Center to retrieve my police vehicle, I was contacted by Sgt. Jeff Jensen, CSPD Violent Crimes/Homicide Unit. Sgt. Jensen requested that I respond to the scene with the Violent Crimes command post.

12/09/07 1400 hours appx.

I arrived at the Police Operations Center where I did retrieve my equipment, as well as the Violent Crimes command post.

ARRIVAL AT NEW LIFE CHURCH:

12/09/07 1435 hours appx.

I arrived on scene at the New Life Church located at 11005 Voyager Parkway. Upon approaching New Life Church from Interquest Parkway, detective would note that Interquest Parkway was barricaded by police vehicles. I was then directed to respond to the north side of the New Life Church where command post had been set up. Once I arrived in that area I was directed to a building at the northeast portion of the New Life Complex. This building is identified as a gray "tent". Detective was advised that command had been set up inside this tent.

Upon arrival at the New Life Church Complex, Detective did note extensive CSPD, CSFD and other first responder activity in the area. I was advised by Officers manning the police barricade that the scene was not yet secure and that it is unknown if additional suspects were in the area.

CONTACT WITH SGT. JEFF JENSEN, VIOLENT CRIMES/HOMICIDE UNIT

12/09/07 1445 hours appx.

Upon arrival at the "tent" at approximately 1445 hours, I did contact Sgt. Jeff Jensen. Sgt. Jensen advised this detective that on this date at approximately 1300 hours, an unknown individual had entered the New Life Church and shot at least three individuals. Sgt. Jensen advised that all three individuals had been transported to area hospitals, one in critical condition and two others with less serious wounds.

Sgt. Jensen advised that the shootings appeared to have occurred in numerous locations around the New Life Church complex. At this time Detective was advised that members of the Colorado Springs Police Department, Tactical Enforcement Unit, as well as the El Paso County Sheriff's Department, Tactical Enforcement Unit, were in the process of "sweeping" various buildings on the complex for possibly a second suspect. Sgt. Jensen did advise it appeared that one suspect was down inside what is described as the worship center of the New Life Church complex. The suspect was believed to have been shot by an armed New Life security guard.

I was advised that there were possibly hundreds of church goers still inside the buildings, many hiding or taking refuge from the shooting situation. These individuals were being contacted by the TEU units conducting the sweeps, and were being escorted from their hiding places to the tent for interviews and debriefings. I was further advised that all available members of CSPD Investigative Units (other than Violent Crimes/Homicide Investigators) were being activated to respond for the interview of victims/witnesses. Additional agencies that were responding for assistance with interviews were the Denver and Colorado Springs offices of the FBI, Denver and Colorado Springs offices of ATF and Fourth Judicial District Attorney's Office Investigators.

It was also advised that on this date, shortly after midnight, a shooting resulting in two deaths had occurred in Arvada Colorado at the offices of Youth With A Mission (YWAM). New Life Church also maintains an affiliation with YWAM, and there is a strong possibility that Arvada and New Life shootings may be related.

ASSIGNMENT OF SCENE INVESTIGATION

12/09/17 1510 hours appx.

Detective was assigned by Sgt. Jensen to direct the scene investigation for this incident. Due to the scope of this scene, Detective Peter Quick, Detective Derek Graham and CSPD Crime Scene Technicians Saviano, Annen and Dilts, were assigned to assist with this portion of the investigation.



I would note that with the exception of the Tent building, no other structures had yet been secured. As a result, the actual scene investigation and documentation did not begin at this time. Detective did request that Technician Saviano photo document the northwest parking lots of the complex, to include any and all vehicles present. There was no indication at this time that any shooting had taken place in this area; however I was advised that a possible smoke bomb or other similar device had been deployed by a suspect at the main northwest doors of the Worship Center.

SCENE DESCRIPTION

The New Life Church Complex is located at the northeast corner of InterQuest Parkway and Voyager Parkway. The complex is bordered on the north by New Life Drive, on the east by a private driveway (between New Life and PPCC campus), on the south by InterQuest Parkway and the west by Voyager Parkway. There are numerous entrances into the Complex from all four sides.


- World Prayer Center located at the northeast corner of InterQuest and Voyager

Detective would note that this parking lot is located on the northeast side of the New Life Church complex. The distance between the northeast entrance of the worship center and the southwest entrance of the tent is approximately 50'. There is a driveway running northwest to southeast between the two buildings. Detective did observe in this driveway area numerous expended rifle shell casings that appear similar to .223 caliber. Numerous similar shell casings were located in the parking lot approximately 50' southeast of the "tent". These casings were scattered in an area southeast from approximately the center line of the Tent to the northeast curb of the Worship Center,

VICTIM VEHICLE - 2005 WHITE TOYOTA VAN COLO 595LRZ

Two vehicles of note were located in the exterior shooting scene. The first vehicle is light colored van Colorado license #595LRZ with the engine running and the doors open. This vehicle license lists to:



Detective had been advised that possible improvised explosive devices had been located on the suspect and in the area surrounding the New Life Church complex. It was also believed that these devices could possibly be in the suspect vehicle. Due to this possibility, no extensive searches were conducted of the victim vehicle or suspect vehicle at this time. Detective did however; assign CSPD lab investigators Brian Annen and Dan Dilts to photograph that scene. Additionally Technician Annen did photograph footprints in the snow at the driver's door of the suspect vehicle. After photographing that scene and prior to sunset Technician Dilts was directed to go up in the CSPD helicopter and photograph the New Life Church complex from the air.

CONTACT WITH OFFICER JOSEPH WYATT

Detective would note that at approximately 1530 hours, I was advised by patrol officer Joseph Wyatt that a deceased female had been located in the victim van previously mentioned. Officer Wyatt advised that patrol officers on the perimeter and scene security details had been instructed to examine their areas of responsibility for possible IED's. While examining the area around the victim van, Officer Wyatt observed on the floor of the back seat of the van, covered with a blanket, a deceased female.

Detective, per a request by Sgt. Chuck Rabideau, did examine the victim to obtain a description for possible identification. I approached the passenger side of the van and did note on the floorboard behind the front seats, covered by a light colored blanket, the body of a deceased female. Upon moving the blanket I noted that the female had dark brown hair, appeared to be approximately 18 years of age and was wearing a yellow ski type jacket and blue jeans. I further observed blood on the victim's head and face, as well as beneath the victim's head. I did not further examine the victim for injuries. I did observe a possible medical lead on the victim's right abdomen, evidence of medical attention.

Due to the fact that the exterior scene had not yet been searched by EOD for possible IED's, no further examination was conducted at this time. Investigators did subsequently determine that initial responding EMS had examined this female victim, who was later identified as Stephanie Works, and that she had been pronounced deceased on their arrival.

Detective would note that this information was subsequently passed on to Sgt. Rabideau. Detective would note that no personnel on scene had been made aware by EMT of a deceased individual in that van.

INFORMATION REGARDING ADDITIONAL DAMAGED VEHICLE:

12/09/07 1703 hours appx.

Detective was advised of the vehicle possibly sustaining gunfire damage. This vehicle was currently parked at the Pikes Peak Community College. Detective directed Detective Pete Quick and Technician Saviano to respond to that vehicle and examine it for any ballistic evidence. For further information regarding that examination, see supplement by Detective Quick.

CONTACT WITH COMMANDER ROD WALKER

12/09/07 1725 hours appx.

I was contacted by Commander Rod Walker who was responsible for the clearing the Worship Center and making that scene safe for further investigation. Commander Walker advised that members of the EOD were preparing to search the suspect and during the course of that search, the suspect would be moved, backpack removed and contents examined. Due to the disruption of the crime scene, Commander Walker suggested that photographs of the suspect be taken prior to the search. Officer Dan Carter CSPD EOD Technician did enter the scene and obtain digital photographs of the suspect and scene around the suspect, prior to any alterations. The photographs were subsequently down loaded onto a CD and placed into evidence by this Detective.

EXTERIOR SCENE INVESTIGATION

The exterior scene was investigated by Detectives Derek Graham and Pete Quick, with Lab Technicians Saviano and Dilts. This scene consisted of the suspect and victim vehicles, as well as expended shell casings and other items of evidence in the parking lot. The exterior scene continued to the northeast entrance doors of the Worship Center. For details regarding this investigation, see supplements by Detective Graham and Quick and Technicians Dilts and Saviano.

INITIAL ENTRY INTO THE WORSHIP CENTER:

12/09/07 1820 hours appx.

I was contacted by Commander Rod Walker who advised that EOD personnel had removed the backpack from the suspect inside the worship center and had cleared the contents from that backpack. Detective would note that the Worship Center was still in the process of being swept by TEU teams, and was not yet secure. Commander Walker requested that I respond to the northeast entrance with a lab technician and photograph the scene of the suspect, as well as the items that were recovered/removed from his person. CSPD Lab Technician Dan Dilts and I did respond via the northeast entrance of the worship center down the central hallway, approximately 80' to a hallway leading to the northwest. It was at that location the suspect was found against the northeast wall primarily lying on his back.

Detective did observe the backpack had been removed from this individual and numerous firearm magazines were located on the floor. Detective was advised these magazines did come from the person and the backpack of the suspect.

Also at this time Sgt. Larry Clayton did recover from the suspect's left front pants pocket a Toyota key. Detective would note that Sgt. Clayton had requested a key for the suspect vehicle so that vehicle could be cleared for any explosive devices. The key was subsequently recovered by Sgt. Clayton and left with the suspect vehicle upon its clearance. Tissue paper and a cell phone were also removed from the victim's left front pants pocket by Sgt. Larry Clayton when the vehicle key was recovered. These items were left with the suspect to be collected during the scene investigation.

REMOVAL OF SMOKE BOMBS FROM SUSPECT:

12/09/07 1930 hours appx.

I did contact Officer Steven Pugsley of the Colorado Springs Police Department. Officer Pugsley advised that at approximately 1920 hours at the request of Commander Walker, he did recover from the area of the suspect

one smoke bomb that was in the hallway near an orange traffic cone approximately 15' to 20' from the suspect. This smoke bomb had not been activated. Additionally, Officer Pugsley did recover three unactivated smoke bombs in a Ziploc bag that had been recovered from the suspect's backpack.

INVESTIGATION OF SHOOTING SCENE IN THE WORSHIP CENTER:

12/09/07 2040 hours appx.

Search of the worship center was completed by Tactical Enforcement Units. At that time the building was deemed secure. Detective would note that I then assumed control of the scene for the purpose of scene investigation. Upon assuming control of the scene, myself and Technician Annen conducted a brief walk through to determine the scope of the scene and what assets would be needed. Technician Annen then began to photograph the scene prior to any further investigation.

12/09/07 2100 hours appx.

I did escort into the scene the following individuals: Sgt. Jeff Jensen, Lt. Mark Smith, Technician Frank Negley and Detective Derek Graham. Detective would note that while escorting into the scene no items of evidence were touched, altered, removed or otherwise destroyed.

NORTHEAST ENTRANCE - WORSHIP CENTER FRONT DOORS AND FOYER:

Upon approach of the worship center northeast entrance main doors detective observed numerous projectile impacts into these doors. Additionally detective would note that these doors are located approximately 50' to the southwest of the "tent" building. The entrance at the northeast end of the Worship Center consists of five metal and glass doors that open into a foyer area. Each door has two panes of glass, one upper and one lower. From southeast to northwest, the following ballistic evidence was observed on the doors.


- Projectile impact into the extreme right edge door #1 approximately 6" above the door handle locking mechanism; this is a penetrating projectile impact and shows a directionality from the exterior to the interior
- Located in door #2 extreme left edge at the top edge of the bottom pane of glass is a projectile impact from the exterior to the interior. Detective would note that this impact fractures the glass and the projectile appears to continue into the fover area
- Located in door #2 in this bottom pane of glass, top edge, near the right side is an additional projectile
 impact from the exterior to the interior; after entering the glass this projectile impact then enters the crash
 bar located on the inside of the door
- A projectile impact is located in door #3, extreme left edge at the top frame of the bottom pane of glass and shows a directionality of exterior to the interior

- Also in door #3 located in approximately the center of the door between the top and bottom pane of glass projectile impact from exterior to interior
- Located in approximately the center of the top pane of glass door #3 projectile impact showing directionality of exterior to interior
- Also located in door #3 a projectile impact at the extreme right edge approximately 8" to 10" above the door handle mechanism and to the right of the top pane of glass shows directionality of exterior to the interior
- Doors #4 and #5 do not exhibit any projectile damage



A total of seven projectile impacts were observed into the exterior doors of the Worship Center. All projectile impacts were from the exterior to the interior.

EXAMINATION OF THE INTERIOR FOYER DOORS

The five interior doors were then examined for projectile impacts. Impacts observed from southeast to northwest are:


- Door #1 does not exhibit any projectile impacts.
- Door #2 both panes of glass are fractured. The bottom pane does show evidence of a projectile, projectile fragment or exterior door fragment. Additional impacts are located on the inside of this door, however, it was undetermined if it is a projectile, projectile fragments or fragments of doors. A projectile impact is located in the upper pane of door #2 centered towards the top and shows a directionality of exterior to the interior with additional impacts located approximately 2" below the top of the rim of the top window frame, however, it is undetermined if these are due to a projectile or fragments.
- Door #3 shows both the upper and lower windowpanes are fractured. Numerous holes located in the bottom frame, one possible projectile impact, the others are smaller and appear to be either projectile, projectile fragments or other door or glass fragments coming from the exterior doors. A projectile impact is located in the center of the door between the upper and lower windowpanes. This is a penetrating impact from the exterior to the interior. The upper pane of glass shows numerous fractures which appear to be from projectile fragments or other door or glass fragments. There is a projectile fragment at the exterior to the interior. This fractures the pane of glass and then strikes the interior of the door at the window frame.
- Located on the right side of door #3 towards the top are two other projectile impacts into the metal door, one of which appears to be a projectile impact which was slightly below the top of the window frame and the other which is slightly above the top of the window frame which appears to be a projectile fragment. These show a directionality from the exterior to the interior.
- Door #4 exhibits a shattered upper pane of glass. Possible projectile or projectile fragments are located
 on the right edge of door #4 and a possible projectile or projectile fragment in the door upper window
 pane.

Detective did observe on the carpeted floor of the foyer, several small projectile fragments which will subsequently be recovered by CSPD lab technicians. Additional projectile fragments are located at the extreme right edge of the interior foyer doors.

View of the interior doors, from inside of the Worship Center


MAIN HALL DESCRIPTION

Upon entering into the main hall via the northeast entry doors, one enters a great hall that runs in a northeast to southwest direction. Numerous doors and hallways run off of this hallway. The hallway is approximately 100 yards in length, and ends in a central lobby of the Worship Center. Immediately upon entering this hallway from the northeast entry doors, detective did observe what appeared to be projectile fragments scattered about the tiled floor. Detective would note that there are numerous items of trash, to include water bottles, etc. These were left by responding Tactical Enforcement Unit personnel who were in the process of searching this building for numerous hours.

Immediately upon entry of the northeast doors, to the right is a short hallway leading to a flight of stairs leading to the second floor of this building. Per signs, this set of stairs lead to the Activity Center. Detective did observe in this area, and along the right wall several pieces of paper on the floor. These pieces of paper were marking expended rifle casings that appear similar to .223 casings, and all were located within approximately 15 feet of the northeast entry doors. Continuing in a south/westerly direction detective did observe along the right wall area additional shell casings which appear to be similar to .223 caliber.

Approximately 25 to 30 yards inside the great hall is a hallway intersection, with a hall leading to the northwest. Detective observes in this hallway intersection an orange traffic cone. Detective would note it is at this traffic cone that the single smoke grenade was located and subsequently recovered by Officer Pugsley. It was also at this area that 9mm shell casings are located on both the right and left sides of the hallway, continuing to the

southwest. Per information received from Detective Mike Happ, these 9mm casings are in the area that Security Guard Jeanne Assam fired on the suspect.

Continuing in a southwesterly direction toward the central lobby, investigators did locate additional 9mm shell casings along the left wall, and numerous projectile impacts in the right walls, fixtures and columns. Additional projectile impacts and fragments are observed at the end of the hallway and in the central lobby. These items will be discussed further later in this report.

DESCRIPTION OF THE SUSPECT:

As previously mentioned the suspect is located in a northwest hallway off the central northeast to southwest hallway. The suspect is located about 5' to the northwest of the central hallway and is lying primarily on his back with his head to the northeast and his feet to the southwest. The suspect is described as a white male, short brown hair, wearing a gray jacket, a black ballistic type vest, black pants with kneepads and black boots. The suspect has one black glove on his right hand and his left hand is ungloved.

Located at the suspect's right arm is a blue in color device, possibly a smoke bomb, that does say "superior smoke #3C" with a green fuse protruding from the top. Also located on the suspect's right arm is a black in color assault type rifle. Located at the suspect's left arm are numerous firearm magazines, to include rifle and handgun magazines.

Located at the suspect's left hip is a black in color T-Mobile cellular phone. An additional magazine is located at the suspect's right hip. Located at the suspect's right foot is a pistol magazine. A black semi-automatic handoun is located in a nylon type holster on the suspect's right thigh.

Approximately 4' to the northwest of the suspect is a black in color semi-automatic pistol. I also located in this area an expended 9mm shell casing. Located in the wall behind and to the left the victim are what appear to be projectile impacts. These projectile impacts show a directionality of southwest to northeast generally, and appear at this point to be attributed to the security guard who, according to Detective Mike Happ, did approach this suspect and fired upon him from the southwest to the northeast.

Located approximately 5' to the southeast of the suspect is a black backpack which appears to have the shoulder straps and belly strap cut. Near the backpack are approximately 20 firearm magazines, to include rifle and handgun magazines. Detective was advised that these items had been removed from the backpack by EOD personnel.

Additional description of the suspect and the items recovered will be made later in this report.

Detective would note that this scene was videotaped and photographed by CSPD Lab Technicians Annen and Negley. Additionally, the scene was investigated by myself and Detective M. Happ.

EVIDENCE ITEMS AT THE SCENE OF THE SUSPECT

After photo-documenting the scene, placards were used to identify various types of evidence. The following items of evidence are identified by the following placards.

- Placard A represents the deceased male suspect along with various firearm magazines on and next to his body, a cellular phone, etc.
- Placard B represents an expended projectile near the suspect's head
- Placard C represents the assault type rifle
- Placard D represents the black semi-automatic handgun
- Placard E represents an expended 9mm shell casing near the semi-automatic handgun
- Placard F represents the a large area of firearm magazines removed from the backpack
- Placard G represents the black backpack

12/09/07 2238 hours appx.

Officer Pugsley did recover the smoke bomb from the area of the victim's right shoulder.

EL PASO COUNTY CORONER ARRIVAL

12/09/07 2300 hours

The El Paso County Coroner's Office Deputy Coroner Rob Stevenson responded to the worship center to retrieve the suspect's body. The suspect was pronounced deceased at 2300 hrs. During to the recovery of the deceased, Detective was able to more closely examine the firearms on and near the suspect.

In the suspect's right thigh holster is a black Beretta, semi-automatic pistol, serial #PY04007, a possible .40 caliber.

The semi-automatic pistol located to the north of the victim is a Springfield Arms 9mm, serial #US826214. Detective would note a possible projectile impact on the left front barrel, as evidenced by possible copper jacketing imbedded into the grooves.

The assault type rifle is described as a Bushmaster, caliber .223, serial #BFI476914. Detective would note that this rifle safety is in the fire position. There is evidence of possible projectile impact damage in the rear stock and on the barrel. Blood is also evident on this firearm.

Upon recovery of the victim detective would note that all ammunition, magazines, etc., were recovered and removed from the suspect prior to removal by the coroner's office. Numerous additional magazines, as well as a smoke grenade, were located in the tactical vest.

Detective would note that item #G, the backpack, was recovered and transported with the suspect by the coroner's office.

Additional firearm magazines were located in the suspect's pants cargo pockets. Located in the suspect's right front pants pocket is a red paperback book titled "Book of the Law". It also appears that in this book are pages of personal writings.

EXAMINATION OF PROJECTILE IMPACTS IN WALL BY SUSPECT

Located to the northeast of the suspect is room #141. Detective had observed at least two projectile impacts into the wall behind the suspect leading into room #141. Detective observed corresponding projectile exit points within room #141 and two expended projectiles were located within room #141. The projectile impacts and exits as well as projectiles in room #141 were photographed and documented by lab technicians. The projectiles were subsequently recovered by technicians.

EVIDENCE IDENTIFICATION CONTINUED:

After the suspect was removed from the scene, items of evidence (A through F) were recovered by lab technicians. The remainder of the scene was then examined for items of evidence. The following additional items of evidence were identified by the use lettered placards.

Evidence item H: An expended 9mm shell casing located in the central hallway just to the southeast of the

suspect's location

Evidence item I: An expended rifle type shell casing located in the central hallway to the northeast of the

suspect location

Evidence item J: An expended rifle type shell casing located approximately halfway between the entry doors

and where the suspect was located in the center hallway

Evidence item K: An expended rifle type shell casing located approximately 15' southwest of the entry doors,

central hallway

Evidence item L: An expended rifle type shell casing located approximately 10' southwest of the entrance

doors

Evidence item M: An expended rifle type shell casing located approximately 10' southwest of the entrance

doors

All of the above items were located to the northwest of the centerline of the central hallway.

Evidence item N: An expended 9mm shell casing located on the southeast side of the hallway at the intersection of the hall where the suspect was located

Evidence item O: An expended 9mm shell casing located on the southeast side of the central hallway at the intersection of the hall where the suspect was located

Evidence item P: A blue Bic type cigarette lighter located against the northwest wall of the central hall, just to the southwest of the hallway where the suspect was located

Evidence item Q: An expended 9mm shell casing located against the southeast wall of the central hall, southwest of the suspect location

Evidence items R, S, T, U, V and W: 6 expended 9mm shell casings located midway between the east entry doors and the center lobby area southeast wall of central hall at the intersection of a southeast hallway

Evidence item X: Is a set of keys located approximately 25' southwest of the northeast doors, against the southeast wall. The owner of the keys is unknown

Further examination of the 9mm shell casings revealed that the 10 casings recovered from the central hall had the same head stamp. These shell casings are located in the areas that the security guard is reported to have fired at the suspect.

The 9mm shell casing found to the northwest of the suspect had a different head stamp. Detective was further advised that after the suspect was downed, witness Larry Bourbonaisse did retrieve the suspects 9mm pistol and clear a "stove pipe" jam. This casing is believed to have been the stove pipe from the suspect's weapon.

PROJECTILE IMPACTS:

After documentation and measurement of items of physical evidence, investigators proceeded to examine possible projectile impacts within the central hallway area. Detective would note that numerous projectiles and projectile fragments did enter through the exterior northeast doors and then the interior foyer doors. The projectile impacts into the interior foyer doors do indicate fragmentation of projectiles or fragments of glass and doors as there were many more holes and fractures evidenced than the projectile impacts into the exterior doors.

- Approximately 35' west of the east doors on the ceiling is a large circular dropdown in the ceiling.
 Recessed inside the circle are hallway lights. Detective observed projectile impact in the northeastern
 edge of this circular dropdown with the projectile passing through this portion of the circle and into the
 interior. A corresponding impact is located on the southwest side of this circle; however, at this time it
 does not appear a projectile actually entered the western portion of the dropdown. No projectile was
 located on the floor or in the area. Directionality is northeast to southwest
- Approximately 82' east of the east doors is the aforementioned northwest hallway which runs off the central hallway. This hallway is where the victim is located. Immediately inside this hallway on the

northeast wall are several projectile impacts in the area of where the suspect was lying. One impact demonstrates a possible projectile still within the hole and two others appear to be perforating. It was during the examination of the interior of this wall (which would be room #141) that it was determined that these two projectile impacts did pass through the wall and the projectiles were subsequently located and recovered from inside room #141.

- Approximately 87" southwest of the northeast entrance against the northwest wall is a brown in color pillar. This pillar is at the southwest side of the aforementioned northwest/southeast hallway where the suspect was located. There are two projectile impacts in this pillar traveling in an east/northeasterly direction. Detective would note that this projectile impact does enter on the southwest side of the pillar and exit on the northeast side consistent with the trajectory of where the security guard would be firing at the suspect. It is not known at this time if the projectile passed through the pillar and struck the suspect or was one of the projectile impacts in the wall.
- Approximately 92' southwest of the northeast doors against the northwest wall is a glass folding door. This folding door secures a resource library which is against the northwest wall. A projectile impact is observed approximately 6" above the ground in the 6th folding section from the northeast. Fractured glass demonstrates a projectile traveling basically from southwest to northeast. The projectile after passing through this glass panel strikes the base of the aforementioned pillar fracturing tile at the bottom of the pillar. These projectile impacts appear to be consistent with having come from the security guard and at the direction of the suspect. Also located within this small room are numerous projectile fragments.

Detective would also note that the wooden doorway at the northeast side of this resource library does show evidence of having been forced open probably by TEU making entry into the room to clear it.

- Approximately 93' southwest of the northeast door detective observed a projectile impact in a dropdown
 of the ceiling which subsequently supports the aforementioned folding glass doors of the resource library.
 On this dropdown approximately 12" below the ceiling is a projectile impact into the ceiling showing a
 directionality of northeast to southwest and with a slightly upward trajectory. It appears that this projectile
 impact came from a direction of the suspect or from outside the northeast doors when bullets were fired
 into the hallway.
- Approximately 97' west of the east entrance is a projectile impact in the 12th glass panel from the northeast of the aforementioned folding glass door of the resource library. This projectile impact shows a directionality of southwest to northeast. The first impact is in the left frame of the glass with secondary impacts on the glass then on the right aluminum frame of this glass panel. A possible extremely deformed projectile is imbedded in the aluminum frame. Attempts were made to recover this projectile however doing so would so greatly damage the remainder that the decision was made to leave the projectile as is. This trajectory is consistent with having been fired from the security guard in the direction of the suspect.

• Examination of the area around where the majority of the 9mm shell casings are located (items R through VV) reveals no evidence of any projectile impacts at that location that would indicate the suspect shooting in the direction of where the security guard is believed to have been firing from.

- Approximately 205' southwest of the northeast doors on the northwest side of the hallway is a large brown pillar. This pillar demonstrates a projectile impact on the northeast side with an exit on the southwest side. Directionality is northeast to southwest and is consistent with having been fired in the direction from the suspect. Just to the southwest of this pillar is a semi-circular counter or desk which at this time does not display any secondary impact from that projectile. Further examination of the exit hole reveals that the projectile may not have exited this pillar. Attempts were made to recover this projectile however were not successful. It appears that the projectile fell into the recess of the pillar.
- Approximately 229' southwest of the northeast doors is the southwest end of the aforementioned semicircular desk against the northwest wall. The top of this desk is covered with brown cloth which does show a projectile having past through numerous folds of this cloth in a northeast to southwest direction. The holes in the cloth lead to a projectile impact in a pillar which is located at the extreme southwest end of the desk. The northeast side of this pillar shows a projectile impact with an exit on the southwest side. Detective would note that the southwest side exit shows that the projectile did fragment inside the pillar and there appeared to be numerous exits or potential exits on the west side of the pillar. The trajectory of this projectile impact is consistent with having been fired from the direction of the suspect.

Information received was that a gunshot victim, Larry Bourbonaisse, was possibly standing behind this pillar and was struck by fragments as they exited on the west side of the pillar, as he describe being struck by shotgun pellets. I would note that the exit damage on the pillar did at first glance appear similar to shotgun shot, due to the number of exit/potential exit points.

- Approximately 214' west of the northeast doors in the southeast edge of the aforementioned semi-circular desk, there is a projectile impact into the side of the desk approximately 3" below the top. This projectile passes through the tablecloth into the exterior of the desk, through a desk drawer, and into a void located just to the southwest of the drawer. There is no access to this void in the desk. A hole was drilled into the void portion to attempt recovery, however it was determined that the desk would have to be dismantled to attempt recovery. The projectile was not recovered. The trajectory of the projectile is consistent with having been fired from the direction of the suspect.
- Approximately 321' southwest of the northeast entrance door in what is described as the lobby area of the worship center is a large wooden brown pillar. The pillar shows a projectile impact on the northeast side with an exit on the southwest side. It appears the projectile after passing through the pillar continues in a southwesterly direction over the top of the northeast side of the lobby information desk console, striking the interior of the southwest side of the information desk console. The projectile appears to have struck plastic leaflet racks and a bottle of hand sanitizer before embedding in the interior

of the southwest wall of the information desk console. This projectile was not recovered as major damage would have been done to the information desk in the process. Directionality of this impact is northeast to southwest.

- Also on the northeast side of the lobby desk are three additional projectile impacts. One is in the bottom
 baseboard with the projectile lodging in the base of the northeast side of the desk/console. Due to
 damage concerns, this projectile was not recovered. Directionality of this impact is northeast to
 southwest.
- The second impact is approximately 4" above the floor with the projectile appearing to have lodged in the
 console. Due to damage concerns, this projectile was not recovered. Directionality of this impact is
 northeast to southwest.
- The third impact is in the top portion of the northeast side console, approximately 339' southwest of the northeast entrance. This projectile enters the top portion of the console and exits into the center console before striking the top ledge of the interior side of the southwest portion of the console. At that point the projectile deflects to the left or south before striking numerous intermediary targets within the console, to include paper holders, etc. Detective did locate a projectile fragment consisting primarily of copper jacketing, on the floor within this center console. Directionality if this impact is northeast to southwest.
- On the southwest side of the lobby just prior to entering into the auditorium is a brown pillar. The left or south side of this pillar demonstrates a projectile impact of a "grazing nature" on the south side of the pillar. The projectile or projectile fragment continues in a southwesterly direction striking the southwest wall approximately 5' above floor level. The projectile or fragment does not penetrate this wall. Directionality of this impact is northeast to southwest.
- Additionally, a projectile fragment appears to have entered through a poster on the southwest wall
 penetrating, but not perforating the wall. The room behind this impact is a closet containing electrical
 equipment, and shows no evidence of a projectile entering. Directionality of this impact is northeast to
 southwest.

EVIDENCE RECOVERED:

The following items of evidence were collected by CSPD Lab Technicians from the shooting scene, New Life Church Worship Center. Detective would note that in regard to projectile fragments, many were collected as a group from a specific area such as the foyer or lobby information desk. Individual fragments were collected and identified with a general location of recovery. Due to the heavy civilian and police traffic in the Worship Center hallway after the shooting, Investigators were unable to determine if the recovery location is the same as the initial resting point for these items.



Synopsis: On 12/09/2007 at 1418 (Sunday) Sgt Hugh M Velasquez, 1514, called me, Detective Charles Szatkowski 1347, at my home. Sgt Velasquez reported there was a shooting at the New Life Church, 11005 Voyager Parkway, and I was to respond to assist with the interview of witnesses. I left my home, at 1430 and arrived at the Police Operations Center (POC), 705 S Nevada Ave, at 1510. Detective David Krueger, 1962, and I departed the POC at 1514 and arrived at New Life Church at 1525. I interviewed four witnesses; Carolyn Marie Spears (DOB 03/14/1953), Doug Suh Cho (DOB 03/03/1987), Katylin Maye Brink (DOB 09/06/1987), and Naomi Beth Ost (DOB 09/18/1981).

Spear reported she, Charlene Kaye, and Rebecca Law were in the ladies restroom located in the lobby near the cafe' of the Worship Center after services, at approximately 1:00pm. She was in a restroom stall. Spear did not see anything.

Spear heard one shot and then heard a young male voice, possibly a teenager, yell "Mom, there are shots being fired!" She heard someone leave the restroom. She heard two more "random" shots, then six shots in rapid succession, and a couple more random shots.

Spear, Kaye, and Law hid in the restroom hall at the north end of the stalls. They heard the door open and a male voice yell, "Is anybody in here?" The voice did not identify itself as a police officer or security so they stayed quiet and did not answer.

Spear reported they were in the restroom for 30 to 45 minutes when SWAT officers entered and checked the stalls. The SWAT officers escorted Spear, Kaye, and Law to the "tent" building north of the Worship Center.

Spear reported her son, Shobie Spear, was in the World Prayer Center. He text messaged her and reported he was leading a group to the basement to hide. She said her son text messaged her and told her he was safe.

Brink reported she was a student at New Life's School of Worship. She would be going home to Minnesota for Christmas break December 17th or 18th through December 28th or 29th.

Brink reported she was leaving the parking lot at the Voyager Parkway exit after services when Chris Hoffman called her. Chris had her camera and told her there had been a shooting. Chris Hoffman (719-494-3073) was with David Lee (719-271-6410). Hoffman and Lee meet Brink at the parking lot exit. They told her they had walked right by the gunman as they left the church and told Brink she needed to return to the tent to be interviewed.

Brink reported she did not see or hear anything. Brink said she read about the shooting at "Y WAM" in Arvada before going to church that day. She reported the description Hoffman and Lee gave of the gunman matched the description of the gunman she read about in Arvada.

Brink said she went home and then returned to New Life with her father.

Brink reported two to three weeks earlier she had been at Panera Bread in the Shops at Brairgate, 1845 Brairgate Parkway. She was reading Real Worship for a school assignment. There was an Asian or white male dressed in all black with black hair in the store. He kept looking at her and laughing to himself as he wrote on a black journal. He was there for about 45 minutes.

Brink moved to table next to her original seat so she could "plug her computer in." The male moved to her old seat beside her and asked questions about the book she was reading and New Life Church. The male was polite but kept laughing to himself and writing in his black journal. The male left before Brink and she did not see him after he left the store.

Brink described the male as Asian or white, 20 to 21 years with black hair, approximately 5' 11" tall, and dressed in all black. She would not be able to positively identify him if she saw him again.

OFFICER STATEMENT:

On 12-09-07 at approximately 1350 hours, I, Officer C. O'Connor/2057P was dispatched to Penrose Main Hospital located at 2222 N. Nevada Ave to secure part of the scene of this crime. I was advised by Officer Montelongo/1617, who was at Penrose Main Hospital's Emergency Department, that one of the victim's had driven themselves to the hospital and their vehicle was parked in the Emergency Department's parking lot.

Upon arrival I observed a white Toyota Sequoia SUV with Colorado Plate # 690-LMG parked in the first space (east) in the last row on the north side of the parking lot. I observed that the front passenger side window was broken out, the front center of the windshield had what appeared to be a bullet hole through it and the driver's side rear door window was broken out. I also observed what appeared to be a bullet hole on the top of the hood closest to the passenger side of the vehicle, a bullet hole on the front passenger's door and a bullet hole in the passenger side mirror. Upon closer examination I observed what appeared to be blood on the front passenger seat, floor and center console. I also observed rips in the seats of the front driver and passenger seats that appeared to be where the bullets grazed them. There was also a hole in the right side of the driver's seat and in the driver's headrest with stuffing coming out of the back of the headrest. On the driver's side passenger door I observed a small outward dent consistent with the path of one of the bullets. It appeared this was one bullet lodged into this door.

I secured the scene with yellow evidence tape. The owner of the vehicle, Matt Purcell, came outside while I was guarding the scene and requested his daughter's jacket out of the back seat. I was able to reach in through the broken out window and retrieve the jacket from the backseat without having to touch or open the door. No one else touched or entered the vehicle while I was guarding it. I took digital photos of the exterior and interior of the vehicle through the broken windows.

At approximately 1550 hours, Detective Quick/1502 directed me to have Randy's tow the vehicle to one of the evidence bays at the Police Operations Center. I completed a car card and an evidence invoice for this vehicle, I advised the owner where his vehicle was being taken and obtained an ignition key from him to the vehicle. With gloves on I opened the driver's side door and placed this key in the center console of the vehicle.

The tow truck driver did not enter the vehicle. I followed Randy's to the POC where they unloaded it into the first evidence bay. I placed a copy of the evidence invoice, the vehicle car card and the evidence bay processing request form on the counter in this bay and secured both doors.

I attached copies of these forms to the investigations copy of this report. I placed a disk of the photos into evidence and forwarded a copy to Det. Quick via email.

Initial Information

On 12-9-07, at approx. 1223 hours, Colorado Springs Police Dispatchers received a 911 call (Call Screen Number 07467010) in reference to a shooting victim (Judy Purcell) of an active gunman at New Life Church. The caller who identified himself as Mat Purcell, stated his wife had been shot and he was enroute with her to Penrose Main Hospital located at 2222 N Nevada Ave.

On 12-9-07, at approx. 1334 hours, I **Officer Montelongo 1617** was dispatched to contact Purcell and 2 other victims at Penrose Hospital being transported by ambulance from the scene at New Life Church. Upon my arrival at approx. 1340 hours, I was informed by security that Purcell had already arrived and she was placed in triage room #1.

A teenage female victim arrived at the same time as me and was placed in triage room #2. She was taken up to an operating room and was listed as critical and unstable at that time. I was unable to obtain any information about this victim.

Shortly after her arrival, an older Caucasian male was brought in and placed in room emergency room #23. It was later confirmed that this gentleman was the father of the teenage victim taken to the operating room. I was unable to obtain any information on this victim.

Major Crimes detectives responded to the hospital shortly after and obtained victim and witness statements.

Officer Statement

After the initial influx of victims, I was able to speak with Judy Purcell. I obtained a brief statement from her in hopes that the information could assist officers on scene. She provided me with the following information:

Purcell stated she was in the passenger seat of her families vehicle. They had just exited the church, got into the vehicle and began leaving. They were in the east parking lot near the playground close to the main doors on that side of the church.

As they were driving out, Purcell heard what she believed were 2 shots being fired. She then observed a white male approx. 6 feet tall, thin build with brown hair wearing a camouflage jacket holding a rifle, the suspect was standing directly in front of their vehicle. Her daughters who were sitting in the back seat stated the rifle looked like a paint ball gun. With that statement, Purcell was under the assumption her daughters new the suspect.

As the vehicle stopped, the suspect began shooting at them. She stated the suspect was approx. 2-4 feet from their vehicle. The suspect then walked to the right side of the vehicle and continued to shoot at them. She stated she did not immediately know she had been struck, they left the area and proceeded directly to the hospital.

INITIATING INFORMATION

On Sunday, 12/09/07, at approximately 1345 hours, I, Officer Dave Pratt/974X, was at home and saw on the television news a teletyped report of a shooting that had recently occurred at the New Life Church. According to this initial report, there were multiple victims. I contacted my supervisor, Sgt. Howard Black/154X, on his cell phone (659-0668) and left him a message advising him of this incident. I also advised Sgt. Black that I was available to assist if needed.

OFFICER'S STATEMENT

I collected my police gear and responded to the Stetson Hills Substation where I awaited directions from supervisors. Upon my arrival at the substation at approximately 1400 hours, I contacted Sgt. Mike Lux/438P who was in the parking lot of the substation. I advised Sgt. Lux I was available to assist and he directed me to cover the Duty Desk until relieved by Sgt. D. Juhl/092P.

I remained at the Stetson Hills Substation under the direction of Sgt. Juhl and Lt. Alan Scott/319P for the remainder of my time on duty. During this time I assisted with logistical support and conducted two telephone interviews with witnesses from the crime scene.

Mr. Simmons advised he was attending a function in the reception area at the New Life Church when he heard what sounded like two shots. Mr. Simmons said his first impression of the shots was that they were coming from someone performing construction duties. He said he realized it was actually coming from a gun when he noticed several people panicking and running from the facility. Mr. Simmons said he heard a couple more shots and he then helped usher approximately 10 people out of the reception area. He added that as he was leaving this area, he heard someone yell, "He's coming down the hallway!" Mr. Simmons said that as a hunter, he was familiar with the smell of gunpowder and he could smell gunpowder in the air. Mr. Simmons also said it sounded as if the shots were coming from inside the main building.

Mr. Simmons said he took a female named MARSHA (unknown last name) into his vehicle with him and immediately fled the scene. Mr. Simmons described Marsha as a white female in her mid 30s, approximately 5'6" tall, heavy build, with reddish colored hair. He said he drove Marsha to her home located somewhere in the area of Austin Bluffs Parkway and Nevada Avenue. I asked Mr. Simmons if he would attempt to locate a phone number for Marsha so I could contact her and he said he would be able to get that information through their professor.

Initial Information

On 12-09-07, I, Officer E. Price #2316P, was dispatched to 11005 Voyager Pkwy. (New Life Church) in regards to a man with a gun. At the time I received the call, I was on a traffic hazard near the intersection of Mark Dabling Bl. and S. Rockrimmon Bl. I was disregarded from the traffic hazard and sent to New Life Church.

Date, Day, and Time of Occurrence

December 9th, 2007 at approximately 1310 hours.

Location of Occurrence

11005 Voyager Pkwy. New Life Church main building.

Point and Method of Entry

According to witnesses, the suspect entered the church through the doors on the east side of the main building. The doors open into a driveway directly across from another structure at that location referred to as "The Tent".

Scene Description / Officer Statement:

New Life Church is a multi-level, Multi-building church consisting of the eastern most building (The Tent), the main building where the chapel is located, and the western most building (The World Prayer Center). I arrived at approximately 1320 hours in the parking lot from the intersection of Voyager Pkwy, and New Life Dr. I heard over the radio that 4W46, Officer M. Chacon #2300, had received reports that the suspect had entered the east doors at the main building. I drove towards the east doors, on the north side of the building, past the main entrance of the church. Near the main entrance, I observed two, unoccupied, marked patrol vehicles I identified as belonging to the extra duty officers on scene, Officer Chacon and 4W47, and Officer A. Roman #1343. I drove past their vehicles and proceeded to the east doors. I stopped on the north side of the building, just west of the northwest corner and exited my vehicle, deploying an Ar-15 Carbine Rifle.

I observed Officer Chacon entering the east doors to the building while at the same time he stated over the radio that he had a three man entry team and was entering the building. I fell in line with Officers Chacon, Roman, and an El Paso County Sheriff's Office Sergeant, creating a four man Active Shooter entry team proceeding west. Upon entering the building, I observed several of the windows on the east doors were shattered with what appeared to bullet holes. Upon proceeding down the main hallway as the rear guard, I followed the team approximately 20 yards west down the hallway where we encountered several security personnel for New Life Church standing near what they identified as the suspect in the shooting.

Upon viewing the body, I observed the suspect had on what appeared to be a black tactical bullet proof vest. He was not moving and his skin appeared pale. I did not observe an injury on the suspect but it appeared he was deceased by the position of his body and the discoloration of his skin. He was lying in the first hallway we encountered on the right side as we proceeded west. I observed the suspect's body for a short time, approximately 5 seconds, and was instructed by Sgt. L. Herbert #388P to conduct a search of the building for a possible second suspect.

I joined Officer Roman and Officer D. Smook #459P and conducted a search of the second floor of the building. We identified several additional innocent personnel on the second floor which were evacuated as we conducted a preliminary search of the open doors. I observed no other suspicious activity, items, or individuals in the area. I remained on scene after the arrival of the Colorado Springs Tactical Enforcement Unit to assist with evacuations and to escort individuals to their vehicles after after supervisors deemed it safe.

At approximately 1800 hours, I was instructed by Sgt. P. Lebeau #150P to make a search of the north parking lot to possibly identify any other victims or witnesses. With the assistance of 5A21, Officer M. Watson #9613P, we conducted a search of the parking lot and discovered nothing additional.

Detective Statement

On 12-09-07 at about 1520 hours, I, Detective Patrick Mahoney 1403D, was contacted telephonically by SGT Dale Fox 127D, supervisor of the Special Investigations Unit, Falcon Division. SGT Fox requested I respond to The New Life Church, located at 11025 Voyager Parkway, in regards to a shooting involving multiple victims. SGT Fox informed me detectives were needed to assist in the conduct of interviews with potential witnesses to the crime.

At about 1550 hours I arrived in the area of the New Life Church and proceeded to the tent area located on the northeast side of the church, which had been designated as the command post. I then contacted SGT Jim Rodgers of the Vice, Narcotics, and Intelligence Unit (VNI) inside the tent, who was matching potential witnesses to investigators. The tent is a name given to a tent shaped structure used by New Life Church for activities.

I was matched with Mr. Mathew Vogel, an employee of New Life Church, Mr. Vogel provided me the following information:

Witness Mathew Vogel's Statement

I introduced myself to Mr. Vogel and provided my credentials. I escorted Mr. Vogel to an unoccupied table and we sat down. I asked Mr. Vogel how long has he worked for New Life Church. Mr. Vogel said he has been an intern in the Worship Department for three months. I asked Mr. Vogel to describe his day from when he arrived at church until now. Mr. Vogel said the day started out as a normal Sunday worship day with him arriving at the church at about 0810 hours. Mr. Vogel said he left the church at about 1230 hours to get together for lunch with his friends and fellow workers Stephan Rausch, Jeff Hawthorne, and Rachael Bussinger.

Mr. Vogel said at about 1320 hours Stephan Rausch told him he had received a text message that there had been a shooting at the church. Mr. Vogel said he returned to the church with Jeff and Rachael to check on the eight students in his team. Mr. Vogel said he does not return to the church on Sundays until the 1800 hour worship. Mr. Vogel said there are a total of thirty three students and he is the team leader for eight of the students and wanted to check on their safety. Mr. Vogel said all eight were fine and were at home. I asked Mr. Vogel to explain his arrival at the church and what he saw. Mr. Vogel said he arrived with Jeff and Rachael at about 1330 hours. Mr. Vogel said they entered the door to the Worship Department, which is located between the main entrance door and the east side entrance door. Mr. Vogel said at first there was no one until they got to the main hallway where there were a bunch of cops and civilians. Mr. Vogel said he, Jeff, and Rachael were called over by the police and instructed to stand by the wall. Mr. Vogel said he heard some yelling and then they were instructed to sit down by police because of the possibility there may be another shooter. Mr. Vogel said they were eventually escorted to the activity tent at about 1400 hours. Mr. Vogel said the building is called the tent, but it is an activity building used for the students and members of the church. Mr. Vogel said he has been in the tent area until he was contacted by me. I asked Mr. Vogel if there was anything else he could remember involving the incident and he said no. I provided my business card to Mr. Vogel and asked him to contact me with any questions or ...

SUMMARY

On December 9, 2007, at about 1510 hours, I, Detective E. Frederic (2747) was called out to assist in interviews with possible witnesses to a homicide at New Life Church. I arrived and was directed to interview three witnesses. NONE OF THE WITNESSES THAT I INTERVIEWED SAW THE SUSPECT OR THE SHOOTING. Below is a summary of the individual conversations.

WITNESS STATEMENTS

Powell, Gabriela (7-19-97) 1709 Acacia Drive Colorado Springs, CO 80907 H 268-0693

5th grade, home school

Interview start at 1610 hours. Powell told me she was upstairs in the main building in the library with her family. Her father heard a noise outside the library and went out to check the area. The father came back in about ten seconds later and shut and locked the library doors. He then turned off the lights. The family waited there until police arrived and told them it was ok to come out. Powell did not see what happened and only said she heard one loud noise. Interview concluded at 1615 hours.

Hawthorne, Jeffrey (11-12-87) 8933 Rockmont Terrace Colorado Springs, CO 80920 C 640-3440

Intern at New Life Church

Interview start at 1622 hours. Hawthorne is a group leader for the youth of the church. He had finished his duties and left the church at about 1300 hours with some friends, including Matt Vogel. While they were in Hawthorne's car, Vogel received a call on his cell phone about the incident at the church. They drove back to the church and were directed by police to the interview area. Hawthorne said he never saw the suspect or heard the shots. Interview concluded at 1626 hours.

Wenz, Bob (10-10-49) 9946 Red Sage Dr Colorado Springs, CO 80920 H 531-5998 W 640-1900

Interviewed at 1631 hours. Wenz told me he was in the "TAG" chapel at the time of the incident, "just after 1:00 PM." The "TAG" chapel is located on the west or north side of the main complex, adjacent to the parking lot, off one of the hallways, on the first floor. He said he heard a loud "bang" and then about ten seconds later, he heard two more "bangs:" Shortly after that, a young girl, about eight years old) came running into the room shouting that someone had a gun. Wenz shut the doors but was unable to lock them. He then ushered the people out the opposite door, which led to the parking lot. Wenz said there were about thirty-five people in the TAG chapel at the time. He said he never saw the suspect or victims. Interview concluded at 1636 hours.

INITIATING INFORMATION

On the afternoon of 12/09/2007 dispatch sent two Stetson Hills cars over to the Falcon channel to assist in an active gunman at the New Life Church located at 11005 Voyager Parkway in Colorado Springs, Colorado. I was finishing a two car crash at Marksheffel and Hwy 94 when dispatch aired this. I began heading north on Marksheffel in the event I was needed at the scene when I was dispatched at 1332 hours to go to Penrose Main Hospital and contact a victim of this incident who had been drive to Penrose Main in her personally owned vehicle. Larrived on scene at 1349 hours.

OFFICER'S STATEMENT

Upon my arrival, I would note that Officer C. Montelongo was already in a triage room speaking to a white female who I could see had blood on her face. I briefly spoke with Officer Montelongo and he said he had also been sent to the hospital to speak to her. I told Officer Montelongo since he had already talked to her I would let him conduct this interview. I later learned this female's first name was Judy Purcell, with a home address of 5286 Pony Creek Cir. Judy Purcell had evidently been shot in the shoulder during this incident at the New Life Church. I was told by Officer Montelongo Judy Purcell had three daughters out in the family area waiting room who were also in the vehicle at the time of the shooting. I then went out to the waiting room area where I contacted three white females. They were later identified as Chelsea E. York, with an address of 5286 Pony Creek Cir, Colorado Springs, Colorado 80919, DOB 06/10/84, home phone 532-9380, work phone 487-3000, cell phone 494-4689. Lalso spoke to Kayla Purcell, same address as Judy Purcell and Chelsea York, DOB 05/07/91. Lalso contacted a younger female, who was later identified as Kristen Purcell, same address, DOB 10/11/95. According to Chelsea York, Matt Purcell is the husband of Judy Purcell. Matt Purcell owns the white Toyota 4-Runner SR5 which was parked in the parking lot of Penrose Main Hospital. Chelsea York told me the owner, who is the husband of Judy Purcell, Matt Purcell, same address as above, was driving this vehicle and Judy was in the right front seat. Chelsea stated Chelsea, Kayla and Kristen were in the backseat when the shooting took place at the New Life Church.

I then went outside where I located a white Toyota SR5 4-Runner bearing Colorado plate 690LMG. I went out and closely examined this vehicle which was parked in the parking lot of the Emergency Room area of Penrose Main Hospital. This vehicle had its left rear side glass shot out and I then walked around to the right hand side of the vehicle where I noticed the right front side glass had also evidently been shot out. Upon closer examination I could see what appeared to be a bullet hole passing through the upper seatback cushion of the right front seat, passing in a diagonal direction toward the door area of the left rear door. There was also a small amount of blood on the floor board where Judy Purcell had been seated. I also noticed a bullet hole in the hood of this vehicle which evidently glanced up and also damaged the windshield of this Toyota SR5 4-Runner.

I then went back into contact Chelsea York again and by this time, I would note that Officer O'Conner from the Gold Hill Division was out at this white Toyota putting crime scene tape around it. I later spoke with Officer O'Conner who stated she would take custody of this SR5 and also arrange for an impound at the request of the Detectives.

CHELSEA YORK'S STATEMENT

vehicle and she was seated behind Matt, who was driving the vehicle. In the middle rear seat was Kristen Purcell and in the right rear seat was Kayla Purcell. Chelsea York told me that after church had let out they were all in this vehicle on the east side of the church driving northbound when they heard what they thought were two gunshots. Chelsea York said they all looked at each other and then turned around a corner and were going eastbound in the parking lot when they saw what she described as an approximately 18 year old white male wearing all black, carrying a rifle. This individual was wearing a beanie type cap, prescription glasses and had black boots on. Chelsea York stated she also saw what she thought was an ammo belt around the waist of this individual. According to Chelsea York near this time Kayla Purcell stated she thought she knew this individual and she thought his name was Zach. At this point in time they were thinking it was only a paint gun this individual was carrying. Chelsea York told me at this point in time Matt Purcell stopped approximately 50 yards from this individual and there were no cars between their white Toyota SR5 and the gunman. Chelsea York stated she then saw the gunman raise his rifle up into a shooting and aiming position, however they were under the belief this may still be a paintball oun. Chelsea York stated she saw the suspect aim the rifle directly at us and she heard a shot and she then saw the windshield shatter. Chelsea York stated they then ducked down and the gunman fired what she thought was four more times. At some point in time, Chelsea York stated Matt Purcell then very quickly put the vehicle into gear and evidently broke the gear shift lever in an attempt to get away from the gunman. According to Chelsea York she, Kayla and Kristen all agreed at least on the east side of the parking lot during they time they were there they only saw the one gunman.

Before I left Penrose Main I again asked Kayla Purcell if in retrospect she thought the gunman could be the individual she knows by the name of Zach and she said no, she did not recognize the gunman.

EMS PERSONNEL INVOLVED

Upon my arrival at Penrose Main I first spoke with a paramedic from AMR who had transported the white male, later identified as **David Works**. This paramedic stated there trip number 151309 and their designator was Medic 705. Parked beside this AMR unit was Donald Wescott Medic 18. I spoke to this paramedic, whose name I do not have. According to this paramedic he stated they transported a white female who he thought was approximately 16 years of age. This female had a gunshot wound to the chest and he said they had to CPR on her during the entire transport.

I would note that I never actually went to the scene of the shooting.

ADDITIONAL OFFICER'S STATEMENT

After I obtained the statement from Chelsea York, I would note that friends and family members of Matt Purcell began coming into the waiting room area of Penrose Main Hospital. I spoke to a white female by the name of Barbara Sabol with a home phone of 388-8191, and a cell phone of 650-8532. Barbara Sabol is affiliated with the New Life Church. According to Barbara Sabol she stated she was standing in the foyer and the area was full of people when she began hearing gunshots. She then began yelling for people to get out and at that time the crowd she was with began running in a westerly direction. Barbara Sabol stated she never actually saw the gunman however she did hear shots come her way and while she was running toward the west she said the shots were coming from behind her. Barbara Sabol said she was not hit by any of the bullets.

After I spoke with Barbara Sabol, the crowd was beginning to get larger in the waiting room area, and I asked if anybody in the crowd had been at the church and could provide me with any other information on the gunman. A white female by the name of <u>June Gordon</u>, with a home address of 14786 Air Garden Ln., Colorado Springs, Colorado, 80921, home phone 481-0893, cell phone 661-6555, said she never actually saw the shooter however it was her understanding that an individual at the church by the name of <u>Lance R. Coles</u> believed to be spelled Coles actually saw the 16 year old girl get shot in the chest by the gunman. I would note I never spoke with Lance Coles at the hospital.

Before I left Penrose Main Hospital I would note the 16 year old girl had not been identified however the wife of David Works arrived at Penrose Main and by the time I left, it was my understanding the 16 year old female that had been shot in the chest was David Works' daughter, named **Rachel**. ...

INITIAL INFORMATION:

On 12-09-07 at approximately 1400 hours, I, Ofc. J. P. Milhone #2637 (1034), started my shift by being notified of an active shooter call which was occurring at the New Life Church, located at 11005 Voyager Parkway. Ofc. Gulbrandson #1860, Ofc. Juhl #1756, and I immediately loaded up in a unmarked police vehicle and were enroute to the New Life Church at approximately 1415 hours. We arrived at the church at approximately 1435 hours and immediately went to the Command Post.

OFFICER STATEMENT:

Approximately 15 minutes after we arrived, Ofc. Juhl notified Ofc. Gulbrandson and I to head over to the tent building (located on the east side of the complex). We then met up with Sgt. Lux who was leading a team of officers to assist over at the Prayer Center (located on the west side of the complex). The members of this team included Ofc. Juhl #1756, Ofc. Wallace #1772, Ofc. Reeder #2765, T. Murray #2638, Ofc. Gulbrandson #1860 and I. We walked over to the front doors of the Prayer Center. Sqt Lux requested the officers of this team to secure the outside of the building. We were notified the Tactical Enforcement Team was already inside the Prayer Center searching the building. I secured the north door of the building which leads outside. I watched this door for approximately 10 minutes. During that time no individuals exited or entered the building at the north doors. After watching this door for approximately 10 minutes, Sqt. Poole requested Ofc. Gulbrandson and I to meet with him at the front door of the Prayer Center.

Sqt. Pooled directed me to go with TEU Officer J. Ford #96 inside the Prayer Center. Ford informed me there was a large number of civilians being contained in the Prayer Center Sanctuary. Ofc. Ford requested me to remain at the front doors of the Sanctuary and not allow anyone to exit the Sanctuary. I took a position at the front doors of the Sanctuary at 1510 hours. At approximately 1550 hours, 11 civilians in the Sanctuary, who were witnesses to the shooting were escorted out of the Sanctuary by Ofc. Gulbrandson and taken to the tent building to be interviewed. The only other persons to enter or exit the Sanctuary was the Pastor of the church and the CSPD chaplain. I remained at the front doors until I was relieved by Det. D. Thompson #2062 at 1610 hours. Det. Thompson informed me to meet up with Sqt. Herbert #388 who was coordinating a team of officers. I then met up with Sqt. Hebert who informed me he was setting a team of officers to escort the civilians who were in the Sanctuary, who did not witness any of the incident, out to their vehicles so they could leave the area. Before the civilians could leave, they would have to provide their name, date of birth, address, and phone number to CSPD. A table was set up, manned by Detective Thompson, to obtain this personal information. For approximately an hour and a half, I escorted the civilians out to their vehicles so they could leave. For every civilian I walked out to their vehicles. I checked the area where the vehicles were parked. I did not located any items which were of evidentiary value. After all the civilians were escorted out, I went back inside the Prayer Center and positioned myself in the main hallway to assist in securing the building.

While inside the prayer center, Sgt. Lux and Sgt. Herbert each set up a team of officers to search the Prayer Center. Sqt. Poole asked if I would secure the Sanctuary area. No civilians entered the Sanctuary area during this time. After the two team were finished searching the building, Lt. Olszewski #73 directed Ofc. Gulbrandson and I to each go with one of the staff members of the church to close up the building. At 1845 hours, all officers and staff members walked out of the Prayer Center. This building was then completely locked up. Ofc. Gulbrandson and I transported the two staff members to theirs vehicle so they could leave the scene. Ofc. Gulbrandson and I then went back to the Command Post and met up with Sgt. Poole. We remained in the area of command post until Sqt. Poole directed us to clear from the call. We left the New Life Church and headed back to the Sand Creek substation at approximately 2014 hours.

Ms. Girtin stated her family had just left the New Life church building and were in there vehicle getting ready to leave. Ms. Girtin said they were parked in a parking spot on the south east side of the church next to the kid's playground. Ms. Girtin stated their vehicle was pulled straight into the parking spot facing to the north or towards the church. Ms. Girtin said they were parked on the end parking spot (east) so no one was parked to their right. Ms. Girtin stated she was in the front passenger seat of the vehicle; her son was in the back passenger seat and her husband Mr. Girtin was in the front driver's seat.

Ms. Girtin stated they were in the car with all doors and windows closed when they heard two loud Pops. Ms. Girtin stated Mr. Girtin said: "What's that?" Ms. Girtin said she replied with: "Must have been a car backfiring." Ms. Girtin stated a few seconds later she heard multiple popping noises coming from her right. She looked over and saw a juvenile male in all black carrying a rifle in his left hand shooting in the direction of the church. Ms. Girtin stated the suspect was located to the northeast of her and was walking west through the parking lot next to a large circle tent (south of tent) towards the main church building.

Ms. Girtin stated she at first thought it was a kid with a paintball gun because the suspect was standing straight up walking like he was not scared. Ms. Girtin stated the suspect was shooting at something in the area of the church but did not seem to be aiming. I asked what she meant by that and she stated he was just "Carefree Shooting" with the rifle next to his side.

Ms. Girtin stated the suspect was walking towards the north doors of the church (East Doors) but before he got there he stopped and grabbed something out of his pocket. Ms. Girtin stated he then did something with the gun and continued to walk towards the north doors or the east side of the church. Ms. Girtin said the suspect began shooting again in the direction of the church, but this time he seemed to be aiming and his shots were deliberate and further apart as if he was taking his time. Ms. Girtin stated she then lost visual of the suspect as he neared the north doors of the church.

Ms. Girtin stated they then drove west through the parking lot where she called 911. Ms. Girtin stated when she called she was surprised to hear from the call taker no one else had called. Ms. Girtin stated she believed she was the first person to call 911.

Mr. Girtin stated he and his family had just left the church and was in their vehicle getting ready to leave when he heard two "Pops". Mr. Girtin stated he asked: "What's that?" to which his wife replied: "Must have been a car backfiring!" Mr. Girtin stated he then heard a series of shots and looked to his right where he observed the suspect walking west through the parking lot towards the north doors of the church firing a rifle in the direction of the church.

Mr. Girtin stated there was a white male wearing blue jeans and a tan jacket next to a parked car to the east of where they were parked and to the east of the suspect that fell to the ground between the vehicles around the time the shots had finished. Mr. Girtin was unsure if the male had been shot by the suspect or was jumping out of the way for cover. Mr. Girtin stated the suspect then stopped walking and was doing something with his gun when a black two-door vehicle drove between the suspect and the church in a east direction, and stopped a little ways past the suspect. Mr. Girtin stated a male got out of the vehicle looking back at the suspect and then toward the male laying on the ground between the cars. The man then got back into his vehicle and drove to the southeast side of the parking lot and stopped. I asked Mr. Girtin if he believed the vehicle was a friend of the suspect and he stated no that he believed the vehicle had stopped to check on the victim between the cars.

Mr. Girtin stated after the suspect "Reloaded" his rifle he again began to walk towards the north doors of the church firing more deliberately. At that time, Mr. Girtin stated he backed out of his parking spot and drove west and entered onto Voyager.

Mr. Jentry Girtin stated he was in the passenger back seat of the vehicle when he heard two pops. Mr. Jentry Girtin was not certain of where the noise came from or what they were at first. Mr. Jentry Girtin stated after a short pause he then heard seven more pops. While the pops were happening, Mr. Jentry Girtin stated he looked to his right were he observed the suspect walking westbound next to a circle tent shooting a black in color rifle in the direction of the church. Mr. Jentry Girtin stated the suspect had a gray in color vest with black long sleeves, black in color pants, and a rifle in his left hand. Mr. Jentry Girtin stated the suspect did not seem to be aiming but had the gun lowered next to his left side while he was firing.

Mr. Jentry Girtin stated around the time the suspect had stopped firing, he observed a white male wearing a tan jacket, light blue Jeans, and black hair, to the east of their location fall to the ground next to a car. Mr. Jentry Girtin was uncertain if the male had been hit but stated he did not observe movement. Mr. Jentry Girtin said after the seven shots, the suspect stopped and reached with his left hand into his left front pocket where he pulled something out. Mr. Jentry Girtin stated while he was doing this something fell out of his pocket to the ground. Mr. Jentry Girtin stated he believed it was bullets for his rifle. Mr. Jentry Girtin stated after pulling the items out of his pocket, he began doing something with his rifle, Mr. Jentry Girtin stated he believed the suspect was loading the rifle at that time. Mr. Jentry Girtin stated while the suspect was working on his gun, a black, two-door, small vehicle drove past the suspect and then stopped. Mr. Jentry Girtin stated the suspect then began walking towards the front of the church where he again began shooting. Mr. Jentry Girtin stated he heard four or five shots and believed the suspect was now aiming the rifle. Mr. Jentry Girtin explained the suspect had raised the rifle to his shoulder and was using his left eye to aim. Mr. Jentry Girtin stated he then saw an elder of the church running eastbound along the play ground toward where the suspect was located. Mr. Jentry Girtin stated the elder then stopped at the corner of the playground and looked around the corner as if he was looking for the suspect. Mr. Jentry Girtin stated he then told his dad to leave at which time they left the church parking lot and drove home.

Suspect Information

The Girtin's stated the suspect was a white male, approximately 6ff and 155lbs. They stated he was wearing a gray vest with black sleves underneath, black cargo (military) pants, dark colored shoes, and a dark in color small backpack. They stated he had dark brown short hair "Clean cut", no facial hair, and held the gun in his left hand.

Officer Statement Continued

Upon talking with the Girtin's, they continually stated they were in shock because of how the suspect acted. They stated he was walking casually towards the north doors of the church standing straight up as if he was not afraid. They all stated that when they observed the suspect firing the seven shots, it did not look as if he was aiming but was just shooting in the general direction of the church. But, after the suspect had reloaded his rifle, it looked as if he began to aim at certain targets.

Evidence

While talking with Ms. Girtin, I asked her to explain where she was parked. Ms. Girtin then grabbed a white piece of paper and drew a map of the church showing where she was parked and where they observed the suspect. The map was placed into evidence at the Stetson Hills Sub Station on 12-09-07.

While talking with Mr. Jentry Girtin, I asked him to describe the gun the suspect was using. He brought me a drawing he had done of the gun. This drawing was placed into evidence at the Stetson Hills Sub Station on 12-09-07.

After talking with Mr. Jentry Girtin, I asked if I could use his internet. He agreed and I pulled up a picture of an AR-15 rifle. Mr. Jentry Girtin stated the rifle looked the same but did not have a scope on it and may have had a shorter barrel. I printed the picture and placed it into evidence at the Stetson Hills Sub Station on 12-09-07.

Orpha Hernandez stated that she and her family arrived at New Life Church at approximately 0920 hours. She stated that they were late for the 0900 service and she noticed a male leaving the sanctuary as they were coming in. Ms. Hernandez stated that the male caught her eye because he was looking up at the ceiling tiles instead of looking where he was going. She stated that she also looked up, but did not see anything unusual for him to be staring at. Ms. Hernandez told me that she pointed out the odd behavior to her husband, Benjamin, and they continued into the sanctuary. She stated that they always sit in the special needs section (between sections 3 and 4) for their son and she had not seen the man there before. She stated that she saw on the news that police were still looking for suspicious people or packages. She was concerned that the male might have knowledge of a pipe bomb or something similar left in the ceiling so she decided to call police.

I asked Ms. Hernandez if she had ever seen the man before and she stated that she had not, but she did not think that was very unusual since the congregation is so large. She described the male as being white and in his late 40's. She stated that he was wearing a green long-sleeved plaid shirt and she noticed that he had several pens in his shirt pocket. Ms. Hernandez stated that the man had a full beard and short light brown hair. She could not remember if he was wearing a hat or glasses and her impression was that he had an average build. Ms. Hernandez stated that she thought she would be able to identify the man again if it became necessary.

Mr. Hagen stated that his girlfriend didn't like driving on the ice, so they stopped at Colorado Bank across the street from New Life Church. Mr. Hagen stated he parked his vehicle, then jumped in the car with his girlfriend. Mr. Hagen said as he was getting in the car, he noticed a black SUV parked by the southwest corner of the bank and it was running with nobody in the vehicle. He also noticed two white males, approximately 30-50 yrs old. One male was wearing a black trench coat. The second male was wearing an orange hunting hat. Mr. Hagen said he could not provide any additional information about the subjects. He said he did not think much about it until later in the day when he saw the news. He said he thought the bank might have possible video of the subjects if needed.

Initial Information

On Sunday, 12/9/07 at approximately 1800 hours, I, Officer S.A. Evans, 2887P (2A57/2V02), was dispatched to New Life Church, 11005 Voyager Parkway to assist with scene security at a homicide scene (Call Screen 07467010).

Initial Assignment

On arrival at approximately 1820 hours, I, along with Officer E. Plant, 2760P (2A97/2V04), and Officer C. Rodriguez, 3178P (2A47/2V05), was assigned to an inner perimeter on the east side of the church in the triangular parking lot next to the tent structure of the church (Call Screen 07467326). This was the parking lot where the suspect's vehicle, a red 1992 Toyota sedan bearing CO LIC: 940MNH, and initial deceased victim's vehicle, a white 2005 Toyota passenger van bearing CO LIC: 595LRZ, were located. I took a position at the northeast corner of the lot and prevented anyone from entering the perimeter which was marked off with crime scene tape. Officer Plant took position at the corner closest to the building on the west side of the parking lot and Officer Rodriguez took position on the southeast corner of the lot. I allowed members of the CSPD Explosive Ordinance Team (EOD) and CSPD Detectives entry to the scene.

2nd Assignment

At approximately 2225 hours, Sgt. Stanke, 1416P (5P11) advised me that I was no longer needed for inner containment and to move to the north central entrance (New Life Drive between Voyager Parkway and Hwy 83) next to the media staging area to relieve Officer Hernholm. I relieved Officer Hernholm, 108P (3V02), and assisted Officer B. Gurule, 2749P (2V07), escorting people to their cars that are approved to be released by the CSPD Command Post. See Officer Gurule's supplement for information on people who were escorted to their vehicles.

Pastor Contact

At approximately 2330 hours, I was contacted by Pastor Brian D. Newberg. Pastor Newberg requested information on when he would be able to return to the church in the morning to inspect the damage and start letting staff back into the building. I advised him to contact Detective D.A. Graham, 90I (1X16), through CSPD Dispatch in the morning to find out. I contacted Detective Sqt. J. Jenson, 1402l (1X10) and provided him with Pastor newberg's cellular phone number (719-238-6789). I also notified Sqt. Jenson in person that Pastor Newberg told me that he had just come from the hospital and the second feenage female had died.

Release

At approximately 0140 hours, Sgt. Stanke advised me that I could clear the scene. I completed an event log at the Command Post and left the scene at approximately 0152 hours.

INITIATING INFORMATION:

On Sunday, 12-09-2007, I (Officer B Birch, 1090) was assigned Colorado Springs Police Department extra duty at Woodmen Valley Chapel, E Woodmen Rd, 290 E Woodmen Rd scheduled from 0945 hours until 1315 hours. I completed the traffic control assignment at approximately 1305 hours and proceeded to the Falcon Substation to turn in my marked police cruiser I had used for the assignment. At approximately 1310 hours I had made it to the intersection of N Academy BI and Kelly Johnson Rd when I heard dispatch air a call for service to Falcon patrol officers. It was a man with a gun shooting call at the New Life Church, 11005 Voyager Pkwy.

OFFICER'S STATEMENT:

I made a u-turn at the intersection and responded with lights and siren activated from that location northbound on I-25 to the Briargate Pkwy exit, then continued northbound on Hwy 83 through Interquest Pkwy continuing northbound where Hwy 83 turns into Voyager Pkwy. I turned east into a parking lot on the west side of the New Life complex arriving at approximately 1313-1315 hours. I positioned my cruiser in the parking lot approximately half-way between Voyager and the east end of the main chapel and the tent-style structure.

I then deployed my cruiser's shotgun and started eastbound on foot through the parking lot toward the space between the two above-mentioned buildings. While I did so, dispatch had already provided updates over the air (on Falcon 1) that there were victims and numerous calls placed. I called to several small groups of people at the outer edges of the parking lot to get out of the area believing we still had an active gunman situation. To that point I had not seen anything out of the ordinary (citizens running or screaming or any audible gunshots, for example).

When I reached the east end of the main chapel I met up with Colorado Springs PD Officers G Daress, C Ingebretson and R Fyke. We had heard information that the gunmen had been near the tent building and there was an update that it appeared there was a gunmen down in the main chapel building. I along with the three above-named Officers then entered the tent building and began to tactically clear that structure. We located approximately 20-30 civilians inside on the upper floors. They collectively and initially reported that they were alright and that there was a couple amongst them that may have witnessed the suspect/gunman.

Other Officers remained with them and I responded outside when I heard Officer M Chacon calling out that he had multiple victims near the tent doors. When I reached him I noted that medical personnel were treating a middle-aged white male and that there were additional medical personnel on scene. I then looked out and saw several citizens standing near vehicles and realized there was road to the north (later known to be New Life Dr) with a parking lot traffic lane leading to it that was unsecured.

I responded on foot to New Life Dr and that driveway and secured it from both citizens entering an unsecured area and to be prepared if additional suspects were leaving the parking lot that way. By that time, I estimate it was approximately 1330 hours. At approximately 1350 hours Officer T Stevens arrived at my location with a marked cruiser and assumed that position. I then responded back to my own cruiser and met with Sgt L Herbert. I asked him about other entrances into the parking lot from surrounding roadways and he said he did not know if they were all secured. I drove the perimeter and located an entrance on the south side of the church parking lot system that led out onto Interquest Pkwy.

From approximately 1355 hours until I was relieved by an El Paso County Deputy at approximately 1835 hours I remained at that location and ensured that only law enforcement and related emergency personnel with credentials entered the scene. There was no one that left the scene until the Command Post started to authorize that filtered non-witnesses and interviewed witnesses could leave. I also advised many friends and family ...

members of Church members still inside that they should respond to the nearby Pikes Peak Community College for their best chance to rendezvous and get information. I kept Interquest clear of vehicles that had started to park along the shoulders on both the north and south side of the roadways and noted that no persons entered or exited the scene on foot within my line of visibility.

Shortly after arriving there (approximately 1410 hours) a subject approached me and told me that he was a volunteer security officer at the Church and that he had seen three suspicious males during the 11:00 service. I had him sit in my cruiser and conducted and interview with him there.

Bradley Johnson said to me that he was working the 11:00 service at New Life and had seen three males that he thought he should report as suspicious after hearing that a shooting had occurred there. He said he worked as a volunteer tasked with making certain that children at the Church moved safely from one class to their next within the main chapel building. He stated on 12-09-2007 he arrived at approximately 0815 hours and ended his service there at approximately 1315 hours.

Johnson said to me that at approximately 1115 hours he noted a white male (Subject #1/Sub1) in the hallway that surrounds the main sanctuary talking with a hispanic male (Subject #2/Sub2). He told me it struck him as odd that he did not recognize them as parishoners and that they were not in contact with one of the Church staff. He explained that if those working with the Church see someone new enter the Church they would try to accompany them for a short while. Johnson said he noted they both had serious looks on their faces and added that they talked quite a bit, but very quietly.

Johnson told me he then observed another suspicous looking white or hispanic male (Subject #3/Sub 3) a few minutes later and in the same vicinity as the others. He said Sub 3 entered the worship center and stood in an aisle just off the hallway door and looked around the congregation during the chaplain's service. He stated he also did not recognize this male and that he was alone and not talking with anyone. Johnson said Sub 3 then walked out, spoke briefly, seriously and quietly with Sub 2 in the hallway (he did not know where Sub 1 was at the time).

Johnson said he then lost track of both Sub 1 and Sub 2 and that Sub 3 also left the area. He said it was about 1130 hours at the time. Johnson said he would later see Sub 3 walking outside the building from the east entrance toward the tent building and again out of sight.

Johnson described Sub 1 as a white male, mid-20's, 5-08 to 5-09, 130-140 pounds with a thin build. He said Sub 1 had brown, straight, medium-length hair falling above his collar, a couple days beard growth and wore no hat, a green cargo-style waist-length coat with numerous front pockets that was open. He said he saw an off-white t-shirt and greenish, business casual cargo pants and black dress shoes.

He then described Sub 2 as a hispanic male in his mid-20's, 5-07 to 5-08, 150 pounds with a thin to medium build. He said he had combed black hair that was medium to short in length and wore a black goatee. He said he wore a reddish-brown t-shirt under a brown leather or suede waist-length jacket that was zipped up half way. Johnson said he also wore black dress pants and white tennis shoes.

Johnson described Sub 3 as a white or hispanic male in his late-20's, 5-09 to 6-00, with an average and muscular build. He said he was completely bald and had a medium complexion. He said Sub 3 wore a black, shiny leather, ...

Officer Statement:

On 12-9-07 at approximately 1730 hours, I Officer E. Plant, 2760P (2A97) was advised by dispatch, through a MDC message, that I was to report to the Command Post at New Life Church, 11005 Voyager Pkwy, to relieve on scene officers at 1900 hours. At approximately 1815 hours, I responded to the church and arrived at approximately 1845 hours. At that time, I was advised to report to the Child Development Center, on the east side of the campus. While at the child development center, I was contacted along with Officer S. Evans, 2887P (2A57) and were advised we needed to report to the area where the suspect vehicle was located, to secure the area while the vehicle was searched. We reported to the "Tent" area, located on the northeast portion of the complex, near the east entrance to the church. I was positioned closest to the church, southwest of the tent. I was positioned facing northeast southwest of light pole "TENT 4". While at this location I was able to see the suspect vehicle, a red Toyota Sedan which I was later advised by officer Evans who was located at the east side of the parking lot, was baring Colorado license plate 940-MNH, approximately half way between myself and officer Evans. While I maintained my position I was responsible for securing a second vehicle, a White Toyota passenger Van, barring Colorado license plate 595-LRZ which was parked facing north immediately southwest of light pole "TENT 4". The vehicle appeared to be a victim's vehicle, which appeared to have been shot several times through the windows. I observed that the vehicle had a broken driver front window, broken driver side rear sliding door window, front passenger side door window and possibly a broken passenger side rear sliding door window. I also observed there were several pieces of medical related items that were strew on the ground around the vehicle.

The vehicle was not contacted until Homicide detectives and Metro Crime Lab Technicians began to process the vehicle.

I maintained my position until approximately 2050 hours, when I contacted Officer S. Reeder, 2756P (1036) by phone, who was positioned to the east securing the suspect vehicle. Officer Reeder was assigned to his vehicle with officer, S. Wallace, 1772P. I contacted officer Reeder and asked him to relieve me while I used the restroom. Officer Reeder maintained my position until I returned at approximately 2100 hours.

At approximately 2320 hours, I contacted officer R. Busy, 2296P (2V06) who took over my position until approximately 2125 hours while i used the restroom.

At approximatelt 2347 hours, Randy's High Country Towing responded to the scene and took possession of the suspect vehicle as well as the victim's vehicle. The two vehicles were transported to the Police Evidence Annix. After the vehicle were removed from the scene, I maintained my position in the parking lot while detectives and lab techs processed the interior of the church.

Cleared the scene by Sqt. Morgan on 12-10-07 at approximately 0330 hours.
